## **News from Clophill Heritage Trust**



#### The Old Church and Eco Lodges

Last month around 12 employees from Lockheed Martin, Ampthill, took part in a willow weaving day whereby teams of two or three were set to make willow panels for the lower part of the lodge units. Alongside other volunteers they received instruction from Guy Lambourne

of Wasseldine, Upper Gravenhurst, who deserves our thanks. Hazel sticks were used for the uprights and with the willow we learned 'double or paired weaving', free weaving, introducing extra willow, dealing with loose butts, going 'over and under' plus other skills. There was a distinct variation in team styles.

On Saturday 9th April a band of hardy souls, together with our warden Kayleigh, set off from the lodges on a **35k circular walk** taking in Shefford and Northill. This was a shortened version of the original planned walk to complete the whole Greensand Ridge over two days.

On Thursday 21st April a group of 26 Year 3 pupils from St Mary's Lower School spent part of the school day at The Lodges learning about its specific environment. This involved the use of a map to **navigate their way around the site** to solve clues and thus obtain an Ecopassport. The photo shows the pupils and staff waving their passports.

## **Former Clophill rector dies**

The funeral of the **Revd Swindells**, Clophill's rector from 1978-2000, was held in St Mary's Church last month and was attended by more than 100 friends and family. Father Philip, as he was known to everyone, died at the age of 82 after a short illness and after a Requiem Mass was buried with his first wife, Lorna, in the burial ground by the Old Church.

Father Philip was the last incumbent to live in the village and to be solely responsible for this parish, albeit that he served as Priest-in-Charge at Gravenhurst and Shillington in later years. He was a familiar figure cycling around the village, often stopping to chat with people he met.

He was a strong supporter of ecumenism – the coming together of the different Christian denominations – and was also deeply spiritual, introducing

periods of silence in his services, which some found uncomfortable at first. He was quite 'high church', known for using processions, bells and the occasional sprinkling of Holy Water. Father Philip also introduced the popular Candlelit Carol Service on Christmas Eve.

A frequent visitor to the school, Father Philip worked closely with both Mrs Roberts and Mrs Spurgeon and served for many years as Chair of Governors. He described his relationship with the school as the high point of his ministry here. His work with young people led him to set up a group called the Young Adventurers, which explored the Christian Faith whilst having fun.

But there was a lot more to Philip than his public persona. He had many and varied interests, including steam trains and beekeeping, and he played several instruments including the organ and the bassoon. He was also interested in technology and was one of the first people in the village to have a computer.

He enjoyed relaxing with friends, especially a good dinner with fine wine or malt whisky, and he liked a game of Mahjong. His light-hearted side is exemplified by the never-tobe-forgotten rendition of the Mikado's 'Three Little Maids from School', performed St. Trinian's style with John Langdon and Barry Inskip at a Harvest Supper in the Village Hall.

Father Philip will be sorely missed by his family and friends, and all of us in Clophill who held him in deep affection. We're pleased and privileged that he chose Clophill as his final resting place. *Adrienne Gordon*

We'd like to welcome Bobby, Chloe and Lucy to the Nursery and we hope they enjoy their time with us. We'd also like to say thank you to the Oldroyd family for their donation of a play house.



We've started our theme of 'Monkey Puzzle' and looked at this story and its animals as well as 'Noah's Ark', 'Smile Crocodile Smile' and 'Never Tickle a Tiger'. This has led to lots of talking about animals who went into the Ark, hygiene and keeping our teeth clean and healthy – as well as appropriate behaviour in different situations... e.g. it's not appropriate to tickle a tiger!

We've begun our transition sessions for the children entering Chestnut Class in September and the children seem to be enjoying their time in what will be their new class, joining in with PE, craft and phonic sessions. We've found that the children settle really well in September when they've had the extra time to get used to the environment, Mrs Paine and the different resources that will be available to them. We ensure there are some similarities between the two classes, familiar resources and we share the same theme too, both on the transition and in September. We'll be holding a short meeting in due course, talking about school readiness, and Mrs Bingley and Mrs Paine will also meet with the parents to answer any questions they may have.

Outside, the children all enjoyed seeing and holding some butterflies before setting them free and chasing them across the garden. The sunflower seeds the children planted are growing well and are nearly ready to plant out to grow up the fence. We'll be checking which is the tallest as they grow. Will one grow to be as tall as a giraffe?



#### Christine's quick 'n' easy recipe

Penne Rigate with fresh Tuna & Aubergines



#### **INGREDIENTS** Serves 4 people

- 400g penne rigate pasta
- 2 thick slices of fresh tuna (approx 300g)
- 1 medium aubergine
- 1 large clove of garlic, finely chopped
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- 1 tin crushed tomatoes
- small glass of dry white wine
- extra virgin olive oil
- salt & freshly ground black pepper
- vegetable oil for frying



- 1. Put a large pan of salted water on to boil.
- 2. Heat the vegetable oil in a frying pan over a moderate heat.
- 3. Top and tail the aubergine and cut into cubes.
- **4.** Fry the aubergine cubes until they're soft and golden. Drain on a piece of kitchen paper and set aside.
- **5.** Heat a glug of extra virgin olive oil in a large-bottom saucepan or frying pan and gently fry the finely chopped onion and garlic until they're tender but not browned.
- **6.** Cut the tuna into cubes and add to the onion and garlic, frying quickly until each side has been sealed.
- 7. Deglaze the pan with the white wine, then add in the tin of tomatoes.
- 8. Season to taste and cook for a further 15 minutes.
- **9.** Whilst the tuna dish is cooking boil the pasta for 9-10 minutes, or to your liking.
- **10.** Add the cooked aubergines into the sauce to warm through.
- 11. Once the pasta is cooked drain well and add into the sauce
- 12. Serve immediately.

## Clephill Prescheel News



*Hi everyone!* Another huge thank you to everyone who came to our most successful Easter Egg Hunt ever in March. It was a beautiful day and the hall and recreation ground were overflowing with families having a great time together. We hope you all saw the Wuzzle answers on our Facebook page – for those of you who got stuck on the answers!

We've noticed huge changes in many of our children

since they've come back from the Easter holidays. It's amazing how quickly they can develop and mature over a short space of time. This term we've started with our more focused group times and we can already see great progression from all our children. All **our teaching is done through play**. Even when we impart information to the children and show them how something works or tell them what something is we reinforce it with songs, rhymes, games, craft activities, outdoor play – in fact anything we think they'll have fun with and that also consolidates what we're teaching them.

In Green group we were focusing on number recognition and counting. The children were given a random card from 1-10 and asked if they knew the number. If they were unsure they could turn it over and count the objects on the other side to check, and they could also ask friends to help them. The children then got into a circle and swapped places with each other to put the numbers in order. To help consolidate our learning the children really enjoyed **singing number songs**. As we sang and said each number, I tried to choose the correct number card but sometimes I got it wrong – silly me – and the children were very good at noticing and telling me which one I should have had. By the end, we were all exhausted and laughing our socks off...and just a little bit better at numbers.

I'm sure everyone would agree that we all learn much better if we're enjoying ourselves and we find one of the things that makes the children have fun and join in more is if we, the adults, are prepared to get down to their level, join in and ultimately not be afraid to

make fools of ourselves. This is why when we choose our staff it's not just about their capability as Preschool Practitioners but also about their ability to get down and play with the children and build a rapport. Equally important is the relationship our staff have with our children's families and indeed with each other. We have a very strong team and we think that's one of the things that makes our setting so fantastic.



If you have a child under-5, whether at out Preschool or not, why not pop along to one of our **monthly coffee mornings**. We have one on 10th May, Tuesday 14th June and Monday 4th July starting at 9.15am. It's a great opportunity to meet people and chat.

## **Clophill Parish Council**

#### Notes from the Parish Council meeting held on 26th April

This is a resume only of the meeting. The parish council minutes are published and can be found on the internet after they are authorised (approximately five weeks after the relevant meeting).

On Tuesday 26th April Clophill Parish Council (CPC) hosted its Annual Parish Meeting in the village hall. There were around 25 people present to offer their views and share their successes and stories, in what was a thoroughly pleasant gathering.

Following a welcome address from our Chairman, Cllr Peter Clarke, Cllr Roland Browne reported on CPC finances. He informed those present that the balance capital fund at the end of March 2016 was £31,132, and spoke of the **plans to invest in street lighting**, the play area in the rec, and the Methodist Church roof in this present financial year. Roland also confirmed that the council wasn't changing its precept value this year.

Cllr Ralph Brough reported on his work in the last year on both Highways and street lights. Ralph spoke about some of the council's hopes for improvements for pedestrians around The Green, and expressed his disappointment about some of the inconsiderate **car parking near the Post Office**, which has caused local buses problems in the last year.

Cllr Paul Downing reported on local policing. He also revealed that Helen Rodell has been chosen as the **new Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator** for Clophill following a meeting last month.

Cllr Terry Lee reported on recent improvements to communications from CPC, highlighting the launch of a **CPC Facebook page** as a particular strong point.

We also had a recreation report from Cllr Louise Hodge, who has recently been focusing on looking into **new play equipment** for the children of the village. Louise kindly created a display at the back of the room for villagers to view.

Cllr Giles Warner updated the meeting with his allotment report, letting us know about the variety of different tenants he has worked with. Giles also commented on how much he had enjoyed his role at CPC since being voted on in May 2015.

We then heard a **Neighbourhood Plan** (NP) report from GP Mantini. GP mentioned that the steering group is always looking for more villagers to help with aspects of the plan, and that anyone interested should email *clophillneighbourhoodplan@gmail.com* 

During the meeting there were questions and points raised about a number of topics, from traffic-calming measures to the age of councillors! We appreciated hearing from everyone present, and we hope the answers we gave showed how transparent we are as a council.

There were also updates from several Clophill organisations, including Clophill United Charities, St Mary's Church, Clophill Utd FC and Clophill Toddler Group. Hearing about the work undertaken by these organisations in the last 12 months helped not just councillors but also the villagers present to understand what activities are taking place in our parish. We're delighted they took the evening out to speak with us.

Full minutes from the meeting will be made available in due course.

Unrelated to the meeting, a huge thank you to Adrienne and the team behind Clophill's 'Clean For The Queen' litter picking campaign, which took place on Saturday 2nd April.
