The Old Church

The guided Tower Tours remained popular over the Christmas and New Year period. There's now a constant stream of visitors, particularly at weekends. In good weather with clear blue skies and backlighting from a low winter the views can be spectacular and well worth the entrance fee.

The Ecolodges

Following receipt of the generous grant from the Frank Branston Family Trust (reported in the December issue) instructions have now been placed to proceed with connection of the Lodges to the National Grid, thus securing a full power supply. This will provide light and power to The Old Church and will mean that the Community Room can become fully operational. In the meantime, locally based contractors Andy Gardner and Robin Odell are progressing with the installation of

timber and glass balustrades on the Lodge balconies, plus carpentry in the Community Room. Richard Hudson continues daily site maintenance work, security and public liaison.

Clophill Preschool News

Welcome back!

The first half of the Spring term has been a busy time for us as we welcome four more families to Preschool.

We started this term with **Box Week**. We brought in an array of cardboard boxes – big, small and everything in between. The empty boxes really fuelled the children's imaginations; they were made into trains, trailers, cars, robots – even a television, which the children used with an old TV remote to 'change the channel'.

We then used the boxes as canvases for mark making which engaged even those who wouldn't usually draw on paper – there was something about the scale and the novelty that

> drew them in. Some children stood the cardboard up to make an underwater scene and **drew sharks with fish in their tummies**, others lay down on the floor and drew patterns, shapes and letters. One child said his pictures would 'make a great story' as he started to draw.

For us mark making isn't just about sitting at a table and using pen and paper. In everyday life we write in so many different places and in so many different ways. By using clipboards,

cardboard, blackboards, even the floor outside, and providing a variety of mark making tools like **chalk, paint and shaving foam** we allow all children to develop their early writing skills in whichever format they're interested in.

We've been focusing a lot of our play in the Messy Area with oats and other cereals. This is a great place to develop language; the children chatted about what they ate for breakfast and discussed the texture of the cereals: **'crinkly', 'crunchy', 'popping' and 'snapping'**. They used words connected with capacity and developed their fine motor skills as they scooped, poured, sprinkled and scrunched, learning to share and use tools with care. This area is always busy and gradually spreads across the room but the children help to tidy it away at the end of play with the help of our new dustpan and broom.

We're always re-evaluating our setting to offer our children the best possible care and learning experiences. We recently purchased some **fantastic educational toys** and we hope to fund-raise to buy some more. Money from last year's Egg Hunt was used to buy a new table as well as lots of messy play materials, paper and card.

This Easter we're hoping to hold another Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday 28th March and may even be including a Dog Show and Cake Competition. Clophill through the years

Trade Tokens

Last year there was a 17th-century trade token from Clophill for sale on eBay which got me interested in these coins, so here's a little history.

In the 17th century, like nowadays, the minting of coins was strictly controlled. Only the King could give permission to mint coins. For village people the availability of small denomination coins was essential for them to make their everyday purchases. The **silver farthing** was last produced in the reign of Edward VI (1547-1553), but had gradually been reduced in size until its use became impractical. In the 17th century James I authorised the issue of **tincoated bronze farthings**. issued. With the restoration of the monarchy in 1660, King Charles II banned tokens and in 1672 the Royal Mint started to issue copper farthings.

In Clophill a token, to the value of one farthing, was issued, which is shown in the photo. There are examples of this token in museums, including the Fitzwilliam Museum, Cambridge, and they appear at auctions. The one that was on eBay was in poor condition, but there are fine examples, as this photo from an online catalogue for an auction of British Trade Tokens, Tickets and Passes, Numismatic Books in 2012 by the auction company Dix Noonan Webb shows. It was sold for £40.

> On one side it says 'IOHN CARTER' and there is an image of a cylindrical object with a spindle or shaft at each end. On the other side it says 'IN CLOPHILL 1666'. In the centre of this side are the initials I, C and S separated by stars.

lohn is a 17th-century spelling of John as I and J were interchangeable then. The cylinder is the sign of a mercer,

a merchant who sells cloth and other things, and represents a roll of cloth. (Some auction houses erroneously list the coin as having the sign of a tobacconist as they used a roll of tobacco as their sign.) His trade is confirmed by a record of the High Sheriff of Bedford's Assizes in 1677. A John Carter of Clophill, mercer, had his shop at Flitton broken into by a boy, John Harper, who said he was looking for something to eat.

You may have expected that someone with the surname Carter was in the transport business, as his ancestors surely were, but it appears that he had two shops, one in Clophill and one in Flitton, selling cloth and other goods.



During the chaos of the English Civil War (1641-45) there was a shortage of small change. After Charles I was beheaded (1649) and Oliver Cromwell formed the Commonwealth of England, local tradesmen took matters into their own hands and had tokens of small denominations made. **They were called tokens because their face value was lower than their metal value**. They were usually made of brass, an alloy of copper and zinc. The tradesmen's customers trusted them to redeem the tokens for their face value.

During the period 1648 to 1672 it's estimated that up to **20,000 different tokens** were

The initials I and C are for John Carter and the S is for his first wife, Sarah. **The token was issued in 1666, the year of the Great Fire of London**. The token has a diameter of 17mm and a weight of 1.63g.

John would have given the tokens as change for larger denominations and his customers would have used them later for further purchases. Other shops in the village may have accepted them, if John was a trusted businessman, to overcome the shortage of small change. Hopefully, John redeemed holders of the tokens at their face value when Charles II banned their use in 1672.

Let's talk about...Pensions



Hello everyone! I do hope you all got your tax returns in by 31st January. This month I'm going to be guiding you through new law on **workplace pensions and automatic enrolment**, which you may have heard about.

It's called automatic enrolment because **if you're an employee**, you'll be automatically enrolled into one of the pension schemes by your employer. You can then opt out if you so desire.

However, **if you're an employer you'll need to take steps** to ensure that you're fulfilling your obligations.

- Firstly, go to *www.thepensions regulator. gov.uk* it gives you lots of helpful information.
- Each employer has a date by which they need to comply with the law. This is called the staging date. On the website you'll find a tool that tells you when the date is – the good news is that for most smaller companies it will be 2016 or 2017, so you still have plenty of time.

- You need to complete certain tasks by your staging date. One of the tasks is to assess your workforce to see who's eligible generally, it will be employees who earn more than £10k per year, work in the UK and are between 22 and state pension age. You'll then need to pick a pension scheme and tell all your staff what is going on.
- Don't worry there are plenty of pension providers and pension schemes to choose from. Pension contributions from your limited company will be tax deductible.

For those of you who have **a personal pension**, there are also new rules which give you more options as to what to do with your pension pot. Previously you were forced to buy an annuity but now you can treat your pension pot more like a normal savings fund. You can still draw 25% of your pension pot as a tax-free lump sum, then any other amounts drawn out of your pension – in whatever form – will be taxable.

I would always **recommend taking the maximum of the full 25%** then topping up ISAs, premium bonds etc to keep this money outside the scope of tax.

Christine's quick 'n' easy recipe Spezzatino con le Patate (Casserole of beef with saffron & potatoes)



INGREDIENTS Serves 4

- 800g steak
- 500g waxy potatoes
- plain flour for dusting
- sprig of fresh Rosemary
- 50g pancetta, cut into cubes
- salt & freshly ground black pepper
 - extra virgin olive oil

2 cloves of garlic 1 sachet of saffron

- small knob of butter
- 1 fresh bay leaf
- 1 tsp tomato concentrate
- small glass of dry white wine
- 1 litre vegetable stock (fresh or cube)
- 1. Cut your steak into cubes removing any fat or gristle.
- **2.** Toss the cubes in flour and then place in a sieve and shake to remove any excess flour.
- 3. Peel the garlic, remove the rosemary from the stalk and finely chop together.
- **4.** Gently heat a splash of olive oil and the knob of butter in a pan and gently fry the cubed pancetta for 1-2 minutes and then add in the cubed steak. Continue to fry for a further 3-4 minutes, stirring to stop the meat sticking to the pan.
- 5. Add in the chopped garlic and rosemary and moisten with the wine.
- 6. While the wine is evaporating add in the tomato concentrate, three soup ladles of hot stock, the bay leaf and the saffron.
- 7. Season to taste.
- **8.** Cover the pan and simmer for about 1hr 40 mins, stirring from time to time to avoid it sticking, and adding in more stock as required.
- 9. Peel the potatoes and cut into large cubes.
- 10. Add these to the casserole with an additional two soup ladles of stock.
- **11.** Cook until the potatoes are tender, stirring from time to time but being careful not to break up the potatoes. Add more stock if required.
- 12. Serve piping hot decorated with a little more chopped rosemary.
