# **Clophill Preschool News**

**Hi everyone!** Well, we always think the Autumn term goes the most guickly with so many festivals to cover and the nights drawing in, but it seems that this Spring



term took us by surprise!

Certainly the second half saw us very busy with yet more new starters plus a Mother's Day Performance and Craft morning in aid of the I Can charity's **Chatterbox Challenge**. I Can works hard to support children with communication and language difficulties in the Early Years. We taught the children songs that they performed in front of their Mummies and other family members and we asked for donations towards tea and cake at the end. We even started the event with some Easter crafts for each grownup to make with their child – from **planting daffodil bulbs** in pots they decorated themselves to making Hungry Caterpillar Cress bodies. We raised £50 for the charity.

For this fantastic event the Times and Citizen paid us a visit and did a great article in the paper featuring our children and their crafts. They even managed to capture a few of the less stagestruck ones doing actions with their singing! If you'd like to see our article, look us up on the Bedford Today website under 'Getting creative at craft day'.

At Preschool we place communication – be it with children, parents or colleagues – at the top of our agenda. Without it we can't share, learn or befriend. Communication means more than language, especially with younger children. It begins with gesture, eye contact and facial expression developing into sounds and words. With this urge to communicate there's a need and gradual development of understanding both of other people and the world around them. At Preschool, how we the staff talk to the children as well as each other is very important as language and other forms of communication are the tools to learning. We demonstrate respect and humour as well as the give and take that's so valuable in communication.

One way of encouraging communication is through common experiences. Very popular with our children are our malleable resources and we see the importance of bringing the children together through their interests. We therefore experimented with a range of resources to see which ones really fired up the children's imaginations and drew them to the sand tray. We weren't surprised to see that it was the natural products: the **pine cones**, pebbles, sticks and shells promoted the most creative and imaginative play. We found those that tended to play alone were engaging with others and making friends creating stories and narratives as they played. The introduction of the different resources

encouraged the children to play in a different way in a medium that could often appear one-dimensional to them. The children never cease to amaze us with their



creative abilities and what they can see in a pile of sticks!

Big thanks to Graham from the Methodist Church who came to visit us in March to tell the children the Easter Story complete with props including donkey, nails and egg.

Another visitor was one of our parents who's a radiographer and came to talk to the children about her job. They were all fascinated by the x-rays she brought and it sparked lots of talk, mark making and role play about bones, skeletons and hospitals. We always welcome visitors who'd like to share their jobs or interests with the children. Just give us a call or pop in.

# **Clophill through the years**

# Edward Crouch – the father of Clophill

Edward Crouch was a farmer who lived at Cainhoe Park Farm, on the parish boundary with Gravenhurst. He also farmed Warren Farm and had land at Gravenhurst and Shillington. He lived for 91 years, from 1823 to 1914, and throughout his life he spent much time and effort in the service of the surrounding communities. the Unionist Association at the Compasses Inn, and was a Guardian of the Poor, responsible for the Poorhouse.

As a farmer, he was a popular employer and entertained his employees to an annual repast at The Compasses Inn. In 1880 the labouring men of Clophill presented him with a silver inkstand inscribed with the

> words 'Presented to Edward Crouch, Esq., by the labourers of Clophill.'

Edward's energies weren't all devoted to the parish of his birth. He owned a farm in Shillington and in 1870 was elected a member of the first Shillington School Board, where he held office for some

For 50 years Edward was a church warden at St Mary's Clophill (the old church) under three rectors. He was also invited to be the first chairman of the newly-formed Clophill Parish Council, even though he wasn't an elected member, and held the office for about six years. He was manager of Clophill School from 1871 to about 1910, during which time he always took the liveliest interest in the children of the village. And for over 50 years he was the most active trustee of the Clophill Charities, devoting much care and time to this work.

As if this wasn't enough to keep him busy, he was the first Chairman of the newlyformed Ampthill R.D.C., President of the Cricket Club, on the committee that ran the Reading Room, presided over meetings of considerable time. In order to assist the Rector of Gravenhurst (the Rev. Mr Wade), who was a very old man, Edward took over the office of Treasurer and Correspondent of the Gravenhurst Schools, where he did much to keep matters going successfully. When the first County Council for Bedfordshire was formed, Edward was chosen as the member for Shillington, and sat through three councils

On his 80th birthday Edward was presented with a handsome walking stick set with a gold band with the inscription: 'To E. Crouch Esq. in commemoration of his 80th birthday Nov. 17th 1903, a token of respect and affection from the parish of Clophill'. It was an appropriate gift, as Edward regularly walked to church – twice on a Sunday – from his home in Cainhoe. He was also given a morocco-bound volume containing the names of some 500 subscribers. On the fly leaf was written: 'To E. Crouch Esq., 'Fourscore and Foursquare'.

In 1905, Edward's wife, Mary Ann, died aged 84. As a memorial, he erected a lych gate at the old church. It bore the inscription 'In the Glory of God and in memory of Mary Ann Crouch, wife of Edward Crouch of Cainhoe'. The gate was moved to the grounds of the new St Mary's Church sometime in the 1970s.


In 1909, King Edward VII visited Wrest Park as the guest of its tenant, the US Ambassador, Whitelaw Reid. Among the local dignitaries present was Lord Lucas's oldest tenant, Edward Crouch. After the King died in 1910 and George V succeeded to the throne, Edward was elected chairman of the committee that organised the Coronation celebrations in Clophill. Also in 1910 funds were raised by public conscription to purchase a silver hot water jug as a gift for Edward. It was displayed in the Post Office window, and was inscribed: 'Presented to Edward Crouch, of Cainhoe, by the inhabitants of Clophill, for his fifty years of service and interest on their behalf.'

Due to advancing age and increasing deafness Edward had to slowly relinquish his duties, and in 1914 he finally retired. He gave up his farms and, as he had no children, all the stock and equipment was auctioned off. That year, on Sunday December 26, he retired to rest, but around midnight he took ill and died half an hour later. At 91, he had been Clophill's oldest inhabitant. The next day, it was with profound regret and deep sorrow that the people of the village heard the news of the passing of Clophill's most highly respected and best loved 'Grand Old Man'.

# Let's talk about...the Budget

The Budget was announced last month and I'm sure you all read about it at the time... but here's a reminder of some of the key changes that could affect you.

Firstly the **personal allowance** has been increased from £10,000 to £10,600 so an extra £600 can be earned before any tax is due.

One change that isn't so good concerns the **starting rate of tax**. This used to be 10% for people who just have savings income, but as of 2015/2016 the starting rate will be gone – so all savings income will be taxed at 20%.

The **basic rate band of tax** has changed, so after your first 10,000 tax-free income, in the 2014/2015 tax year you'll suffer 20% tax on the next £31,865 that you earn and 40% after that. In 2015/2016 this amount goes down to £31,785 before 40% tax kicks in, making that hurdle slightly lower

- and therefore pushing a few more people into the 40% tax band.

The **marriage allowance** has also changed. If your income is less than £10,600 in the 2015/2016 tax year you may be able to reduce your husband's, wife's or civil partner's tax by up to £212. The new Marriage Allowance will let you transfer some of your personal allowance to your partner.

To be able to claim the marriage allowance you must obviously be married, have an annual income of less than £10,600 (including pensions, savings and investments), your spouse must have an income of between £10,601 and £42,385 and you must both be born on or after 6 April 1935 (If you were born before this date you may be able to claim Married Couples Allowance). **Mick Everitt**, our Vice-Chair of governors, passed away at the end of February. Mick began his role as a Governor in 2008 and was a representative of the Diocesan Board of Education on our Governing Body. He was extremely pro-active in supporting the school. He visited frequently to offer support in different capacities, particularly working with Mr Speake, our caretaker, to assess and plan for building maintenance works at the school. Mick also took an active role in the recruitment of new staff and he provided a strong connection between the Methodist Church and the school. Mick was especially linked to Birch class this year and spent time with the children during one of our Governing Body days in the Autumn Term. ### **Christine's quick 'n' easy recipe** *Italian Apple Pie with mascarpone and Rum*



#### **INGREDIENTS** Makes 10 slices

• 320g plain flour

200g caster sugar

• 25g dark cocoa powder

- grated zest & juice of 1 unwaxed lemon
- 200g unsalted butter, cubed 1 whole free range egg
  - 2 free range egg yolks\*
  - 800g Golden Delicious apples
- 3 drops vanilla extract
- 3 tbsp dark rum
- 500g mascarpone
- small pinch of salt
- Prepare the pastry by combining 280g of plain flour, the cocoa powder, salt, 180g unsalted butter, 160g of caster sugar, 2 egg yolks and 1 whole egg. Wrap the pastry in clingfilm and leave to rest in the fridge for about ½ hour.
- 2. Pre-heat the oven to 180°.
- **3.** Prepare the cream by first beating together 30g of caster sugar, the lemon zest and vanilla extract. Whisk in the mascarpone a little at a time then add the remaining 40g of flour and the rum.
- **4.** Use 10g of unsalted butter to grease a flan tin. Roll out the pastry and line the flan tin. Prick the base of the pastry case with a fork.
- **5.** Wash and peel the apples and cut into medium thin slices, then drizzle with the lemon juice to prevent them from going brown.
- 6. Pour the mascarpone cream into the pastry base and level it out with a spoon.
- 7. Arrange the apple slices on top of the cream in a spiral fashion starting at the outer edge of the flan working towards the centre.
- 8. Using a fork, gently press the apples into the cream.
- **9.** Melt the remaining 10g of butter in the microwave and brush the top of the apples, then dust with the remaining caster sugar.
- **10.** Bake in the oven for about 50-55 minutes.
- **11.** Allow to cool before serving.

\*You can freeze the two unused egg whites and use them another time to make meringues or pad out an omelette.

# National Plant Monitoring Scheme

### What is it?

The National Plant Monitoring Scheme (NPMS) is organised and funded by BSBI, CEH, JNCC and Plantlife. The aim is to collect data to provide an annual indication of changes in plant abundance and diversity.

### Why is it needed?

Thanks to volunteers, we have a very good understanding of changes in the populations of birds, butterflies and bats. Plants are the foundations of ecosystems, but currently we do not have a good measure of changes in plant populations.

### How will it work?

This is a scientific survey, so you will be randomly allocated a convenient 1km square to visit. The visit involves recording plant 'indicator species' in plots. Within your 1km square you will record around 5 plots.

#### Who can take part?

Anyone interested in nature who can identify plants, or who is keen to learn. Different levels of participation ensure that all who are keen can participate: you do not have to be an experienced botanist. There will be training materials provided and the opportunity to attend workshops throughout the year.

# **Clophill Neighbourhood Plan**



#### With work well underway on the Neighbourhood Plan, Spotlight will be bringing you regular updates on this exciting opportunity to shape our village...

Let's start with this fact – the Neighbourhood Plan won't happen unless we as a village accept it. That's why **a referendum** will be held later this year. If the NP is accepted, it means that Central Bedfordshire will have to take our Plan

into account when considering any development (land use) within the Parish. That's not to say there can be no further development – but any development will take into account the views of villagers, schools, shops, utilities suppliers, land owners etc about the amount and style of development, and associated infrastructure.

Just so you know, the NP will be created under the 2011 Localism Act. In 2013 the Parish Council registered the entire Parish with Central Bedfordshire (CBC) as the geographic area to be subject to the NP. The NP won't come into effect, though, without going through a series of steps in line with process as set out by the 2011 Act.

That process has already started. Last year at events such as the Village Fete we began canvassing views then putting together a **Vision Statement** and list of **Strategic Themes**. We've also consulted with planning professionals and CBC staff to ensure we're doing the right things, in the right way.

#### VISION STATEMENT

#### **Public Question Time**

There were no members of the public present.

#### **Police Report**

The council received a report from Bedfordshire Police regarding crime within the village. Whilst it was pleasing to see that the instances of crime were low, of concern were thefts of livestock and a pony. In addition, a storage yard was entered and a large amount of diesel stolen. The places where these offences occurred are isolated, however if you see anything suspicious during your walks in and around the village, phone the police. If there's a vehicle involved, don't forget to make a note of the registration number. If we work together we can help prevent and combat crime.

#### The Lands Committees

The new **grit bin** at the junction of The Causeway and High Street has now been re-positioned from the centre island.

Work has commenced to tidy up the village burial ground.

The parish council has undertaken a review of all rents for **allotment land**. Some of these parcels of land run into many acres and, with the help of a valuer, rents have been re-assessed. Notices have been given to some tenants to reflect these rent increase. The rents for the smaller allotments for the growing of fruit, vegetables and flowers will remain unchanged.

The work of removing the **old footbridge** and landscaping of the area at The Green is now complete.

A few villagers attended the meetings regarding the Neighbourhood Plan last month. Following that process a questionnaire has now been finalised and is ready to be sent to the printers. Sadly, however, our roads didn't remain pristine for long. Within 24 hours litter had appeared in several places, most notably The Green.


There's really no excuse for dropping litter or for allowing dogs to foul footpaths and areas where children play. The main culprits seem to be:-
