Street Watch in Clophill

Could you spare a couple of hours a month to help keep Clophill free of crime?

Street Watch is a police-led initiative that trains volunteers to patrol their local area, helping to reduce anti-social behaviour and crime and disorder issues.

Clophill residents Jason Graney and Carl Colyer, along with two other volunteers, have already signed up to the scheme. 'We're waiting for the relevant police checks to be done and then we can get trained and start the patrols,' says Jason.

In the meantime, he and Carl are giving up their time to do evening walkabouts in the village. 'You might have seen us wearing high-vis jackets and carrying torches,' says Jason. 'We go out when we can and just keep an eye out for any suspicious activity. The other day, because of our presence in the village, we were able to track down and return a stolen bike.'

Come into the Garden

with Kate Gardner

It seems that recently everywhere you look, green spaces are being turned into edible community resources. The RHS are championing the educational and



health aspects with their Gardening for Schools programme, and while we haven't yet got fruit and veg growing on the Green now could be the time to have a go at growing something edible yourself.

There's an increasing desire to eat healthy food that hasn't travelled miles to reach the plate, but you don't need an allotment or large garden to have your own mini fruit and veg patch. Plant breeders have developed plants to grow well in pots and containers as well as being better adapted to our British conditions (which this year have been incredibly challenging). Most garden centres have a fantastic selection of seeds, giving huge choice. Starting with seeds is fun but you can lalso help things along by starting with ready-grown plants that can be potted-on straight away.

Some really easy veg to grow in pots include carrots, mixed salad leaves, tomatoes and dwarf French beans. All you need are a selection of pots or containers, some multipurpose compost



or growbags and some sunny space. In fact, if you have a shadier spot, salad leaves are a good choice as they don't need full sun to ripen fruit, and are less likely to run to seed so quickly. Choose a salad leaf or cut-and-come-again variety where you pick the leaves as you need them but the plant keeps growing. Much tastier than the bags of baby lettuce leaves that you buy in the shops.

Tomato plants in hanging baskets can be decorative and

productive. Try different varieties of cherry tomatoes or grow standard tomato plants in pots or growing bags. Tomatoes are a Mediterranean plant so they need long hot days to produce good tasty tomatoes. Growing them against a south-facing wall will help you get a good crop. Dwarf French beans are great in pots and need no support, but if you have a little space in the garden,

why not make a wigwam from garden canes and grow climbing beans instead? This year, I'm growing Zelma and Borlotti as they have fantastic flowers and interesting bean pods and cope pretty well with our free-draining soil conditions.





If fruit is more your thing them strawberries and blueberries grow well in pots. Blueberries like acid-loving conditions so need to be grown in ericaceous compost and kept moist. My pots sit in a gravel tray all spring and summer so they don't dry out too much. They're just coming into bloom so all being well I will be picking fresh blueberries from the end of June.

As a keen cook, I wouldn't be without fresh herbs and these make a great addition to any garden or patio. Thyme, rosemary, sage and basil grow best in a sunny site, while mint and chives will cope with shadier spaces. Mint is incredibly invasive so don't be tempted to let it grow

loose in your garden – this is definitely one for a large pot. Chamomile flowers can be used for a relaxing tea and chive flowers make a lovely oniony addition to salads.

Whatever size your garden, have a go at growing something edible and enjoy a taste sensation that you only get when eating something freshly picked.

Hi all. Well, the mud has been well and truly out with the sun. Our children have been using our new water butt to great use, ferrying buckets of water to the allotment to water the plants and also fill the digging pit. A lot of jumping up and down followed but also some clever thinking – thanks Ray! – to use upturned

tree bark as a gutter to carry the water to the mud. Our strawberries, mange tout, and spring onions are doing brilliantly and the children have just added some cucumber plants. We can't wait to harvest them all!

Our new outdoor area is really coming into its own now. The

children are very happy to leave behind the plastic figures and Duplo blocks to explore the outdoors for stones to build their towers. We've had the water trays out and the children have





been using the wheel barrows to move around the new bamboo sticks

- which have been turned into stirrers for giant concoctions and banged together to make music. We made our **own paddling pool** with a big gardening tray and have been talking to the children about the weather and what changes they can see in nature as things warm up. There has been lots of minibeast hunting, with ladybirds and worms being the most prolific.

The Parish Council has kindly allowed us use of a few extra feet of land at the back of the Village Hall and so with some grant and fund-raised money we'll be adding a fence to our new area. This means children will have access to a much more exciting

space where they'll be able to **play beneath the trees**, climb up and down the banks of the slopes and slide down our wooden bank slide. We hope to add in a willow den, some log seats as well as a tyre and chip hill for the children to scramble up and over. What a great way for our children to develop **a sense of self and wellbeing in the outdoors** while learning to play cooperatively and thoughtfully – and all the time investigating and caring for our natural environment and all the treasures it holds.

It just leaves us to say a huge thank you to everyone who supported us with our Easter Egg Hunt and online auction. We made **a combined total of £1,109** – what a result! This helps with our fence and goes part way to helping with our patio laying. Every penny we raise gets us a little closer to completing our fantastic outdoor space. So, we will take the opportunity to remind you that we have our next Happy School Bags weigh-in on June 20th. If you have any old clothes, shoes, bedding etc please get in touch.

Open Gardens Postponed to June 2019



Christine's quick 'n' easy recipe

Lobster Risotto

INGREDIENTS Serves 4-6 people

- 1 uncooked lobster tail per person
- 200g Carnaroli or Arborio rice
- 100g frozen peas
- 1 yellow bell pepper
- 1 large ripe beef tomato
- **1.** Rinse the lobster and remove the underside carapace.
- 2. Remove the lobster flesh from the shell.
- **3.** Heat the olive oil and butter over a medium heat and cook the lobster tail shells until they have a good pink colour set aside for decoration.
- 4. Chop the lobster flesh into small cubes.
- 5. Finely chop the shallot.
- 6. Remove the stalk and seeds from the pepper and finely chop.
- 7. Slice the beef tomato then use your finger to remove as many seeds as possible then chop finely.
- 8. In the same pan that you cooked the lobster shells, gently fry the shallot and pepper until softened but not browned.
- 9. Add the rice to the pan and mix well.
- 10. Add in the peas and the lobster meat.
- 11. Add in 4 ladles of hot water.
- 12. Cook the risotto until the water has all been absorbed.
- **13.** Add in a little more hot water and continue cooking until the rice is 'al dente' cooked but still firm.
- **14.** Using a ring mould place a portion of risotto on each plate, decorate with the cooked lobster shell and sprinkle with roughly chopped parsley.

Clophill Parish Council

These notes are a resume only. Official minutes are available on the internet and notice boards. All official correspondence should be sent to the parish clerk and not individual councillors.

Thanks to everyone who came along to our April Annual Parish Meeting. It was great to see so many faces there, and hear about all the activities taking place in the village. Here are some of the highlights from the meeting:-

We heard from two villagers looking to start up a Clophill branch of **'Street Watch**'. This is a nationwide initiative that already has schemes in Ampthill, Maulden, Shefford, Haynes and other nearby areas. For more information about Street Watch, visit *street-watch.org*

The **Clophill Village Hall** told us how they had financially broken even this year, and had high occupancy levels.

We heard from **St Mary's Church** about the repairs they've made to their building this year, with further work likely in the next 12 months.

The **Clophill Methodist Church** gave us an update on the many events they run through the year. They also told us about the installation of a new heating system this year.

Clophill United Charities told us about the work they did, providing money for individuals in need as well as local organisations that need support.

We heard of the fundraising activities of **The Friends of Cheshire Home**, as well as about their fortnightly shopping trips to Bedford.

Clophill Community Care told us about the 630 jobs they did around the village in the last year, including dog-walking, prescription-collections and TV re-tuning.

In a lively visual display from **Clophill Pre School** we learnt that this had been their most successful year yet, with a bigger focus on outdoor learning and an 'Outstanding' rating by Ofsted.

We learnt that **Clophill United FC** have over 60 children playing across their year groups – they also told us how pleased they were that the Village Hall now housed Heart Defibrillator equipment.

Clophill Flower Club explained that they are approaching their 50th year as a group, and now have over 80 members from the local area.

The meeting was told about the weekly **Clophill Toddler Group** activities, which currently has around 25 local toddlers on their books.

We received a report from **'P3'** who volunteer to clear our local footpaths and tidy the rec area.

Our three ward councillors Cllr Mike Blair, Cllr Paul Downing and Cllr Paul Duckett told us about news from **Central Bedfordshire Council**, and stressed what a pleasure it had been to represent our village this year.

Finally, our Chair Steve Rodell spoke about all the activities undertaken by the Parish Council this year, and also took time to thank our Clerk James Stirling and our former Councillor Ralph Brough.
