## Clophill Preschool News

We've been lucky enough to have **received funding money** from Central Bedfordshire Council. This has allowed us to buy new child- friendly sinks, rugs, bean bags, sand and water trays, a digital photo frame so parents can see what their children have been up to during session time, a camera plus trolleys to make outdoor resources more accessible for children to self-select. We also finally have **our new uniform** – we chose pale blue and green to reflect the grass and sky, which represents our ethos of enjoying our outdoor space.

### **Clophill through the years**

# The history of Clophill charities

As well as providing Poor Relief, as an alternative to the workhouse Clophill had many charities that provided for the poor. In the March 2011 issue of Spotlight there was an article entitled 'Clophill United Charities'. It listed the following charities and the dates that they were founded:-

Thomas Dearmer	Will proved at Northampton 1630
John Bryan	Will and codicil dated 1655
Poor's Estate	Founded before 1707
Fuel Allotment	An award of 1826 pursuant to Inclosure Act
Marl allotment	Ditto
Sand and gravel allotment	Ditto

Bedford & Luton Archives & Records Office holds a selection of documents from the Charity Commission – the 'Annual Statement of Accounts' – which cover the period 1900 to 1955. They give details of the receipts and payments for each charity.

#### Thomas Dearmer's Charity (later spelt Dearman)

Thomas Dearman died in 1630 and is buried in Old St Mary's churchyard.

In his will he left '2 acres and 2 allotments of 6a, 3r, 29p and 1a, 3r, 2p'. (One acre = 4 roods. One rood = 40 poles). The rent from this land was to be used 'For the benefit of poor labourers not receiving parish relief'. Why it is referred to as 'Dearmer's Gift' when his name was Dearman isn't known.

In 1912 this charity received £30 10s in rent from property and land that it owned. It also

The epitaph written in a quaint manner on the gravestone of Thomas Dearman. (Victoria County History)

received £7 6s 8d interest on East India stock that it held. It spent £27 8s of this distributing 4s each to 137 needy villagers. It also paid Corn Rent and Poor Rates. The Corn Rent was a tithe that was paid with money (rather than produce) and was linked to the price of corn (index-linked). The Poor Rate was a tax on property

levied in each parish, which was used to provide poor relief, an alternative to the workhouse.

#### John Bryan's Charity (later spelt Bryant)

This charity's receipts came from 'Consols', originally short for 'consolidated annuities', which is a form of British government bond (gilt) dating originally from the 18th century. In 1907 a holding of £250 10s 3d yielded £6 5s 4d interest per year.

£1 10s 0d was spent on dress material from Mrs Mead who was a grocer and draper. Young Lilian Shotbolt (a dressmaker living at the Flying Horse) made up four dresses for 12s and Emily Upton (another dressmaker in the High Street) made up two more dresses. Five pairs of boots

were purchased from George Chapman, a shoe maker and gardener, for £2 10s, and Samuel Perkins, a market gardener, was paid 9s 6d for one pair. These dresses and boots may have been for poor young girls to wear to Sunday School. Also 10s was distributed to widows on St Thomas Day (December the 21st). In England on St Thomas Day, poor women and children went from door to door 'a-Thomassing'. They would beg for the ingredients or 'goodenings' for a Christmas feast, such as wheat for frumenty and flour for Yule bread.

#### The Poor's Estate

This was another charity getting income from the properties and lands that it held. In 1911 £27 8s was given as Clothing Tickets (worth four shillings each) to 137 needy villagers. £6 was given to the Picture Trust.

#### Fuel Allotment (includes sand, gravel and marl allotments.)

This charity collected rents from allotments that it owned and let to market gardeners. It also let three marl pits and a sand and gravel pit. Lord Lucas (Wrest Park) made an annual gift of £4. £28 6s 8d was spent on coal for the needy, 137 recipients getting 4 cwt each. The charity also paid the Poor Rate of £2 15s.

#### Library and Picture Trust

This charity didn't appear to have any assets but received money from some of the other charities or from bequests. In 1907 books were purchased from S.P.C.K. and pictures from Mansell & Co. A librarian was paid £2 a year and the books and pictures were insured. James Whittamore (carpenter) was paid £5 15s 6d to make a bookcase.

The library may have been in the Reading Room or attached to the school or have been part of a Sunday School. The books were from a religious source as may have been the pictures. Between the wars there was an annual Eisteddfod held in Bedford and in 1921 £4 7s was spent in transporting Clophill children to attend it.

#### Clophill Church Estate & The John Mendham Charity

These two charities owned property including cottages and meadows. The rent that they received from them didn't go to the poor but was spent by the churchwarden on maintaining the fabric of the church. In 1907 Mr W. T. Sharpe was paid £15 18s 5d for 'repairs to the church' while in 1946 £36 6s 9d was spent on 'Parish Room roof repair' (which was thatched). They also had to pay a 'corn rent' of 10s 8d. All property belonging to the Church was sold at or about Lady Day 1923 and the money invested in 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ % Stock.

#### **Clophill United Charities**

The Charity Commission accepted a scheme that finally united the charities so that they all came under the title of Clophill United Charities.

An additional item that was paid by the United Charities was Queen Anne's Bounty. A sum of £1 10s 4d was paid twice a year. Queen Anne's Bounty was a fund established in 1704 to augment the incomes of the poorer clergy of the Church of England. The bounty was funded by the tax on the incomes of all Church of England clergy.

The existence of the above charities show just how many poor families there were in the parish and what efforts were made to reduce the poverty.

# SPAUCHT on...The Stone Jug

On Monday 24th March, regulars at The Stone Jug gathered around the bar to see Vikki and Joyce Stevens being presented with an award for 'CAMRA's North Bedfordshire Pub of the Year'. They then toasted the pub's success – it's the fourth time they've won the award – with a glass of bubbly and the pub's legendary sausage rolls.

The pub – which serves three

regular ales as well as ever-changing guest ales sourced from everywhere from Devon to Scotland – has been in the Stevens family since 1981. It was originally run by Joyce and her husband, but when Arthur passed away 14 years ago Vikki stepped in to become joint licensee with her mum. 'I'm very proud of this Back Street boozer because there aren't many "proper" pubs around anymore,' says Vikki. 'And The Stone Jug isn't just about being somewhere to get a drink – it's all about community.' Mum Joyce agrees. 'It's a lifeline for many of our customers. They can come in here for a chat if they've had a bad day or ask around for a plumber or a tree surgeon.'

It's very much an all-inclusive pub, too. You could find yourself supping a pint with a university student or with someone who can regale you with stories about the war. It's dog-friendly as well – there's always a water bowl outside and dog biscuits behind the bar. And along with quiz and music nights, the pub also hosts family-friendly events during holiday times like Easter. 'It's definitely a family pub,' says Joyce. 'I remember when kids used to play in our back room while their parents had a drink, and now those kids have grown up and drink in here themselves. Some of them even have children of their own now.'

Along with their loyal customers, the pub also has a troupe of long-serving staff. Barman Bob has been there for 32 years, while Kitchen Kim has put in around 15 years' service (not forgetting former staffer Doreen, who racked up 22 years behind the chip fryer).



'It's a real team effort and we'd like to thank everyone who works here,' say Vikki and Joyce. 'And of course our biggest thanks goes to our customers for continuing to support their local. This award is for everyone.'

## Let's talk about sole trading

with Sally Cobban





This month I'm going to talk to those of you who are self-employed as **sole traders**, who've been considering trading through a limited company. There are various things to consider.

When you're a sole trader (ST), there's no separation between you and your business – you don't even have to have a separate business account (although it's a good idea to

have one). That means if you're entering into contracts, loans or hire purchase agreements as an ST then if you default on payments, or get sued, then you'll be personally liable.

Also, as a sole trader **you'll pay income tax and class 4 national insurance on your business profits**. If you're a basic rate tax payer then that's 20% tax and 9% class 4 NI – 29%, ouch! ST accounts are private, though, and not published anywhere, so there's less paperwork and more privacy for a ST.

When you're profitable as a sole trader then it's tax efficient to look at **trading through a limited company**. This way you can avoid income tax (subject to your level of income) and pay corporation tax instead – corporation tax is payable by your company, and the smaller company rate is 20% with no national insurance being due.

When you're a limited company there are a few more paperwork hoops to jump through – you'll need a separate bank account as the limited company is a separate legal entity to you. Therefore contracts, loans and HP agreements in the companies' name will be separate liability to you personally. Limited companies have to publish their accounts annually and send an annual return to Companies House but the information that's published is reasonably limited – it's only the company balance sheet for a small company, with no profit and loss detail.

On Thursday 6th March, the Club welcomed back Gill McGregor with her title 'The Romance of Flowers'.

We enjoyed the feel of Spring with a traditional arrangement of flowering hawthorn, yellow daffodils, white narcissus, pink tulips and white iris set against dark green garden foliage.

**Red padded hearts** were the accessories for a design for Valentine's Day – a dramatic display of trimmed palm leaves, ivy and two shades of red roses, accompanied by entertaining stories of being a florist and taking orders for 14th February.

All sorts of natural items are now included in floral design and Gill used some globe



artichokes in a horizontal design on a deep red vase, as well as showing us how to plait, fold and roll leaves for different effect. The addition of dark red tulips and red anthurium made this a stunning arrangement.

Gill's penultimate design included a flower she hadn't used before but couldn't resist buying. This was the Eucharist Lily, five of which made a stunning but simple arrangement with dark green backdrop of Fatsia with rolled and pinned Aspidistra leaves.

The introduction of a blue mesh screen, green medilino sticks and a blue vase heralded the final design. Using Palm, Aspidistra and Dracaena foliage, Gill added an unusual focal point – **a deconstructed blue net shower mop!** She then added some beautiful Agapanthus and green chrysanthemums.

### Christine's quick 'n' easy recipe Fettucine with Courgettes



#### **INGREDIENTS** Serves 4 people

- 400g fettucine or tagliatelle
- 50g of pancetta or streaky bacon
- 6-8 baby courgettes, finely sliced
- 2 cloves of garlic, crushed
- Pinch of crushed chilli
- Pinch of saffron

- Extra virgin olive oil
- Fresh flat-leaf parsley, chopped
- 1 medium shallot, finely chopped
- Salt and freshly ground pepper
- Freshly grated Parmesan cheese
- 1. Put a large pan of salted water on to boil.
- 2. In a separate pan heat a good glug of olive oil.
- **3.** To this add the crushed garlic and finely chopped shallot and fry gently until softened but not browned.
- 4. Add in the pinch of chilli flakes and saffron.
- 5. Add in the finely chopped pancetta and fry for another minute.
- 6. Finely slice the courgettes in rounds and add to the pan.
- **7.** Add in two soup ladles of hot water and continue to cook until the courgettes are tender.
- 8. Season to taste (bear in mind that the pancetta might be a little salty).
- 9. Boil the pasta until 'al dente' cooked but still with a bite.
- 10. Drain the pasta and add to the courgettes. Mix well.
- **11.** Place in a warmed serving dish and sprinkle with the parsley.
- 12. Serve with freshly grated Parmesan cheese.

# **News from Clophill Heritage Trust**

The Greensand Ridge Charity Walk to raise money to help fund our Eco lodges took place over the weekend of 15th/16th March. Day 1 – Saturday – meant an early rise for a 6.30am departure by mini-bus from Clophill Village Green to the canal-side at Linslade where **21 hardy souls started the walk at 7.25am**. The route crossed water-meadows, Rushmere and Stockgrove country parks and after some woodland mud-hopping, on through the Woburn Abbey Estate to The Green Man at Eversholt. We were there by 11.15am, and the friendly landlord opened up early for us (it wasn't too early for a pint) and served excellent vittles to fuel the next stage. After crossing long stretches of farmland, the M1 and skirting the Millbrook proving ground, we met around 12 youngsters and parents at The Chequers in Millbrook for them to begin their 7-mile challenge. They **positively skipped along**, unlike the worthies who'd already walked 17 miles and who took the further opportunity for refreshment of an amber nature. By the time we arrived back in Clophill it was just after 5pm, having walked 24 miles. Some sought refuge in The Stone Jug.

On Sunday we got a lie-in as we didn't have to leave Clophill Old Church until 7.15am. The route took us around Chicksands Wood to Haynes, over the A600 and through the Northill Estate woodland where **kites**, **buzzards and pheasants** were much in evidence. Another early lunch was taken at The Crown, Northill, around 11am, then it was onwards over the A1 and the River Ivel at Sandy towards Everton. We finished the walk at around 3.45pm in Gamlingay, where we had tea and cakes at The Hub after completing 17 miles that day.



Everyone, including pet pooches, was deemed certifiable and thus received appropriate paperwork from the organisers Ali and John Bradbury. Sincere thanks also go to Linda Moon for her hard work in organising the event.

#### Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on 25th March 2014

(Readers are reminded that these notes are a resume only, official minutes are available both on the internet and notice boards. All official correspondence should be sent to the parish clerk and not individual councillors.)

#### **Public Question Time**

There was one question from villagers who attended the meeting regarding the proposal for placing a large mobile home in a garden at Goodwood Close. While there was a discussion concerning this, rather than repeat what appears later in this article I would refer the reader to the planning report submitted by the Parish Council's Planning Sub Committee.

#### **Police Report**

The council received a report from Bedfordshire Police regarding crime within the village. Our crime rate is low compared to other like areas but there were two significant offences. The first was an arson attack to the newly built lodge at the old church. This took place on the night of 9th/10th March. The police are investigating the offence but I would urge anyone who has any helpful information to contact the police. This can be done by use of a confidential telephone line. The second offence was a burglary of a house in the Old Silsoe Road, which took place during daylight hours. The message, as always, is keep your homes secure. Report suspicious people or incidents – by these methods we can help keep our community safe.

#### **The Lands Committees**

As you're aware the parish council has been trying to get Bedfordshire Highways Department to take action for remedial work to our roads within the village. We've had some success and some of the potholes have been repaired. There is still much work to do however and the pressure will be kept up to ensure that when possible this work will be undertaken.

A request has been received from a resident asking for the re-instatement of the salt bin at the junction of the High Street and The Causeway. The possibility is being researched by the council.

We're still awaiting proposals from Amey (the Bedfordshire Highway's contractor) for the removal of the redundant footbridge at The Green.

This application seeks to obtain a legal (ie not Planning) decision to introduce a very large mobile home (2 bedrooms, kitchen/lounge, wet room and lobby) into the garden for use as a granny annex. Such a procedure completely evades the planning process and ignores ALL planning rules. The PC only discovered this application by accident and has been told that the decision will be purely legal and that the PC's and neighbour's views won't be considered. Further, neither the PC nor residents have ANY right of notification. The PC is most concerned over this procedure and its possible implications and is pursuing with CBC. Although told that it's a legal and not a planning application and nothing to do with the PC, the PC is objecting strongly. Last month, we reported in Spotlight that this same applicant had submitted an application to extend the existing house, including on the ground floor, making it a five-bedroomed dwelling (which the PC supported without any knowledge of the LDC application). The LDC application now asks for this large mobile home for the part-time use of an elderly mother who will spend most of her time in and use the services of the existing (enlarged) dwelling.

#### CB/14/00928/FULL

Proposal:	Erection of nine dwellings including access from Shefford Road
	(six dwellings) and an access through Castle Hill Court for three dwellings.
Applicant:	Greene King via Mr B Sherry

This site for nine dwellings was finally approved by Government as a part of CBCs' Site Allocations Development Plan. Two developments were authorised for Clophill. They were both subjected to a public hearing at Chicksands with a government Inspector before final approval was given. This, for nine dwellings, was one. Greene King submitted a planning application for the nine dwellings in 2012 (CB/12/03123/FULL) – three affordable and six five-bedroom dwellings – which was approved. This application now seeks planning approval for a different layout to ensure that the three affordable two-bedroom houses included will be accepted and managed by the same agency as Castle Hill Court, rather than delete them altogether and pay a compensating sum to CBC (hence the access via Castle Hill Court). Considerable research has been undertaken by the applicant including discussion with CBC before submission. Account has been taken of the issue of access to and impact on Shefford Road, and including the construction of a footpath.

Details of this proposal and the PC's concerns are detailed above. Despite all the reasoning (and including that the intended single occupant will spend most of her time in the adjacent large house and not in this mobile home) and that this is a very real flood plain, CBC have approved the issue of the required certificate. This was done purely on legal grounds, planning rules weren't considered (and, no doubt, influenced by historic legal precedents around the UK). The PC is angry and upset, both by the approval given and the refusal by CBC to consult or even advise the PC of this application.

Location:1 Hawthorne CloseProposal:Reduce crown of ash tree in rear garden by 2-3 metresApplicant:Mr G Walford

Tree is one of three on rear boundary next to Jacques Lane. The other two (both oaks) were similarly reduced last year. Concern is to reduce risk of felling in high winds.

#### **Care Village Proposals**

Following an approach by the company (English Care Villages) the PC advised them that it wouldn't take a position until ECV submitted their Planning Application to CBC (now expected to be in the second half of this year). Preparatory to that ECV were recommended to brief all Clophill residents and to discuss key issues, in advance, with CBC (eg access, sewage removal). The brochure 'drop' and the exhibition were ECV's initial response. ECV is a commercial company and their plans are also commercial.

The quarry site lies outside the existing settlement envelope. However, as residents will be well aware, the government is pressing for increased housing development in the South East. The (local) owner of the quarry site is keen to sell and two developers separately have previously, unsuccessfully, sought to create a large housing development on the site. If ECV don't succeed, or don't proceed, with their application it's virtually certain that other developers will follow, with a willing landowner. The PC is concerned that, as time goes on, there will be increasing difficulty in opposing a large development on the site. The ECV proposal should be seen in this wider context. But, as stated, the full PC won't make any decision until a formal application is made and the views of Clophill residents taken into account.

#### CBC Consultation, Gypsy and Traveller Local Plan

The PC has responded to the CBC Consultation into its Pre-Submission Gypsy and Traveller Local Plan. The final plan is required by government instruction. No potential site has been listed for Clophill and the PC is satisfied with its contents, but won't comment on the suitability or otherwise of selected sites in other parishes. Given the recent history of gypsy arrivals in Clophill on an unsuitable site which had been purchased by the residents, and CBC's immediate acceptance of the now legally-approved location as a 'windfall', the PC is concerned over the consultation's intention to consider future 'windfall' sites and has expressed its concerns in its response.

The next meeting of the parish council will be on 22nd April 2014 commencing at 7pm. It will be a short meeting that will be followed at 7.45pm by the annual parish meeting.
