Clophill through the years

The Dreaded Workhouse

Since Elizabethan times there have been laws (known as the Old Poor Laws) requiring parishes to supply relief to parishioners who were destitute. There were two types of relief: outdoor relief and indoor relief. With outdoor relief, the poor lived in their own homes and were given either money or food and clothes. In contrast, recipients of indoor relief were required to enter a workhouse or poorhouse where they could be fed and clothed.

The law required each parish to elect two **Overseers** of the Poor. The post holders were unpaid and acted under the supervision of local JPs. Their duties included setting the Poor Rate and collecting

it from property owners (rate payers). They then used the money to relieve the poor by giving them either money or food or admitting them to a suitable institution (Indoor relief).

The **Deserving Poor**, who were unable to work due to infirmity, injury or old age, would be taken into the local almshouse or the parish workhouse. The ill would be admitted to the hospital and orphans would be taken into an orphanage if available.


The **Undeserving Poor**, who were fit for work but wouldn't, would be taken into the workhouse where they would be set to work on hard tasks such as breaking stones or picking oakum. Oakum-picking was the teasing out of fibres from old ropes and was very hard on the fingers. The loose fibres were then sold to ship-builders for caulking or packing the joints of timbers in wooden vessels. This treatment was to encourage them back to paid employment.

In Clophill, according to Mary Phillips, author of *The Clophill Story (1988)*, "the old workhouse stood next to the house which up till some thirty years ago was the New Inn". (The New Inn was at 120 High Street).

In 1777 a government report, "Abstracts of the Returns Made by the Overseers of the Poor", counted **20 paupers in the Clophill Workhouse**.

In 1832 a Royal Commission into the Operation of the Poor Laws found that the old system was badly and expensively run and so the Poor Law Amendment Act (known as the New Poor Law) was passed in 1834. The Act was intended to impose both order and conformity and reduce the costs of poor relief. Parishes were grouped together in Unions and a central workhouse was built to serve the union.

The Cedars in Dunstable Street, Ampthill, was built as the **Ampthill Union Workhouse** in 1836 to house the 469 paupers from 19 parishes, including Clophill. The architect was James Clephane who was also the architect of the new Wrest Park House built during

the same period. The censuses show that there were less than a hundred inmates until 1911 when the number rose to 147, possibly because the Woburn workhouse was closed and its inmates moved to Ampthill. Why such an oversized workhouse was built is not known.

With the new act, outdoor relief was stopped and the destitute had to enter the workhouse to get relief. It was felt that outdoor relief was abused by the able bodied.

People entered the workhouse for many reasons including old age, illness, extreme poverty, pregnancy and, in the case of

children, becoming orphaned. As soon as they entered the workhouse, husbands, wives and older children were separated and lived in separate areas. The Undeserving Poor (the idlers who wouldn't work) were kept away from the Deserving Poor as it was thought that they would corrupt them.

The standard of living was kept below that of the poorest independent labourer to encourage the able bodied to leave and start work. The intention was that only the truly destitute would seek relief.

The stopping of Outdoor Relief was widely opposed and **led to riots, including one in the Ampthill area in May 1835**.

Although the workhouse was feared it did provide better accommodation than most agricultural labourers' cottages and a slightly better diet, but still very basic and monotonous (gruel). The inmates received free health care and the children were found work, often apprenticeships.

For example, the following appears in the Ampthill Union records for 14th September 1871: "**David GUDGIN lately an inmate of the Workhouse of the Ampthill Union**, a poor child of the parish of Clophill, aged 13 years, apprenticed to George TUCKLEY of Lane Head near Wolverhampton, co. Stafford, lock manufacturer, for the term of 8 years. Premium – the said child being provided with an outfit. The father of the above named apprentice has deserted him and his mother is dead."

Tracing his history in the censuses it can be seen that in 1861 he lived with his parents and four older siblings at 54 Back Street, Clophill. In 1871 he was a pauper inmate at Ampthill Union workhouse. Having taken up the apprenticeship, in 1881, aged 22, he is boarding at Lane Head and his occupation is given as Locksmith. In 1891 he's married with three children and is still a locksmith. By 1901, his family has increased to six children and one of his sons also has the occupation of lock maker. In the last census of 1911 he has seven living children (one died) most of them working in the locksmith industry.

So for David Gudgin (Gudgeon) going to the workhouse changed his life for the better.

News from Clophill Heritage Trust



As you can see from the photo opposite, scaffolding is now up and in place around St. Mary's Old church ruin, ready for the stonemasons to commence their skilful restoration and consolidation works. Some underpinning may be necessary to provide additional support for the foundations and stone buttresses. Also, the church tower and staircase will be strengthened and made safe to accommodate visitors who will be able to access a new viewing platform.

The site, which is currently fenced off for safety purposes, should be ready for re-opening in the spring of 2014.

In the meantime, across the west side of old church path, fitting out works are continuing on the five timber ecolodges. The frontages of each lodge will be 'dressed' with a low drystone wall and as part of our Heritage Building Skills programme a three-day course in the art of dry stone walling was arranged for the week beginning Monday 23rd September. This involved local adults and schoolchildren from Redborne School, Ampthill. Unfortunately, local greensand stone isn't appropriate for this kind of work as it's difficult

to cut into thin shapes, so we went as near to home as we could with Norfolk stone. The works were arranged in conjunction with Matthew Willars, tutor at Bedford College, and Martin Fildes, stonemason from Riverdalestone.

A taste of the Mediterranean

Looks as if it's time to pack away the barbecue and get out the stew pans. The recipe that I would like to share with you this month can be eaten on a warm day with a side salad or can be warming and hearty with the addition of mashed potatoes, rice or polenta.



BOCCONCINI DI TACCHINO ALLA MEDITERRANEA (Turkey casserole Mediterranean style)

- 400g turkey escalopes
- 50g green pitted olives 100g chopped peeled plum tomatoes
- 50g plain flour for dusting
- 2 cloves of garlic
- 1tsp salted capers
- 400ml dry white wine
- pinch of chilli flakes

- dried oregano
- extra virgin olive oil
- salt & freshly ground black pepper
- 1. Cut the turkey into pieces and toss them in the seasoned flour.
- **2.** Peel and finely chop the garlic and put in a pan with 4tbsp of olive oil. Fry gently until translucent but not browned.
- **3.** Add in the rinsed capers, roughly chopped olives, chopped tomatoes, chilli flakes and a pinch of dried oregano, and season to taste.
- **4.** Simmer for about 5 mins for the flavours to absorb each other then add in the pieces of turkey. Cook for a further 10 mins, stirring from time to time.
- 5. Add in the white wine and sieve in the flour in which you previously tossed the turkey.
- 6. Stir well and keep it on a low heat until you have a nice thick sauce.

On 5th September, members and visitors were entertained by Rencha Naidoo, whose beautiful arrangements took us through 'Life Begins with Flowers'. Rencha was born





in India and came to England aged three, and the colours in her arrangements reflected her origins.

Her arrangements spanned birth to silver wedding. For 'Birth', four small vases were adorned with cream gerbera, hydrangea, stocks and roses, along with pearl beads, pink or blue ribbon and various greenery.

Next came 'the Bat Mitzvah', the Jewish ceremony for girls coming of age at 12, with pale mauve calla lilies and purple snap dragons wired round a saucer-shaped

dish. This was followed by **'The Teenage Years'**, depicted by a confusion of dog wood, contorted willow and purple birch

wrapped in lime green chicken netting with aluminium wire interwoven with tree ivy. Gloriosa orchids, red tipped with yellow, were placed randomly throughout into tubes wrapped with string. The finished arrangement reminded us of how our daughter's bedroom may have looked.

For the 'Valentine Engagement,' Rencha arranged red ginger lilies, green carnations and anthuriums with laurel and cordeline leaves together with a silver heart and a very large diamond set into a red vase. Meanwhile, **'The Wedding'** was a crescent-shaped burst of colour with orange and yellow roses, purple veronica, pink-tipped white dahlias, orange chrysanthemums, purple zinnia together with variegated tree ivy, hebi, soft ruskis and eucalyptus.

And finally, the 'Silver Wedding' – painted silver twigs set into a silver urn containing green spider chrysanthemums, slipper orchards, snap dragons, green and pink cymbidium orchard, shaped aspidistra leaves, fountain grass and fatsia.

Clophill Parish Council

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting held on 24th September 2013

(Readers are reminded that these notes are a resume only, official minutes are available both on the internet and notice boards. All official correspondence should be sent to the parish clerk and not individual councillors.)

Public Question Time

- There were several questions from members of the public. The first was regarding the missing speed (repeater) restriction sign on the Shefford Road. This had been removed some time ago. The parishioner was informed that the Highways Department of CBC will be contacted with a request to have it reinstated as soon as possible.
- Three members of the public asked what was happening to 'The Lake's Site'. They were informed that the parish council's position is clear until we have the conditions met, as required by a resolution at July's Parish Council meeting, no further action is envisaged (these conditions were published in Spotlight last month).
- There was one further question about an application for planning approval for a dwelling to the east of the village in Shefford Road. The policy of the parish council, the villager was informed, is that generally the parish council is against such applications that are outside the village settlement envelope. In addition, this particular matter would be discussed later in the meeting because it was an application made by a parish councillor. (See the notes on planning for a resume of the discussion/decision).

Police Report

The council received a report from Bedfordshire Police regarding crime within the village. Overall there appears to be a pleasing decline in all types of offences but, with the longer dark nights fast approaching, the message is always worth repeating – keep your homes secure and ensure that garages and outbuilding are kept locked. If you see something suspicious, phone the police immediately. You can get free impartial advice on all crime prevention matters from Bedfordshire Police.

Vacancy for Parish Councillor

- Grant Walford, a resident of the village, has applied and been accepted as a new parish councillor for Clophill. The parish council extends a warm welcome and looks forward to working with him in the future.
- Ali Bradbury submitted her resignation from the parish council. Ali is also Chair of the Clophill Parish Action Group and under her guidance the village has benefitted enormously. The Chairman thanked Ali for all her efforts on behalf of the village and was pleased to note that she would continue with her role at the CPA. Of course this resignation means that there is another vacancy on the council. If you'd like to be considered for this position, please contact the parish clerk Lyn Lyman.

The Lands Committees

- Our lighting contractor is currently completing remedial work to the street lights in The Causeway to provide better lighting.
- Within the village, Bedfordshire Highways Department will undertake a survey of trees that are having a detrimental effect on street lighting. They can take action to remove offending branches if necessary, without consultation with the tree owners.
- The parish council is aware of the poor state of some of the roadways within the village. The Highways Engineer has been informed for repair work to be completed.

The Village Hall

The installation of the new solar panels has taken place at the village hall. The parish council, as agreed, has paid the £2,500 as a grant towards this equipment to the village hall committee.

Footpath 4

After the parish council objected to the closure order on this footpath (which runs to the north of the village) a consultation is to take place between interested parties.

The Old Church site

The work on both the new buildings and the old church tower are almost complete and the parish council congratulates the Heritage Trust and all who have worked on the project for their achievement. It's hoped that the wardens will take up residence shortly. Due to the spate of recent vandalism, a request for help with the costs of security was requested. As this was for a limited time, and to ensure the security of the site, the parish council agreed to assist with a grant.

Using the same footprint and, as far as possible, the same appearance (ie wood cladded) the proposal is, effectively, to construct a spacious, three-bedroomed dwelling with a large kitchen/ diner and study, play room, boot room, en-suites, dressing room, all within the present area. The building is outside the village settlement envelope and approval would risk the village being further extended along Shefford Road towards Beadlow. By converting the 'agricultural' land to 'garden' lays open the opportunity for significant housing development on the site, not possible under the 'agricultural' classification. From the conservation viewpoint, development damages important views of the Old Church. The village need is for more 'affordable' housing, rather than 'executive'-type to preserve balance. **OBJECT, STRONGLY**






