Bob Parker-Eaton

21st November 1931 - 13th September 2014

The following extract is taken from a reading, courtesy of Audrey Brand, on the occasion of the service of thanksgiving for Bob's life, at Clophill church on 30th September 2014.

Bob was the eldest son of Leonard and Phyllis, born in Birmingham in 1931, and he grew up during the Second World War in and around

Kings Norton and Solihull. His grandfather had founded and run the Bodill Parker foundry just north of Birmingham. Bob went to school at Shirley College, excelling in English, History

and Geography as well as in rugby and athletics.



At the age of 18, he was called up for **National Service in the RAF** and was selected for officer training, going on to make a career in Air Movements. He worked in Gibraltar, New York, Aden and Virginia as well as in the UK, **rising to the rank of Wing Commander**. As he was about to be promoted to Group Captain he chose a new career, leaving the RAF to work for Britannia Airways, starting as Controller of Customer Services and rising to Deputy MD before retiring in 2004. He used his knowledge, experience and connections to lobby on behalf of the British airline industry in both Westminster and Brussels.

Throughout all of this Bob had the loving support of Dorothy.

They were married in 1962 and went on to have three children, Stephen, Sarah and Tim.

Dorothy and Bob celebrated their Golden Wedding in 2012.

For most of his life Bob **pursued his love of swimming**. He represented both the RAF and the Combined Services in swimming and water polo as well as coaching at the Barracuda Club in Virginia. Until recently Bob rose at 6.30am in order to be at Hitchin Pool for the early session.

On retiring, he pursued a passion for local issues, managing Planning and Planning applications for Clophill with thoroughness and diplomacy.

What these facts don't reflect, and what Bob didn't talk about, was that he had had a very distinguished career. In 1966, he was awarded the MBE for his part in the evacuation of civilian and military personnel from Aden. Then in 1987 **he was awarded the OBE for Services to the Aviation Industry**. In 1981, he was made a Fellow of the British Institute of Management, in 1991 a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Transport and, in 1997, a Fellow of the Royal Aeronautical Society.

Bob also loved socializing. As well as entertaining family and friends, he threw himself into dreaming up costumes for Peter and Vaughan's annual fancy dress parties. Each year Bob and Dorothy would host a carol concert at their home, and after years of badgering, the singers performed Silent Night in German, much to Bob's delight. Bob also thoroughly enjoyed his time on the men's table at Tea and Chat at the Methodist Church.

Bob approached every endeavor with determination, honesty and passion, but above everything else was his love, commitment and belief in his family. He was a fun dad who had a passion for icecream! Although he'd been unwell for a while, death came suddenly and peacefully for Bob.

Clophill Preschool News



Hello everyone

So Halloween and Bonfire Night are over and Christmas is getting closer. The children are enjoying the changing seasons as we go out in rain, wind and even sunshine! As usual we continue to develop our setting to give our children the best opportunities for learning. We're very happy to see more and more children and their families joining us up at the village hall.

Children come to our Preschool as skilled learners – think of all they have achieved in their first two years. But for each child to reach their full potential we need to have a real understanding of their interests, needs and experiences. As Keyworkers, and with parents as partners, we're able to foster strong bonds with each child. Once a child feels **secure and settled in their environment** the doors to learning are unlocked. As the children engage in activities and games within the setting, underpinning this play is very careful planning tailored to the development of each individual child. We, the teachers, are the most important element of the children's learning as we watch, engage and extend their learning through this play.

We follow the Early Years Foundation Stage document: the Government framework that supports children through the important milestones from birth to the end of Reception Year. As some of our children get nearer to starting their Reception Year we focus on those elements that they'll need to take that next step in education. We plan their play to be more focused; **encouraging their listening skills** to develop phonic awareness, developing their mark making into emergent writing and extending their understanding of number and counting. We aim to ensure that our children are confident and keen in their abilities so that when they take that next step up into the more structured setting of their Reception year they

have the tools and the confidence to flourish.



A little more about what we've been up to since the last edition. In October we **collected food for the Harvest Festival**. Thank you again to those of our parents who contributed – we donated the food to the Church collection. We also **celebrated Diwali** (the Festival of Light), with the children making clay divas and decorating them with paint and clitter. We've visited



the allotments and washed the carrots that were freshly pulled up by the kind lady harvesting her vegetables. We've been exploring Autumn and made pictures from the fallen leaves we collected. While doing all these great activities and more, we've been settling in lots of new children and getting to know their families.

An extra huge **thank you** to everyone who supported us for our **Macmillan Coffee morning**, particularly Clophill Toddlers, and to all those of you who made cakes and ate cakes! We made a fantastic total of £104.50!

Crime and Punishment

When John Howard became High Sheriff of Bedfordshire in 1773 he was shocked to discover the condition of prisoners at Bedford Gaol, which had become his responsibility. This started a life-time obsession with visiting and recording the conditions in gaols throughout the UK and continental Europe.

Before the establishment of the Bedfordshire Constabulary in 1840 villages like Clophill had a Parish Constable who was appointed each year by the Parish Overseers. It was an unpaid post with a wide range of responsibilities. As well as the apprehension of offenders and taking them before the magistrates, the Constable had to organise the Militia Muster, act as the Coroner's Officer, organise watches and searches, supervise beggars, vagrants and others in distress passing through the parish, and organise the survey of those liable for tax as well as collect it. It was an arduous job with penalties for failing to execute the duties properly.

With the lack of a proper constabulary, it was down to individuals to prosecute offenders. This could be expensive so, in an attempt to prosecute more criminals, **Associations for the Prosecution of Felons** were set up. Potential prosecutors banded together in order to insure individual members against the financial burdens of going to court including the costs of hiring lawyers. Silsoe and Ampthill Association for Prosecuting Felons' first meeting was at the George Inn, Silsoe, on Friday 3rd October 1823. Gentlemen residing within eight miles of Silsoe or Ampthill could become members. Twelve people from Clophill joined, including the Rector, who was obviously keen to see criminals brought to justice.

On the edge of The Green is **the Lockup and Pound**. This was built in 1851 by magistrate Captain Moore of Maulden Cottage who was a Justice of the Peace as well as a naval officer. Criminals would be held in the lockup until charged and fined or transferred to the prison in Bedford. Stray animals were put in the pound, and their

owners had to pay a fine to get them back. There is a record in the 1814 Quarter Sessions Rolls of a 'breach of the peace in the said parish of Clophill; for that the said James Odell did, with force and violence, break open the pound there, where his ass was impounded for trespass. Sentence: 10 Days in the gaol and fined one shilling'.

The present **Bedford Prison** was officially opened on 18th June 1801. The local Records Office holds the Bedfordshire Gaol Register for the period 1801-1901 which gives the details

of the criminals, along with their crime and punishment, detained at the prison. It can be accessed online. There are 275 Clophill residents listed. Here is a selection of the records:-

- 1820 Robert Head, 68, Sheep Stealing, Death reprieved, 12 Calendar Months Hard Labour.
- 1821 James Lincoln, 14, and Joseph Clarke, 14, Destroying a fence, 3 Days and to be whipped.
- 1831 Mary Clark, 25, Lewd Woman, 1 Year Hard Labour
- 1849 Joseph Hyde, 48, Stealing a Spade, 1 Calendar Month Hard Labour
- 1853 John Mitchell, 32, Deserting his family, 7 Days Hard Labour
- 1844 Robert Appleby, 19, of Clophill, and William Peat, 19, of Maulden. Cutting and destroying fruit trees and shrubs, 14 Years and 7 Years transportation respectively.

These last pair of entries in the Gaol Register give the basic details of their crime and extreme punishment. Other sources fill in the details...

At the 1844 Easter Quarter Sessions, Robert Appleby and William Peat were charged with having maliciously cut, damaged and destroyed a quantity of trees in the grounds of Capt. Moore's house in Hall End, Maulden. Capt. Moore was away in the Royal Navy and the property was looked after by Francis Read who found the damage to a range of trees and bushes in the garden. The accused had been to the Flying Horse, and later Constable Vincent Dogget found them at the Compasses. They had knives on them and a freshly cut stick. The pattern of their shoes matched footprints found in Capt. Moore's garden. With this evidence they were found guilty. Unfortunately for Robert Appleby, he had been in trouble twice before, once when Capt. Moore was the Justice of the Peace.

Why such severe punishments were proscribed for Appleby and Peat is hard to understand. Robert Appleby was sent to Van Dieman's Land (Tasmania) on the vessel *William Jardine*. It's not known if he returned after he had served his time there. Ten months, later William Peat set sail for Van Dieman's Land on the *Marion* but died on the voyage on the 13 September 1845.

The punishments administered in the nineteenth century may seem extreme but, as there was no effective police force whose presence may have deterred criminals, it was hoped that the punishment would.

News from Clophill Heritage Trust

The Old Church

On the evening of Tuesday 7th October, the Bedfordshire branch of The Campaign to Protect Rural England (CPRE) announced the winners of its annual 'Living Countryside Awards' at Moggerhanger Park. The **Clophill Heritage Trust won the highest award in its category** -'Building Design and Restoration' – for work done to consolidate and open up the old church, including the installation of a new steel staircase and observation tower allowing visitors 360



degree views of the landscape. The photo shows our Chairman John Wright being presented with the CPRE Mark by HM Lord-Lieutenant of Bedfordshire, Helen Nellis. This has also been followed by winning an Angel award in the Andrew Lloyd Webber competition.

On a less pleasant note, the newly installed and dressed stonework to the Tower entrance was severely damaged on the night of Sunday 5th October when a group of (some eight) **vandals ripped out the steel gate** securing the entrance to the tower staircase at ground level. Why someone should want to cause damage to such beautiful new architecture is sad to say the least.

In the meantime, there's **every chance that the offenders can be identified and caught** in which case both we and English Heritage, who were the major funders of the project, fully intend to prosecute. We're grateful to our local police partnership for their support with increased and vigilant patrols.

Eco lodges

The sloping site to the front of the lodges has undergone further landscaping (with funding from the Rank Foundation), courtesy of Clophill-based ground workers **Hayden Pool** and his employees. They've also laid an attractively designed path in 'Raisby' material and four large locally sourced Greensand stones to act as markers for car parking. Their work included sewing of grass seed on the 'tilled' soil and extensive track improvements to Old Church Path. At the same time **Andy Gardener**, also Clophill based, has virtually completed installation of the timber decking surrounding the individual lodges.

When you're out and about in Clophill keep an eye out for Sophie and her adorable dog Sky – as they could be stars of the future. Last month, two-year old Sky auditioned for the part of Toto in Biggleswade Amateur Theatrical Society's production of The Wizard of Oz, narrowly missing out on the winning role.

'We were at a dog show in Biggleswade and they told us about the Toto auditions, which were happening the following week,' says Sophie. 'We turned up on the day and Sky had

to perform a series of tricks in front of the judges. One thing he had to do was go and get a sausage off a stick, eat it then come straight back to me. Sky did it brilliantly, whereas all the other dogs were hunting around trying to find more sausages!'

Sky may not be getting his name in lights just yet, but Sophie's goal is for the two of them to appear on Britain's Got Talent, which was won two years ago by girl-and-dog act Ashleigh and Pudsey.

'We practise a lot,' says Sophie. 'We do tricks indoors most evenings and also when we walk around Clophill. Sky knows over 50 tricks now. At the moment he's learning to balance on my feet

while I lie on the floor with my legs in the air.'

Sky wasn't phased by being in the spotlight, however. 'I was the one who was nervous, not him,' admits Sophie. 'They showed us on a huge projector and when Sky saw himself on the screen he stopped to look at himself, which made the audience laugh.'

Sophie will be going to watch The Wizard of Oz when it's out in January, as her best friend Megan's

dog, Robbie, will be playing the part of Toto. The producers have also invited Sophie and Sky along to rehearsals in case they need an understudy. So watch this space, Simon Cowell!

Let's talk about Charity Donations

with Sally Cobban





There are always some great dos going on locally to help raise money for charity, so this month I thought I'd chat about the tax consequences of giving to charity.

If you personally give money to charity and opt to do this through gift aid this is very tax efficient for the charity receiving the money. It means they can claim back the basic rate of tax from the government for the donations they receive.

If you do a tax return and you're a higher rate tax payer then you can add your charitable donations that you've

made through gift aid on your tax return. They affect your tax as they extend the basic rate band at which you pay tax – so push some of your income out of the 40% bracket back into the 20% bracket. So if you've had a high-income year and want to do something to reduce your tax then giving to charities under gift aid is a tax-efficient solution. It's also one of the only things that you can carry back to the previous year on a personal tax return to reduce tax in the prior year.

Limited companies can make charitable donations and they can be tax deductible if the following conditions are met. For donations to qualify, any benefits provided to your company or a 'connected' person in connection with the donation must be below the following limits:

Benefit Limits for Donations

Amount of Donation Maximum Value of Benefits

£0-£100 25% of the donation

£101-£1,000 £25

£1,001+ 5% of the donation up to a max of £2,500

Any gifts to charity that come with any conditions about repayment won't be allowable, or any gifts that come with a benefit received above the amounts above won't be allowable.

Christine's quick 'n' easy recipe Pot Roast Pork with Chesnuts



INGREDIENTS Serves 4 as a main course

- 1kg rolled pork loin
- 1 large clove of garlic
- a splash of extra virgin olive oil
- 1 medium onion
- 25ml or shot glassful of dark rum
- 2 fresh bay leaves

- salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 150ml or small glass of dry white wine
- 150ml of milk
- knob of butter
- 25 chestnuts, peeled and cooked
- 2 ladles of hot water
- **1.** Peel and slice the onion and garlic very thinly.
- 2. Heat the extra virgin olive oil and knob of butter over a medium heat.
- **3.** Braise the loin of pork, onions and garlic until the pork is nice and brown on all sides.
- **4.** Add in the rum and then the white wine and cook until they've evaporated.
- **5.** Add the bay leaves, water and milk, and season to taste.
- **6.** Cover and cook over a medium heat for 30 minutes.
- **7.** Roughly chop the cooked chestnuts (there should be good large pieces) then add these to the pork and simmer for a further 30 minutes.
- **8.** Remove the pork from the pan and thinly slice.
- 9. Meanwhile reduce the juices to obtain a thick sauce.


Serve the meat covered with the sauce, accompanied by new potatoes or a hearty mash.

Neighbourhood Watch: Winter Security

With the dark winter nights arriving, now's the time to check your home and personal security. The Police have issued the following simple, but effective, advice to help residents keep their homes, vehicles and property safe:

- Double lock UPVC doors by lifting the handle before you turn the key.
- Make sure alarms are fitted and serviced and **security lighting** is in good working order.
- Bolt side entrances, check boundary fences are secure and make sure your gates are kept locked.
- If you must leave a downstairs fanlight open, fit **window limiters**.
- If you're out in your garden make sure your doors and windows remain locked.
- If you're going out at night or are going out during the day and won't be home until after dark – leave a light on and a radio tuned in to a talk radio station.
- Security mark your property with products like Smartwater.
- Find out about Neighbourhood Watch and what it can do for you.
- **NEVER leave money in your home** always put in the bank. Also consider keeping your most precious jewellery in the bank.
- Never leave your vehicle unlocked. Always remove any items from your vehicle when you leave it and if your vehicle is fitted with an alarm, please use it.

Please **check on your older or vulnerable neighbours**. Remember they can get a free security check and home improvements from the Bobby Van team which is supported by the Bedfordshire Police Partnership Trust and Bedfordshire Police. Help is also available through Clophill Community Care who can help with the supply of door chains and door peep holes that they would fit, on request. **Ring their helpline on 07791773705**



Be vigilant, if you see any suspicious activity, persons, or vehicles you can contact the Police on their non-emergency number 101. Or in the case of emergency call 999.

Notes from the Annual Parish Council meeting held on 28th October 2014

Readers are reminded that this is a resume only of the meeting. The parish council minutes are published and can be found on the internet after they are authorised (approximately five weeks after the relevant meeting).

Public Question Time

There was one public question regarding the emergency public access defibrillator at The Post Office on The Green. It concerned possible training for villagers and perhaps setting up a list of people within the village as an emergency response. This was discussed and the parish council will try to arrange a training session for those who are interested. After this has been completed, an emergency response 'team' of people will be assembled to be contacted in the event of this equipment having to be used.

Police Report

Bedfordshire Police submitted a report showing that crime in general is low for the past month. With the darker nights, though, don't forget to keep your home doors locked, and to put your vehicles on your drive or in the garage (if you have one). Remember, Bedfordshire Police can help with crime prevention information should you require it.

The Lands Committees

A tour of the village has been completed and a report has been made both to our contractor and to Bedfordshire Highways concerning a number of **faulty lights**. Hopefully they will be repaired shortly. In addition, poor surfaces to some of our pavements and pot holes in our roads have also been reported. As a parish council we're keeping up the pressure on CBC to have remedial work done.

At last UK Power Networks will commence the work of diverting the power cables on **the old footbridge** at The Green. Once this has been completed the bridge can be removed.

Our thanks go to Jane Breed and her team who have planted a huge amount of **daffodil bulbs** at The Green. We're also indebted to Michael Robotham for the purchase of the plants. Next spring should be a real delight on entering the village when these bulbs come into flower.

The parish council has been informed that the whole of **the lakes site**, to the south of the village, has been sold by Evonik to Gallagher's (a national builder) who at the moment are one of the principal contractors for Wixam's. The parish council will make contact with the senior management to discuss the future of this site.

Mr Trevor Barker has been contracted to clear **the village burial ground** of brambles and weeds. He'll also cut back the high laurel hedging.

The deed of easement for **Hay Close** (tenanted parish land) has now been agreed and signed, and we're waiting for completion by solicitors.

The council unanimously agreed. This charity works behind the scenes in the village to provide financial help to those who need it. It doesn't publicise what it does for obvious and good reasons. The parish council would here like to publicly thank the charity and the trustees for the good work they do in our community.

Planning

No planning applications were received during the previous month.

A PERSONAL NOTE FROM THE CHAIRMAN



I've been writing these notes in Spotlight for the past few years, even though the official minutes of our meetings are published on the internet. They are, of course, just a resume.

Those of us who live in Clophill and the near surrounding area take pride in our village, its tranquillity, beauty and safety. The parish council's role is as the first tier of local government and is here to protect, develop and ensure the many things we take for granted continue – for example, that the street lights work, our open spaces are pleasant, the grass and hedges are maintained and the infrastructure reaches a certain standard. The parish council is also the liaison between our unitary council and indeed central government. It has an input regarding planning and protecting the conservation village and our historic sites. During the past few years it has also submitted evidence in writing and verbally to four public enquiries.

The parish council meets on ten occasions during the year. It levies a precept and uses that money and money from rents and grants to provide the services needed. Through good housekeeping, over the last nearly six years the precept has been held without increase but services have been maintained and expanded.

Next year marks the elections for the parish council. All of the ten seats available will be subject to be applied for and applicants elected by parishioners. I'm already in receipt of information that some of our councillors will not seek re-election next year. The village needs and must have a keen parish council. There are several major issues that need to be carefully monitored, including what will happen to the Lakes Site now that a major national developer has bought the whole site.

I'd like to invite anyone who's interested to contact me, the parish clerk or indeed any parish councillor to discuss becoming a parish councillor (phone numbers are on the 'Useful Numbers' page). Alternatively, if you're not sure about the role,

in the first instance you might want to become a co-opted member and help until you have a better understanding. In this way we can try to put into place a succession plan to ensure continuity of business next year.

This village has a great future that must be protected but it won't reach its full potential without the assistance and intervention of those who live here. The worst case scenario is that not enough councillors will be elected in 2015; if this happens the village could become directly controlled by Central Bedfordshire Council with no local voice in decisions being made. **Apathy is our biggest enemy.**






