In Aid of Macmillan Cancer Support



The following observations are based on the experience of one of our volunteers. No-one in Clophill Community Care is an expert in this area, but we hope you may find this useful. If you have an elderly neighbour, who lives alone and perhaps doesn't often see their family, you might be able to spot some tell-tale signs of the onset of dementia. These could include:

- Withdrawal from normal contact or friends no longer visiting
- Erratic behaviour, especially driving Neglect of home and garden
- Self-neglect, eg weight loss and/or unkempt appearance Frequent loss of items such as a purse or house keys Unwillingness to accept that there may be a problem.

If you suspect that something may be amiss here are some actions you can take:

- Try to get the person to go to see their doctor, offer to take them if necessary;
- If this fails contact Social Services and the person's doctor, if known, and insist on their coming to
 assess the situation. DO NOT take "no" for an answer. The words "vulnerable" and "safety
 issues" are good triggers;
- Be a good neighbour by keeping a weather eye open for opportunities to help;
- If a carer becomes necessary and the person has sufficient funds, look around for the best provider. The local authority is constrained by available funding.
- Age UK is a very good resource and has some very useful free information booklets and professional advice;
- At this point the person may be entitled to an attendance allowance & may need help in applying for it;
- At some point, if the person has not already set up Lasting Power of Attorney, it will be necessary
 for a Deputy to be appointed by the Court of Protection to look after their financial affairs. This is
 a lengthy and cumbersome process, but if a relative or neighbour doesn't take it on the Local
 Authority will appoint a solicitor, which will seriously deplete their funds;
- If you become the Deputy and it becomes necessary to look for a Care Home, look around for
 the best the person can afford and make sure you know their rights. You may be told many
 conflicting things by individuals in Social Services and the Local Authority about issues such as
 the 12 Week Disregard, top-up fees and the Attendance Allowance. Central Beds has a
 booklet which gives the information you need.

It's another wonderful amount, but so characteristic of you Clophill folk. I also want to thank the brilliant 'team' who delivered the envelopes then went back to collect them – giving residents an opportunity to put cash or a cheque in them, and so making that second journey worthwhile. **Thank you all very much indeed.**

As I wrote in the March edition of Spotlight, I've now relinquished my role as coordinator for the collection – but I'd love to hear from anybody who'd like to take it over. If nobody comes forward, perhaps next year there might have to be just one fund-raising event – it won't raise anywhere near as much as the house to house collection but will still help a few in the poorest and most vulnerable communities who share our world. Christine's quick 'n' easy recipe

Pesto Dinner Rolls



INGREDIENTS Makes 12 small dinner rolls

For the rolls

- 250g strong white flour
- ½ tsp salt

- ½ tsp sugar
- 3.5g dried yeast
- 7g extra virgin olive oil
- 150ml warm water

For the pesto

- 5 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 1 clove of garlic (cut into pieces)
- 1 tbsp freshly grated parmesan cheese
- 1 tbsp pine nuts
- small bunch of fresh basil
- salt and freshly ground black pepper

- **1.** Put the flour, sugar, salt and dried yeast into a clean dry bowl.
- Add in the olive oil and the warm water and mix well.
- **3.** Once the dough starts to come together turn out onto a floured work surface.
- **4.** Knead the dough until it becomes smooth and elastic.
- **5.** Place in a clean oiled bowl and cover with a clean cloth or clingfilm.
- **6.** Set aside in a warm place until the dough has at least doubled in size approx 1 hour.
- 7. Pre-heat the oven to 190°.
- **8.** Whilst the dough is rising prepare the pesto by putting the oil, parmesan, garlic, pine

nuts, basil leaves and seasoning into a blender.

- **9.** Blend until you have a smooth sauce.
- **10.** Turn the risen dough out onto a floured surface and punch back to its original size knead until smooth.
- **11.** Divide the risen dough into 12 pieces.
- 12. Roll out each of these pieces out until you have a long strip.
- 13. Brush each strip with the pesto and roll up.
- **14.** Place in pre-greased ramekin dishes or mini flower pots.
- 15. Bake in the oven until well risen and golden brown about 30 minutes.
- 16. Cool on a rack before serving.



Getting to grips with your tax

Has your financial position changed in the past year? Have you retired, sold an asset or started a new venture? Are you aware that you may need to let HMRC know that you need to complete a tax return?

Do any of the following apply to you since 6 April 2015...

- started to rent out a property
- sold a property that isn't your main home
- started a new business, even part-time around another job
- earn more than £50,000 and myself or my partner receive child benefit
- in receipt of dividend income and am a higher rate tax payer
- became a company director


If any of these are relevant for the year ended 5 April 2016, they fall into the 2015/16 tax year, and you have until 5 October 2016 to notify HMRC that you need to complete a tax return. This 2015/16 tax return should be with HMRC by 31 October 2016 if you choose to file a paper tax return or it can be electronically filed by 31 January 2017.

If you owe tax for 2015/16, then this should be paid by 31 January 2017. If your tax liability under self-assessment is more than £1,000 you may have to make payments on account of tax for 2016/17.

Are you a higher rate tax payer or do you pay into a personal pension scheme out of your taxed income?

If so, are you claiming back the tax relief on your contributions? Some taxpayers assume they'll receive higher rate tax relief automatically. However, this isn't the case, and the onus is on the tax-payer to claim the tax relief and what HMRC owes you.

A higher rate tax payer contributing £2,000 per year into a personal pension



And did you know that higher rate tax payers can also receive tax relief on donations to charity under Gift Aid? Again the relief due is 20% of what you've given to charity over the tax year.

All tax payers can claim tax relief for subscriptions paid to professional bodies if your employer doesn't reimburse you for this expense. Search for a form P87 on the HMRC website. https://www.gov.uk/government/organisations/hm-revenue-customs

Hi everyone! Well, what a busy year it's been for Clophill Preschool. We're near the end of term with over 40 children on roll and more booked to visit us in September. We say a big hello to Claire and Kirsty, our new 1:1 support workers doing a great job for our children with additional needs. We also say a big thank you and sort of goodbye to Jenny, who's been with us for over a year.



Jenny is moving back to her original role as a children's nanny but has kindly agreed to stay on as bank staff for us, which will give great continuity to our children.

And more changes – you know how we like to develop our setting! Our **new mud pit** is now in place. Many thanks to James's grandad for constructing it for us, and to Chris's boys for digging it in place. We've fitted it with a deep plastic bottom so that all soil that we've added,

though full of worms and little creatures, is free from

anything dangerous or harmful, and the lockable lid ensures the local cats can't use it! The children have loved it. Wellies are donned and in they go – digging, exploring, mixing, searching and chatting.

We have more than six schools that our children feed into for their Reception year and we've been forging great relationships with them all. The class teachers have been coming to visit their prospective children in setting and we've been sharing information to help **ease their transition** at this exciting, but sometimes scary, time. We organised for Sophie Adams from Central Beds to talk with parents about getting their children ready for the move to school. We've been



to the schools and asked for examples of uniform which has given the children the chance to see what they'll be wearing as well as try them on – often resulting in lovely roleplay.

The children have also met our **Worry Monster** to whom we write notes about any concerns or worries we have, or just questions they want answered. These notes get posted in his mouth and overnight he writes little notes back answering their questions and hopefully putting worries to rest.

For July's Messy Play session at Toddlers we had a bit of a twist by setting up as Preschool to give all the children and their families a chance to see what Preschool offers the children of our village and beyond.

Meanwhile our term has been great fun as we've built dens, hatched chicks from eggs in the incubator and held mini discos in our new gazebo. Nell also very kindly came up to make willow crowns with the children which they loved – thanks Nell. And still to look forward to we have our Sports Day on Wednesday 13th July, our Leaver's Party on Wednesday 20th and our end of term trip on Thursday 21st.

Summer first aid tips

Children like to play in the sun, but are you prepared for medical emergencies? Paediatric First Aid trainer Danielle Bridge from ABC Life Support gives some tips...

Insect stings: If your child is stung by a bee or wasp, don't grab a pair of tweezers to get it out – you'll end up squeezing the bulb sting, which will release



more poison into the skin. Instead use a credit card or your finger nail, if it's nice and long, to scrape away the sting. Afterwards, leave a cold compress on the skin for about 10 minutes. You'll also need to monitor your child to ensure there's no allergic reaction. If you do notice swelling or a patchy rash, or if they're vomiting or having breathing problems, call an ambulance straight away.

Heat exhaustion: Signs of heat exhaustion to look out for include dizziness, headache, confusion, nausea, loss of appetite, sweating and pale, clammy skin. If your child has any of these, get them to a cool place and give them lots of water and then a weak salt solution of 1 tsp salt per litre of water. If they still seem unwell after half an hour, seek medical help.

Heat stroke: This is more serious than heat exhaustion so call the Emergency Services immediately if your child has a severe headache, is restless and confused and has flushed, hot, dry skin. While you're waiting for the ambulance, use a cold flannel to sponge them down while fanning them. If you have a sheet, wet it with cold water and wrap your child in it. Repeat this until their temperature goes back to normal (37 degrees) then wrap them in a dry sheet.

Burns: If your child has got too close to the BBQ and suffered a burn, you need to put the injured part under cold running water immediately. Most people only do this for a couple of minutes but you need to keep going for 10 minutes – it will stop the burning process and eliminate pain.

In June our demonstration was entertaining, inspirational and a little unusual! Demonstrator Kate Thomas, a florist from Funky Flowers in Wokingham, gave us an insight into the work of a florist as well as a **floral art designer**. Her designs were all very different in style – from traditional to contemporary, and influenced by some of the European designers she's worked with.

Kate used lots of exotic and unusual blooms, including anthirriums, huge lilies and peonies. She created six designs on a theme of 'Hidden Gems'. Her first arrangement depicted the gems in the garden, in a large bark-covered container with lots of country garden-type flowers. For her next design with carnations and roses, she used a hand-tied bouquet as the framework. Another floral arrangement was created on a chandelier structure with wire, beads and other decorations, to which Kate added lisianthus and small roses. We were also treated to a large traditional pedestal full of summer flowers.

We had a large audience who were fascinated by Kate's work. Our club now has 86 members from a wide area and it's good to be able to show them some interesting demonstrators. Two of our members had been busy: Jean Tipping represented the club at the Herts Show with a large exhibit depicting Capability Brown's gardens; and our chairman Carolyn Cranswick had the honour of arranging flowers at the High Altar in Westminster Abbey for a royal service in May.

It's a special year for Clophill & District Flower Club as we celebrate our 40th anniversary. Next month, for members only, we have a dinner and demonstration 'Ruby Thursday', Then in September we're staging a Flower Festival at St Mary's Church. Notes from the Parish Council meeting held on 28th June

Clophill in the summer

Clophill is a fantastic place to live all year round, but in the summer it's particularly delightful. Just recently we've been able to enjoy a number of local events including the Eco Lodge's Midsummer Party, Clophill Open Gardens – raising money for St Mary's Church – and Clophill St Mary's Football Club Tournament which saw over 200 local youngsters playing the beautiful game on our rec.

This month there's been a meeting for the new, invigorated Clophill Neighbourhood Watch already, and on Sunday 17th July there's a Food Fair at the Village Hall from 12-4pm, raising money for St Mary's Church. **These summertime events help to create such a positive community atmosphere** in the village, which in turn helps us as a council to understand who we're representing and how best to do so. If you're involved in setting up events or activities in the village, please do contact us and we'll be delighted to support and promote where required.

Public consultation on Library Service

Our colleagues at Central Bedfordshire council have asked us to make villagers aware that there's a public consultation taking place about the local library service. The Library Service is required to meet an efficiencies target, identified in the council's Medium Term Financial Plan, of £85,000 from 1 April 2017. Overall, the Library Service will be reducing opening hours by 30 hours a week.

As part of the proposed changes the Library Service is also trying to find ways of opening libraries to communities outside normal opening hours so as to make the best use of the buildings. This includes evenings and weekends. Buildings could be used for activities such as health advice sessions, local meetings or adult education. This is part of the council's objectives in the Five Year Plan to foster self-sustaining communities and support people to help themselves and others.

Local bus service

The Parish Council has responded to the Central Bedfordshire Council consultation (which is open until 12th July) to changes on bus services in the area (see *goo.ql/b42sVI*).

We were advised that this also included a ban of concessionary passes before 9.30am. Flittabus, a bus service that passes through the village, have told us that such a ban would have a devastating effect on their business as eight of their 11 routes start before 9.30am and the major source of operating income is from concessionary fares. We know Flittabus is valued highly by our residents, and so we've asked CBC if they can ensure that this restriction isn't imposed on this valuable community service.

Play space at the Rec

Since being elected last May Cllr Lousie Hodge has been working hard to develop the play space on the Recreation ground. We've now placed an order for new play equipment which will be installed in July in time for the school holidays. The new equipment comprises of a large multi-activity climbing frame, replacement swings for juniors, swing set and a basket

swing. The Rec ground will have areas fenced off during installation, which will last around two weeks, but the ramps, MUGA and current frame will remain available.

Further consultation is taking place with suppliers to specify extra equipment to compliment the new climbing frame; along with a budget that will be used as a fundraising target. Louise is also looking at outdoor gym equipment to improve our open spaces for adults. Grass verges

We've had correspondence from many people in the village about the overgrown grass verges on the main roads surrounding the village. CPC Councilor and CBC Ward Councilor Paul Downing has been investigating this problem for us: 'Last week I spoke with CBC Councillor Budge Wells who leads on this issue. He reminded me that CBC had signed a contract with a Shefford-based firm in April 2016 for them to cut 50mph roads (so the A507) several times per year. Quite simply they haven't, and are using the 'rain' as an excuse. Cllr Wells knows that all CBC Councillors are disappointed with performance against the contract and your three Ward Councillors met with CBC Highways staff recently. We've been assured that action will be taken. I will find out what the schedule is for local cutting and let Clophill villagers know."

The next Parish Council meeting will take place in the village hall at 7.45pm on Tuesday 26th July with a surgery at 7.30pm






