Its official name will be the Green Sandy Lizard – the sandy lizard is one of three lizards we get in the UK and in the south east in heathland and areas of rubble. Having a home for them and other invertebrates and insects within our pieces of leftover Greensand stone from the wall restoration project seems very fitting.



Our Duke of Edinburgh volunteers were able to get to work on our medicinal and useful plant areas, clearing away the old growth from last year in preparation for new plants to go in, existing ones to be split and moved and new growth to come through. The photo

The first half of the Spring term has flown by with both snow and sunshine. We've been sledging, built snowmen and women, and turned ourselves into snow angels. We've investigated hibernation and the children played and hid in our bear cave outside. The children have been using painted stones with facial features on – thank you, Michelle – to create expressions and explore feelings. And there has been a lot of upcycling as we've got creative with the junk modelling – even making a **huge dancing dragon head** for Chinese New Year.



For the Chinese celebrations we also made vegetable spring rolls, with the children developing their motor skills as they learned how to roll them up. Plus we explored Chinese culture, made lanterns and mixed wool noodles and rice in our special Chinese



restaurant. The children were fascinated to see the different writing in the menus.

Our nature table has held plants and goose eggs, sheep's wool and catkins as we explore Spring and notice the changes in the natural world. Our new wheelbarrows have come in very handy, moving a mountain of chip, as have the new gardening gloves and tools sets. Su has been in to see us again, and this time she brought her peg loom and helped the children to **make pillows from sheep's wool**.

Children can be so spontaneous with their learning in a way that we often can't predict. When Freya dropped a collection of rulers, instead of picking them straight up she saw how they fell and moved them slightly to create a triangle, then moved them again and called out 'rectangle', then made a square. **Learning can come in the most unexpected places** or at the most unexpected of times – it's our job to provide our children with an enabling environment and to support and facilitate their learning.

Thank you to everyone who donated to our Happy Bag Collection – we'll let you know how we did next month. Our next event is our **Mother's Day morning** when Flower Club will be coming in. It's fantastic to watch the older generation work with passion and sensitivity with some of the youngest generation, with each side showing respect and care for their activity and each other.

Clophill & District Flower Club

For the first meeting of 2019, we welcomed Gill McGregor back to the club with her demonstration entitled **'The Romance of Spring'**.

Gill's first arrangement reminded us of our recent snowfalls. Alongside two owls she used evergreen foliage and white spray chrysanthemums in groups at the base, adding contorted hazel catkins, blue iris and a few daffodils and tulips. Next, for a **Valentine themed** two-placement design with heart-shaped wire structures, Gill included ferns, aspidistra, Fatsia leaves and lime green hypericum berries, finished with red roses and red anthuriums.

We were then shown the art of a **'mirroring design'**. Using a black raised rectangular container and working from the centre point, Gill added various large plain leaves and ferns of the same size to each side. Two small white ornamental cabbages were placed at the centre and pale pink Singapore orchids completed the design – all radiating out from the centre.

After a break for refreshments, the fourth arrangement celebrated Chinese New Year – 2019 being the Year of the Pig. Peach Avalanche roses, yellow broom and tulips along with ferns captured the feel of China and the addition of **red leucospermum represented fireworks**.

Whilst she chatted to us, Gill swiftly plaited a fern leaf and two of these were incorporated into the next arrangement, which included large orange gerbera. We were reminded of the importance of conditioning all materials before flower arranging and, in particular, how a few drops of bleach in the water before adding the gerbera will improve their lasting qualities.

An upcycled emerald green top hat became the base of the final arrangement and once the Bells of Ireland and pale green carnations were added it was clear this would be to **celebrate St Patrick's Day**. Pale coloured proteas and hard Ruscus placed in groups completed the design.

It was a very enjoyable evening and we were delighted to be entertained by such a talented NAFAS demonstrator/teacher/judge as well as an author of Floral Art Books *www.gillmcgregor.com*

P3 work on Readshill Acid Grassland

At the top of the Readshill footpath there's a County Wildlife Site, which is home to some rare plant species including a diminutive blue flower called 'Sheep's Bit'. For some years now the site has been managed for the village by a very small group of volunteers but

nature was winning and the area was being over-run by vigorous shrubs and trees.

This year the Parish Council agreed to fund a day's activity organised by the Greensand Trust to begin restoring the acid grassland slope. Such tasks bring together a willing band of volunteers, often 15-16 strong, who can achieve a remarkable amount of work in a few hours. And so they did on this occasion. The undergrowth was brush-cut and raked, the small trees were sawn off and removed and all the resultant spoil was burned at the lower end of the slope where the ash was less likely to influence wildflower growth – they do best on poor soils.



If you've walked that way recently the difference will have been startling. Some of us can remember children sledging on this slope. Hopefully they can do so again should we get seasonal snowfall, and in the summer we can all enjoy the flora and fauna of this special place.

Clophill is full of interesting and talented people – and one of them is Nigel Lesmoir-Gordon, a writer, author, documentary and film-maker who's lived in the village for 20 years. Helen Gent met him...



Originally from Cambridge, Nigel grew up with Syd Barrett, David Gilmour and Roger Waters – later to become members of the band Pink Floyd – and John Dunbar, who went on to marry Marianne Faithfull, was a good friend. In the Sixties, when Nigel moved to London as a film student, his flat became a regular hang-out for famous faces like Mick Jagger and Paul McCartney – not that he was star-struck. 'We were all equal,' he says. 'We were all artists of one type or another so nobody was impressed by anyone else.'



The first documentary Nigel made was with the singer Donovan. 'We'd been working together on a project for Mick Jagger – he gave me £500, which was a lot of money at the time, to write a screenplay – but then the Rolling Stones went off on a world tour and it got shelved. So Donovan said, "Look here, Nigel, I'm famous, let's make a film about me." That's how we ended up sailing around the Aegean Sea in his yacht while I filmed him.'

It was the first of many celebrity shoots. In the Seventies, Nigel produced pop

videos for 10cc, Squeeze, Rainbow, Joe Cocker, Big Country, Wings and Leo Sayer before spending the next decade making commercial and corporate videos. 'I remember making a recruitment film for the Royal Navy and I got to play with the big toys. I had two ships and a helicopter buzzing around in the sky and I was in charge of directing it all. I absolutely loved it. And it made up for some of the very boring banking commercials I directed in those days.'

In the Nineties, Nigel's career took another turn when he

made the award-winning television documentary The Colours of Infinity with Sir Arthur C. Clarke. The documentary brought the subject of fractals and mathematician Benoît Mandelbrot to the attention of the general public for the first time. It's a subject that Nigel is fascinated with, though admits it's not easy to explain. 'With fractals, it's like when you get a cauliflower and tear off a piece – the smaller piece is identical to the large piece. You can break off smaller and smaller pieces and you'll see the same pattern repeating.'

To date, Nigel has made several documentaries and films about fractals and has also published an illustrated biography of Mandelbrot. 'I'm particularly proud of that book because my son, Gabriel, who used to be a cameraman and is now a probation officer in Poole, took the photographs.' Nigel also has a daughter, who lives in London, and six grandchildren.

Now 75, he's added novelist to his list of achievements – and is currently on his eighth book. 'Ideas for books just seem to pop into my head,' says Nigel. 'I came up with Karma Lawyer: Courage and Love, which is due out this spring, while I was gardening. And I'm calling the sequel Karma Lawyer: When The Knitting Had To Stop. I like an intriguing title that will pull people in.' He says he never discusses his book projects with wife Jenny, who he's been married to for 53 years. 'She's not particularly interested,' admits Nigel. 'Although when my first novel, Nothing and Everywhere, came out in paperback she

read it and said she really enjoyed it.'

While other villagers his age may be slowing down, Nigel has just had his biography, Behind Open Doors, published and is

working on a documentary about quantum mechanics. 'I've had cancer and I'm due for a second knee replacement this month but I'm still bursting with enthusiasm for life. Why wouldn't I be? I love what I do and I love living in Clophill. I don't need to travel the



world because I can look outside my window and see trees and fields every day. It's perfect.

- members will receive a pack containing a useful booklet and a door sticker warning uninvited traders that they are committing a criminal offence if they call at your door
- there's no commitment involved other than to be neighbourly and share information.

Over the coming months, the Parish Council is also hoping to introduce 'Street Watch' and 'Speed Watch' schemes in Clophill.

At the end of January last year we were lucky to be visited by a dance teacher who taught Chestnut through to Oak Class a variety of dances including Bollywood and Street Dance. The children had a wonderful time and learnt some fantastic routines. Our teachers also received some training to continue the excellent lesson the children had received.

Just before half term children came into school in non-uniform and raised £110 to give to the **Mad About Harry charity**. You may already know Harry's story from Facebook or the media. He's a local boy who has Stage 4 Neuroblastoma, a very rare and aggressive children's cancer. His family set up the charity to raise money for ground-breaking treatment that is 'the only lifeline available'. We were due to hold a Non-Uniform Day on behalf of CHUMS' Shine Bright, Wear Bright campaign and whilst this is an incredibly worthwhile

charity, we've decided to postpone our fundraising for it until the Summer Term.

In February, some of our children **represented the school at a Gymnastics Festival** – they had great fun participating and put a lot of practice into their routines. We also had Safer Internet Day, reminding the children, in an age appropriate way, how to ensure they remained safe when accessing the internet. And we held a worship about 'Staying Safe in School', where we introduced the children to the new badge lanyard system we're following in school.

We have lots planned for this half-term, including our popular **Lent Appeal Day** which will once again include outside and inside games. This year we're supporting 'The Mind Map', a local charity whose aim is to promote and encourage improved mental health and emotional wellbeing for children. The charity will begin working with our school directly this academic year and into the next.

In school we'll be thinking about caring for ourselves, our belongings and our pets. Stand for what you believe in

The next elections for Parish and Town councils are on 2nd May 2019

Become a Parish or Town Councillor

The best way to find out what it's like to be a Parish or Town councillor is to talk to someone who's doing it now. Your Parish or Town council will have a website where you will be able to get the names and contact details of the current clerk and councillors, and the dates of their meetings. Council meetings are open to the public and you can go along to a Parish or Town council meeting, speak to one of the councillors and find out what they think of the job they do.

By becoming a Parish or Town councillor you become someone your community will look to for help, guidance and support as a community leader with the power to influence decisions for the benefit of the people you serve.

Getting Elected

To stand for election to a Parish or Town council, you must:

- be a UK or Commonwealth citizen; or be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland; or be a citizen of another Member state of the European Union
- be at least 18 years old.

To be eligible to stand for election for a particular Parish or Town you don't have to be connected to a political party but you must:



 be an elector of the Parish or Town or in the past 12 months have occupied land or other premises in the Parish or Town (as owner or tenant) or work in the Parish or Town (as your principal or only place of work) or live within three miles of the Parish or Town boundary.

What do Parish or Town councils do?

A Parish or Town or Town council is a local authority that makes decisions on behalf of the people in the Parish or Town. It's the level of local government closest to the community, with the district authority and the county authority or a principal authority further up the hierarchy.

Parish or Town councils make all kinds of decisions on issues that affect the local community. Probably the most common topics that Parish or Town councils get involved with are planning matters (they are statutory consultees), crime prevention and roads & highways.

Parish or Town councils have a number of powers they can use and have the ability to negotiate with other decision-making organisations such as the district, county or unitary councils, health authorities, police etc. In this respect Parish or Town councils are extremely powerful. These organisations know that a Parish or Town council gives the best reflection of how a community feels about something and its views should be taken seriously.

How much time does it take up?

Councils usually meet once a month for the council meeting to which members of the public are also invited. Meetings may last two or three hours, depending on what's on the list of items to discuss. Some councils may also have committees to deal with specific subjects, such as planning matters.

How long do I serve for as a Parish or Town Councillor?

Once elected, Parish or Town councillors sit on the council for four years. If they then want to stay in the post they can stand for re-election. This doesn't mean that you have to stay for four years. If you find it's not for you, or you can no longer meet the commitment, you can stand down.

Come into the Garden

with Kate Gardner

As I sit here writing this, the sunshine is out and the birds are singing. March is the first month of spring and the garden is coming alive. The

winter aconites and snowdrops have graced us with their fleeting beauty, to be followed by hellebores and primroses. March is all about the colour of spring bulbs and in flower are you'll see crocus, daffodils, scented narcissus, Fritillaria meleagris (common name 'Snakes Head Fritillary') and the delicate Erythronium (Dog's tooth violet).

The warm weather and longer days are a trigger for many of the herbaceous plants to start into growth and **with those juicy young shoots and leaves come the slugs**. These voracious feeders can make a meal of a wide range of vegetables and ornamental plants, but are particularly fond of seedlings and other soft growth. Hostas, delphiniums, dahlias, sweet peas and tulips are regularly attacked by slugs, which can make them

difficult to grow if you have a big slug problem.

I've always had a love-hate relationship with slugs but as many larger slugs primarily feed on decomposing organic matter such as dead leaves (and even dead slugs) they can be a valuable part of the composting process. Whatever your view on slugs, you won't be able to eradicate them, so targeting your control measures to protect particularly vulnerable plants will give the best result.

In the past I've had limited success with sharp gravel, eggshells and coffee grinds (they can be good for a small areas), and life is too short to spend hours in the dark with a headtorch picking slugs off everything. This year, with a new puppy in the household, I'm going to try a biological control – Nemaslug – which is a nematode that's specific to molluscs and has no adverse effect on other types of animal. As a warm moist soil (temperatures of 5-20°C) is required, control is most effective during spring to early autumn, with best results achieved by applying in the evening. It's available from refrigerated cabinets in some garden centres or by mail order from suppliers of biological controls.

For all you **rose lovers**, March is the time to prune Bush and Shrub varieties – and it's easier than it seems. Look at the plant and cut out any branches that are spindly, showing signs

a good shape, look on each major branch for an outwards-facing bud (away from the plant) and make an angled cut just above it. Cut the plant down to around 40cm (1ft-1.5ft), around knee high. You're aiming for a goblet shape that will allow you to really appreciate the flowers later in the year. Late March/April is the best time to feed your roses to encourage healthy foliage and flowers – sprinkle rose fertiliser around the base of the plant before you mulch to keep down the weeds and reduce moisture loss later in the year.

In the period between our last two meetings we welcomed the opening of the new **Co-op Food store and Post Office** – a fantastic addition to the village, offering convenience and quality produce on our doorstep. However, there have already been many complaints about the parking situation around The Green. Not only are some people parking inconsiderately, such as on doubleyellow lines or in the disabled spaces without a valid permit, but some have parked in areas that has prevented buses from being able to access the bus stop. Should this continue, it's likely that the bus companies will cease from using The Green as part of bus routes. CPC is meeting with Central Bedfordshire Council and representatives from Co-op to discuss a range of potential remedies for the parking problems. In the meantime we ask that you all park considerately when using the Co-op.

As part of our review of **Grant Aid**, we agreed to award Clophill Heritage Trust (CHT) £3,504 towards a storage provision at the Clophill Eco Lodges. This will enable the charity to widen its offerings to the community as well as to ensure that their basic business provision can be run effectively. We're delighted to support CHT with their work in and around the site, and it's always fantastic to hear about the excellent work they are doing there with young people, those with special needs and locals.

We hope Clophill residents have noticed changes in our **street lighting** in recent weeks. We've replaced 31 old-style bulbs with LED lights. Not only will the lights improve, but we are saving energy and associated costs, and the streetlights should require less maintenance, too. We're delighted with how things are looking presently, but please do contact us if you notice any lighting issues in the village.

We're in the process of arranging an April date for Clophill's contribution to the **Great British Spring Clean**. Last year we had a fantastic response, particularly from younger villagers and their parents. We'll be publicising dates and plans imminently, but if you're interested in taking part in our litterpicking this year please email *terry.lee@clophill-pc.gov.uk*.

The Parish Council have recently been advised that the Police will be holding a number of **Community Surgeries** across the Central Bedfordshire area during 2019/2020 to increase their visibility, availability and accessibility to the public. There are a number of events planned at Co-op, The Green – the full list is available at *www.clophill-pc.gov.uk*. The first event is on May 13th, 2pm-4pm.
