News from Clophill Heritage Trust



The Old Church and Eco Lodges

The photo shows **Nadine Dorries**, our Mid Bedfordshire MP, together with trustees Richard Hudson and Ali Bradbury, on a visit to the Old Church and Eco Lodges on 23 January 2015. 'Onwards and upwards,' says Nadine as she offers her support to the Trust to complete the facility, with the possibility of a visit later in the year from the Minister of Education.

Eco zone and water supply

On site we have our own water abstraction boreholes, drilled to a depth of 60 metres for our drinking water supply and 100 metres for ground source for heating purposes. These were completed at the same time as the piling works for the lodge foundations.

Thank you to Ian Kay from the village who is kindly helping us prepare our ground source heating solution to integrate with the grid connection, which we hope to be completed in the next couple of months. We'd like to be part of the current government's renewable heat initiative scheme with this eco solution.

All the eco lodges are specified to have underfloor heating from our ground source heat pump, giving efficient, even warmth throughout.

Coppicing course

On Saturday 21 February we held our first **Woodland Skills course** at the lodges. The weather was kind and participants were able to learn the theory and basic practicalities of coppicing in locally-managed ash and hazel woodland.

Forthcoming courses

- A Guided Geology Trail, Friday 20th March, 10am-2pm The trail will be guided by Bedford Geology Group. £3 per person
- Willow Weaving, Thursday 9th and Friday 10th April, 9.30am-3.30pm The course features an introduction to Willow Weaving, including the construction of a set of willow hurdles at the lodges. £45 per day; £70 if you book for both days plus Clophill residents get a further £20 discount per person. There's also a kids' 'willow fun' session on the 9th, 10am-noon, £5 per person.

Clophill through the years

1925 Rating and Valuation Act

(a modern Domesday)



Ever since William the Conqueror instigated the Great Survey, which resulted in the Domesday Book, governments have needed to carry out surveys to assess the populace for tax purposes.

In 1925 it was decided to rationalise the rating system and have one tax to replace the poor rates, borough rates and general district rates. This came into force on 1 April 1927 and surveys were carried out to establish the value of each property in the country.

A valuation officer visited each property and recorded his findings in a Field Book. The one for Clophill is kept at the Bedford & Luton Archives & Record Service along with a map which shows the location of each property. This record tells us a lot about living conditions at the time.

In 1927 there were 209 residential houses, the majority (135) having two bedrooms and being either semi-detached or terraced. They were of the 'two up, two down' format with a kitchen and living room downstairs. Outside, there was an earth closet and, sometimes, a washhouse – with the water being obtained from a well. The quality of the housing varied enormously; some were purpose-built, such as the Forester's Cottages

(9, 11 & 15 Back Street) which bear the plaque AOF 1882, while many were in very poor condition. Seventy-five per cent of houses were rented

The valuation officer, as well as recording the details and making valuations, also recorded personal comments. Some houses he liked – for Holly Cottage he said "Nice garden. Very nice." A lot he didn't like. About April Cottage he said: "Ought to be destroyed. Disgraceful. Should be condemned." Some cottages, mostly thatched, he described as 'weekend type'. Of Woodside, 7 Back Street, he says: "Tenant comes from Finchley. Has been stung for the rent. Compares it with London prices and is satisfied." He was impressed by a tenant in Jacques Lane who'd been there for 90 years – her mother having lived there before for over 90 years.

Twenty two houses only had one bedroom, while 32 had four. The larger houses, with four, five or six bedrooms, had piped water and flushing toilets to a cesspit – though some still hadn't got basic services, such as Clophill Barns (London House) where the valuation was reduced by 33% "for no lighting or heating, no railway handy & general inconvenience".

Although there was the Water Works at the east end of the High Street, only eight houses were recorded as being connected. Drawing water from a well was the norm. Likewise, only four houses were recorded as having electricity, and three had a telephone.

There were 34 premises described as 'Farm Buildings', which usually consisted of barns, sheds, henhouses and pigsties. The High

Street, before the recent infilling, was much more open, with 24 of these groups of farm buildings along the street with surrounding fields being used for agriculture. The use of working horses is indicated by the presence of chaffhouses, food mixing buildings, mealhouses and stables. Some had mechanised equipment as there is mention of a 4 h.p. Petrol Engine & Meal Crusher and a Bentall Grinder with Massey Harris 4.5 h.p. engine used for preparing feedstuff for animals. There were also nine allotments, with large ones (20 acres) at Furze Hill, Back Street, Pine Hill, Shefford Road and Jacques Lane.

As for the pubs, the Flying Horse was described as "Gets main road traffic. Has good yard. Gets Charabanc parties. Mainly weekend trade. Best pub in village. Take visitors. Caution. Question of takings? Not so good a house as it used to be." The remark about the takings is because the quantities of draught beer, bottled beer and spirits seemed on the low side.

The Green Man was said to "Get Luton Police & Stati Fair once a year." It sold 1½ barrels of beer, 1 gallon of spirits and 1½ doz. bottles of

beer a week. This is similar to what the other pubs claimed but the valuation officer was obviously suspicious. At the Compasses he was told "Takings never reckoned up" and at the Rising Sun "Takings unknown". The Stone Jug landlord claimed he had "No idea of takings" and the valuation officer noted "Trade is probably incorrect. Tenant keeps no books."

The valuation officer wrote of the Stone Jug "The House very damp. Living room floor gone. (Dry rot- no ventilation) Trade is probably incorrect."

Buildings that have since disappeared include: the Church Room, High Street (opposite the church), which was used for all parish meetings and for Church of England purposes; the Reading Room (next to the church), which housed Clophill Men's Club; and the National School. The school was opened in 1872 for 233 pupils but had an average attendance in 1926 of 142. It was demolished after St Mary's school was built in 1973.

So the survey, like the Domesday Book, gives a picture of how things were in the past.


Christine's quick 'n' easy recipe Pasta with Spring Vegetables



INGREDIENTS Serves 4

- 50g of butter
- 1 crushed clove of garlic
- 200g British asparagus
- 250g of peas (fresh or frozen)
- 100g baby leaf spinach
- 450g of tagliatelle

- 1 unwaxed lemon
- extra virgin olive oil
- salt & freshly ground pepper
- freshly grated parmesan
- 1 bunch chopped mixed fresh herbs mint, parsley, basil



- Prepare the asparagus by discarding the tough parts and cutting into short pieces.
- **3.** Pod the peas if using fresh.
- **4.** Gently heat the butter and a splash of olive oil in a large frying pan then add in the crushed garlic and fry gently for about 1 minute.
- **5.** Add in all the fresh vegetables, toss in the butter for 2 minutes then add in a soup ladle of hot water and cook for another 5 minutes (or until cooked to your liking).
- **6.** In the meantime, cook your pasta in the boiling water following the instructions on the packet. The pasta should be cooked but still have a 'bite' to it.
- **7.** Drain the pasta and add it to the vegetables.
- **8.** Add in the zest and juice of the lemon plus the chopped herbs and mix well together.
- **9.** Serve with freshly grated parmesan.



Let's talk about...stamp duty

with Sally Cobban





It's often at this time of year that people think more about doing things with their houses or moving. Stamp duty has recently changed so I thought I'd set out the differences so that you know the costs of moving.

Under the old rules, Stamp Duty charged successively higher rates on the whole of the purchase price. For this reason, it was often criticised as a 'slab tax'. Its structure meant there were sudden increases in stamp duty, when the price went above the next threshold.

For example, someone buying a home for £250,000 would have paid £2,500, or 1%, in stamp duty. But if the price was £1 more, they would have paid an extra £5,000, as they then paid 3% on the whole purchase price.

The new system came in from midnight on 3rd December 2014. The new rates of stamp duty will only apply to the amount of the purchase price that falls within the particular duty band, making it more like income tax.


In other words, someone buying a house for £200,000 will pay nothing on the first £125,000, and then 2% of the next £75,000, giving them a bill of £1,500. Previously they would have paid 1% on the total purchase price, giving them a bill of £2,000. So although the percentage rates appear higher in some cases, the overall charge will mostly be lower.

The new rates will be

The new rates will be	
 Up to £125,000 	0%
• £125,001 to £250,000	2%
• £250,001 to £925,000	5%
• £925,001 to £1.5m	10%
 Above £1.5m 	12%

Someone buying a family home for an average price in England and Wales will now pay £4,500 less in stamp duty. The new system will also smooth out the steps – or sudden jumps – in existing stamp duty thresholds.

Clophill now has a once-in-a-generation chance to produce its own plan to say **how the village will change over the next 15 years**.

Come along to a Discussion Event at the Village Hall on **Friday 13 March 7pm-9pm** or **Saturday 14 March noon-2pm** and find out more.

The Neighbourhood Plan is your chance to shape the future of Clophill. New planning powers handed to the Parish Council by Parliament give local people a say on what happens over the next 15 years.

'What power will this give us?'

The Neighbourhood Plan will provide some of the important policies that future planning applications – of all kinds – will be judged against. Therefore it's a document that will have a major say on whether applications in the parish are approved or refused. And that power is in the villager's hands. This has never been the case before, so this is genuinely ground breaking.

'Doesn't Central Bedfordshire Council produce this plan?'

Up until recently they were the only ones permitted to produce a plan. But the Coalition Government's 'localism' agenda has passed the power on local matters to local people. The CBC's plan will still be important in setting the high level planning policies but most decisions, including potentially the total amount of houses to be built in and around Clophill, can now be made locally.

'So what can our Neighbourhood Plan cover?'

This is largely up to you. The Parish Council has come up with a list of issues it considers to be important, including:

- Housing the amount, location and type of housing
- Employment how best to bring new businesses to Clophill

- **Retail** the need for shops and how to maintain the vitality of our existing shops
- Transport how to minimise congestion and how to link with other local transport hubs
- Parking how to alleviate parking problems around the village green and elsewhere
- Energy ways to maximise on-site energy generation by renewable sources
- Education how to address the lack of spaces at our existing primary school
- Health looking at the need for and ways to provide GP/Dental services in the village
- Tourism, Arts and Culture how to maximise the heritage offer of our village and its facilities
- **Environment and Recreation** improving green open spaces/paths and play/youth facilities

These are just ideas – ultimately what the Neighbourhood Plan covers is up to you.

'How can we get involved?'

This is not the Parish Council's plan; it's the community's plan. Without the involvement of residents, businesses, community groups, landowners, etc we have no Neighbourhood Plan. We need your help. Please see http://www.centralbedfordshire.gov.uk/planning/strategic-planning/neighbourhood-plans.aspx or http://clophillparishcouncil.bedsparishes.gov.uk/al4776073-4776083 for more information.

The discussion events at the Village Hall will tell you more about the Neighbourhood Plan and how you can get involved. It will also be an opportunity for you to ask any questions you may have and to register your interest in getting involved. Don't worry, this won't take up vast amounts of your time, but it will give you a chance to shape the issues you feel passionate about in Clophill. Other parishes and towns across the country are doing this in their communities and are finding out that it can be a lot of fun!

Notes from the Annual Parish Council meeting held on 27 January and 24 February 2015

Readers are reminded that this is a resume only of the meeting. The parish council minutes are published and can be found on the internet after they are authorised (approximately five weeks after the relevant meeting).

Public Question Time

The leaders of the St Mary's School football teams attended and explained their need for the use of the playing fields for their senior team. Currently, the playing surface at the school isn't in a good state and the size is restrictive for the older pupils. It was agreed by the Council that, subject to them conferring with the other teams who currently use the Playing Field to avoid clashes, they welcome the additional use of these public facilities.

Police Report

At January's meeting, the Council were updated on the crime statistics for November/ December by our local PCSO. It was noted that overall the figures were fairly flat versus the same period last year.

At the February meeting, the council received a report from Bedfordshire Police regarding crime within the village. Of real concern were three incidents – the burglary and theft from a house within the village; an attempted burglary where offenders were disturbed trying to break into another house; and a garage break-in. One of the houses in question wasn't in a remote location but right on the High Street.

The message as always is, keep your home, garage and vehicles secure, and report any suspicious behaviour to police. If you require crime prevention advice, you can get it free from Bedfordshire Police; they can help with everything from home security to advising about burglar alarms.

Parish Council Vacancy

It was accepted that, as we're now within three months from electing a new Council, the vacancy wouldn't be filled, but anyone showing an interest would be encouraged to attend the remaining meetings to get a flavour of how the council works. And if you'd like to talk to someone about the work and what's involved, you can contact Peter Clarke or the parish clerk Lyn Lyman - their numbers are on the 'Useful numbers' page.

The Council still has a vacancy for a person to litter pick following Mr Caton's retirement from this post. It involves approximately three hours per week. Anyone interested should please contact the Council Clerk, Mrs Lyman, on 01908 584159.

Old Bridge at the Green

The redundant bridge has now been removed by Amey, finally completing the project which was one of the highest requests made when the Village Plan was developed. With the other planting and work around the bridge we now have an area that the village can be proud of. Congratulations and thank you to all the people who have participated in helping the Parish Council to achieve this outcome.

Village Hall Fence

The Parish Council have agreed to contribute 50% of the costs to fencing required at the Hall, with the Village Hall committee covering the remainder.

Salt Bins

Two further salt bins have been acquired and positioned, one at the junction of the Causeway/High Street and the other at the junction of Jacques Lane/High Street. Both have been positioned on Highways land with their permission, and the salt is for use on the footpaths or highway. The salt is not for use on private driveways or property – to do so would be committing an offence.

After the new grit bin was positioned at the junction of The Causeway and the High Street, it was then moved by persons unknown and placed in the centre island, ruining the newly planted bulbs bought for the village. At a cost to the village, arrangements are in hand to put the bin back in the original position.

Proposal: Application for the continuation of sand extraction, recycling of

inert material and restoration of the site by land filling.

In the past there have been numerous complaints received about the working of this site. It's interesting to note within this application

the measures that have already been taken to reduce the main causes of complaint, that being dust from the crushing plant, noise and the mud and debris being carried onto the highway. Whilst the work done hasn't eliminated all of the problems it has certainly reduced causes. In addition, the land fill will be achieved with inert material and not rubbish from other areas of the country. The quarry is regularly monitored and this will continue throughout its working life. In the circumstances the council doesn't object to the proposals. **SUPPORT**

CB/14/04827/Full

Location: 1 & 2 Northfield Cottages, Great Lane, Clophill

Proposal: Conversion of two cottages to four dwellings. The site of these

dwellings is outside the village settlement area. The council recently supported an application for the alteration of one of the dwellings to make it a more habitable place for a family. This application seeks to create two further dwellings and, if agreed, would set a precedent for other such properties, wishing to do the same.

In order to improve the safety of vehicles leaving the Pine View site, highways have decided to extend the 40mph speed restriction on the A507 from the roundabout on the A6 towards Ampthill to the western side of Pine View.

The Lakes Site

At a special meeting of the parish council on 19th February, the lakes site and the recent purchase of the area by Gallagher's was discussed. Gallagher's would like to include the parish council in any talks with CBC regarding this land. The parish council agreed, and passed a resolution as follows. 'The parish council has a goal of bringing The Lakes Site into public ownership. The parish council understands that to achieve this aim some development may be necessary'. The parish council won't be part of any negotiation with planners. Planning authority isn't within the gift of the parish council but we do want to know what the intentions of the new owners are and if need be put on alert to try and influence any development. The Parish Council has been made aware that the firm has entered the site for consideration by CBC in the recent call for housing development. No actual plans have been submitted for consideration, only that Gallagher have registered an interest.

The next Parish Council meeting will take place in the village hall at 7.45pm on Tuesday 31st March 2015, with a surgery at 7.30pm
