If you'd like to help please meet at 10am at The Green where you'll be given your equipment and allocated an area. Wear gloves and strong footwear.



Hi everyone!

At last the warmer weather is upon us and we're able to get more and more resources outside every day. With our recent grant we bought new trikes as well as some great guttering and stands to run water, gravel, sand, cars or pretty much anything down. There are new weaving numbers and sports equipment, the jungle telephone, a whole new set of fencing to go right around our outdoor area, while inside we have our new tablets with some great interactive educational games on plus rechargeable torches and remote control cars.

Our group times are working brilliantly, with the Green Group really enjoying the more structured process as we have fun getting ready for school and focusing on our phonic awareness and maths. We're learning letter sounds and identifying the

initial sounds in words, story structure, building our vocabulary, developing our questioning skills and using talk to give explanations. In Maths we're developing our mathematical language, investigating number problems and focusing on numeral recognition.

Red Group are learning lots of their number and counting primarily through **rhymes and songs** as well as working on prepositions. Their listening skills develop each session as they join in with lots of fun activities that develop their understanding across all areas of the curriculum.

All our children have been really enjoying our story sacks which they have the opportunity to take home as well as **Barry Bear and his Diary** and our Activity Boxes. These all give parents the opportunity to join their children in a fun learning activity that their child can then bring in to share with the others.

Also this month we were lucky enough to have Terry Lee (one of our parents) in to record the children's opinions about Preschool. Terry is a Radio LaB Coordinator for Bedfordshire University and the children were fascinated with his microphone. Most of the children were eager to chat to him about what they were doing and who they were playing with as well as answering his questions about the things they like best about Preschool. We hope to be able to put it on our Facebook page or website soon. So a big thank you for coming in Terry.



Remembering Clophill's fallen

Continuing our series on the centenary of Clophill's brave men who lost their lives in the First World War, this month we focus on John Doggett, who died on 7 March 1916.



John Doggett was born in Clophill in 1874. He grew up at 20 Jacques Lane with his parents –William. a farm labourer, and Hannah – and 15 siblings. In 1902 he married Fanny Swann in Aldercar, Derbyshire. In 1911 John lived with his wife and four (of five) surviving children in Langley Mill, Derbyshire, working as a coal miner/hewer. He'd previously worked as an agricultural labourer.

After the outbreak of WW1 John enlisted in Ilkeston, Derbyshire, and served in the 18th Battalion of the Sherwood Foresters, Notts & Derby Regiment. The 18th Battalion helped

with reinforcement and training units and Home Defence, eventually attempting to keep pace with heavy losses over the four years of the War. However, towards the end of the war, the high casualty rate resulted in the amalgamation of weakened Battalions. He was 42 when he died. Ampthill News reported his death as follows: 'Mrs Doggett of Jacques Cottages has been informed that her son, Pte Doggett' has succumbed to an operation after being severely wounded. Unfortunately this brave soldier leaves a wife and five children to mourn his loss.'





John is commemorated at Brookwood Cemetery, near Woking. It's the largest cemetery in Britain and one of the largest in the world. The British Military Cemetery is administered by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. It is the oldest part of the military cemeteries at Brookwood and was originally set aside for the burial of soldiers, sailors and nurses who died in the London Military District.

Police convictions following damage to the Old Church

On the night of Sunday 5 October 2014 thousands of pounds worth of damage was caused to an iron gate and masonry at the (then recently restored) old church. In January 2016, six men from the Potters Bar and Barnet areas appeared at Luton Crown Court where they were charged with, and found guilty of, aiding or watching criminal damage. They each received 12 month suspended custodial sentences, £500 fines and were ordered to do 80 hours community work. They all now also have a criminal record.

Acorn Nursery News

We're delighted to welcome Eleanor and Thea to the Nursery and hope they enjoy their time with us.

As the weather warms up this half term we're looking at Minibeasts. We have flowers, which were planted by the children, growing already and we hope they'll start to attract the insects which we will then be able to examine in our special bug magnifiers. We're learning rhymes and songs connected to our theme and making the insects mentioned in them to decorate our theme board.

Our season board will be bursting into life with Spring arriving, too, as we learn about lifecycles of plants and animals. We'll use the all-time favourite story of the Hungry Caterpillar for the lifecycle of a butterfly and will be watching real butterflies emerging from their cocoons before releasing them in the garden. We're hoping to be able to watch tadpoles develop into frogs again in the garden this year as well.

Our topic ties in well with our value of 'caring' as we'll be looking after the minibeasts and learning what's needed for them to survive, leading to talking about what helps keep us healthy too. We'll be planting vegetables in our vegetable plot and watching them grow, plus planting sunflowers to take home and put in our flower beds.

Acorn children have the opportunity to join the school in making a special surprise for Mothering Sunday – thank you to the Friends of St.Mary's for helping the children to create their gifts. We'll also be joining the school for the Lent activities. It will be lovely to see the older children taking care of the younger children and involving them in their ideas and decision-making when tackling the obstacles as well as having lots of fun together.

At the end of the term we'll be making Easter cards incorporating our theme and will have a few Easter Egg hunts to ensure all children receive an Easter gift. Christine's quick 'n' easy recipe

Pork Loin with Cannellini Beans



INGREDIENTS Serves 6 people

- 1 pork loin, approx 1kg
- 1 clove of garlic

- branch of fresh rosemary
- 1 tin or jar of cannellini beans
- 1 medium red onion
- knob of butter
- extra virgin olive oil
- 1 It vegetable stock or stock cube
- salt & freshly ground pepper
- glass of white wine

- Peel the garlic and cut into small slivers and remove the rosemary from the stalk. Flavour the meat by inserting a small bunch of garlic and rosemary into 3-4 holes pierced into the sides of the meat.
- 2. Gently heat a generous glug of olive oil and the knob of butter in a large saucepan then fry the pork loin until golden brown on all sides.
- **3.** Add in the glass of white wine and deglaze the pan.
- **4.** Add in the stock and season to taste (if using a stock
 - cube don't add too much salt). Allow the pork loin to simmer for approximately 40 minutes, turning from time to time to ensure even cooking.
- **5.** Drain and rinse the cannellini beans and add to the pan and cook for a further 15 minutes.
- **6.** Remove the meat from the pan and set aside covered to keep it hot.
- Thinly slice the red onion (use a mandolin if you have one) and add to the beans.
- 8. Turn off the heat as the onion needs to be wilted rather than cooked.
- **9.** Slice the meat, arrange on a platter and cover with the beans, onion and juices.

Clophill & District Flower Club



A full hall greeted Glenis Smith's return to our club last month and on this occasion her title was 'As Time Goes By'.

The first design, accompanied by music from the 1950s, was arranged in a Fortnum & Mason basket hamper and took us back to those heady days. To a profusion of bare twigs and green garden foliage Glenis added yellow freesias, tulips in a variety of colours, mimosa and mini chrysanthemums.

Whilst arranging her second design on a black rectangular frame, Glenis explained how the 'Continental' design was made popular in Holland in the 1960s and how, mainly due to their lack of available foliage, the Dutch florists used every part of the flower. The flowers were arranged in vertical lines and, in order to cover the florist foam, Glenis used small sections of the offcut stems – just as the Dutch did.

Following this, she arranged a pedestal typical of the Sixties, with ferns, bamboo, conifer and variegated privet to which she added plum-coloured lilies, orange roses and bloom carnations. When completed, a separate linked arrangement was placed at the base.

We were shown how the Italians had influenced flower design in the 1980s when Glenis used curled phormium and aspidistra leaves as well as other garden foliage to provide the background for pink anthurium and stunning Phalaenopsis, the moth orchid – all arranged on a black urn.

Showing us an example of coloured florist foam, which has been available for some years but isn't favoured by all flower arrangers, Glenis used lime green blocks completing two small mirror-image raised designs with cream and green flowers and foliage. She included some aspidistra leaf manipulation along with

the green Anastasia chrysanthemums and pale green bloom carnations.



Finally, we saw the South African influence with a low horizontal design on an oval black container. Phormium, blue spruce and hard ruscus provided the base for pale pink flowering broom, purple liatrus, pink gerbera and pale pink tulips and Glenis finally added pale lilac roses aptly named Memory Lane.

News from CBC's Paul Downing

Last May I was elected as one of your three Central Bedfordshire, Ampthill Ward Councillors covering Clophill, Maulden and Ampthill. Councillors Mike Blair and Paul Duckett were both reelected too. The CBC duties that I undertake are separate to my role as one of the Clophill Parish Council, but I've tried to marry up my 'responsibilities'.

I report almost daily on what I'm doing using Facebook and Twitter and those of you who follow the Clophill Village, Clophill Grapevine and Clophill Parish Council Facebook pages will see what I've been up to on your behalf. This has included investigating why the village suffers such poor broadband connectivity as well as policing issues. I've also canvassed for a school crossing patrol person and managed to get the school 'crossing' paintwork refreshed to make it clearer.

As a CBC Councillor I sit on two main committees: 'Adult Social Care and Health' (with Cllr Duckett) – which includes a sub-group looking at the future of Bedford Hospital – and 'Audit' (with Chair Cllr Blair), which examines how CBC is held accountable for finances.

I also sit on the Bedfordshire Police & Crime Panel and the Fire Authority. Last month, on behalf of Clophill Parish I attended the Bedfordshire Police HQ for a briefing on Operation Salcoat. This is the name that the police have assigned to the actions and tasks required to develop the strategy for community policing in Bedfordshire's rural communities. The vision is to have seven operational teams spread across the county (our local one will be in Flitwick), which will be made up of full-time police, PCSOs and about 10 Specials.

To further engage the public, the Police and Maulden Parish Council hosted an open event in Maulden Village Hall on 20th February. These operational community policing teams will be mobile but working out of Flitwick and will concentrate on any area nearby where a police presence at any one time is most needed, and obviously that should include uniform patrols in Clophill. The event was held in Maulden because it's central in the Ampthill Ward but what was talked about was pertinent to the policing needs of Clophill. The Parish Council had the opportunity to attend and consider the opportunities presented.

To that end I'm also keen to re-launch Neighbourhood Watch in Clophill and will be working with Bedfordshire Police and our current NHW Street Coordinators in order to help us all feel even safer in what is already a pretty safe place. I will host a **Coordinators meeting** in the next few weeks and have booked the Methodist Hall for **Wednesday 6 April (7pm-9pm)** to seek out new 'recruits' – so all villagers are most welcome. Nearer the date I will update the Parish Noticeboard and Parish Council Website.

Clophill Parish Council

Notes from the Parish Council meeting held on 23rd February

This is a resume only of the meeting. The parish council minutes are published and can be found on the internet after they are authorised (approximately five weeks after the relevant meeting).

Clophill's Neighbourhood Plan

A 'Neighbourhood Plan' is defined by the Royal Town Planning Institute as a way 'communities can shape development in their area' – which would then 'become part of the Local Plan, with the policies contained within the neighbourhood plan used in the determination of planning applications'.

The creation of Clophill's neighbourhood plan (NP) started when Clophill Parish Council decided to try to give our village more say in its future – to preserve what we love about the village for the next generation. Much work has happened since then, but we've been conscious that since the village consultation the visibility of the NP working group's activity has been low – largely due to the time-heavy exercises of data-entry, analysis and interpretation. So we decided to set up a public event on January 19th 2016 to communicate to parishioners some highlights from the findings.

We were fortunate to have an expert volunteer in Eleanor Thornton-Firkin, who works for Ipsos-Mori, to present the data highlights. Eleanor took us on an entertaining journey through some of the key themes that had emerged from interpretation of the survey data. GP Mantini – the Cllr who is leading the NP working group – and Steve Rodell, who's been co-opted on to the parish council with a main focus on the NP, also contributed to the meeting to cover the principles of neighbourhood planning and its context within the 'National Planning Policy Framework'. We then held an event on the 16th February in the Methodist Church, looking at the NP in the context of the recent planning applications that have been submitted by developers in 'the Lakes' and 'Readshill' sites. The responses we've seen to the questionnaire we created, and the conversations we had at the event, have left us with no doubt that we're blessed with villagers who are passionate about the future of Clophill.

Despite the great initial response our data is heavily skewed so we've decided to extend the consultation with the hope that we may get more input from under-18s and over-65s (although we hope everyone responds). Please find a short consultation questionnaire in this copy of Spotlight. Your contribution will assist with our analysis being representative and meaningful.

It's been interesting how some of the data from last year's questionnaires has already been acted upon by the parish council. For example, we've been looking at increasing the council's online presence and are also looking at improved play equipment for local children as a direct response to an initial look at the survey responses. But with a formal neighbourhood plan, the council will have guidance as to how to spend 'Community Infrastructure Levy' monies for the optimal benefit of the village. The reason the questionnaire was so in-depth and wide-ranging was to allow us to collect views on a range of issues to also feed into in the parish plan.

Location: The former Fullers Earth Quarry, known as 'The Lakes Site'

Proposal: Outline planning for 90 houses on a site east of the Old Water Works,

Shefford Road. As most will know this site has a long history. The total site comprises of approximately 300 acres of land and lakes. Gallaghers recently purchased the site, engaged the village with a presentation at the Methodist Church and has now applied for

planning permission.

Gallaghers promised the Parish Council that if they backed the proposal they would: build only 90 houses on a 30-acre site; gift all of the land to become a nature reserve/country park; help restore lakes site for use by the public (these are some – not all – of the conditions). In the application submitted Gallaghers has mentioned placing land into trust but the actual application fails to demonstrate when, to whom and how the bulk of this land is going to be treated. In these circumstances, although the Parish Council has tried to get guarantees, the application in its present state fails to deliver on some of the most important aspects that were promised. In these circumstances the Parish Council has objected to the application in its current format.

The next Parish Council meeting will take place in the village hall at 7.45pm on Tuesday 29th March with a surgery at 7.30pm




