## Come into the Garden

### with Kate Gardner

I'm often asked what do gardeners do in the winter? These dormant months are the best time to work on the framework of the garden to get it in great shape ready for the spring. Winter gardening work includes shrub regeneration, bare root planting and soil preparation and general

renovation and clearance – doing all the big jobs that you haven't had time to do during the summer or autumn.

For me that means tackling the overgrown mature ivy that is threatening to reclaim the garage and repositioning the greenhouse and compost bins. While I don't want to totally remove the ivy it will need some serious regeneration.

Have you ever seen a hedge that is all woody underneath with a thin layer of greenery on its domed top? Regular hedge trimming will keep a shrubs surface shape, but the woody stems will thicken and harden over time. These look ugly and may eventually result in unnecessary deterioration of the plant. Hedge regeneration involves either pruning out the old stems and/ or pruning back all branches to encourage fresh shoots in spring. The extent of the pruning will depend on how it has been pruned in the past or vary with species. Roses are an example of a plant that benefits from regeneration (see previous articles on pruning roses). I will be using this same technique on the Ivy and the shrubs in the border which have got a little too big for the space.

We have lots of deciduous trees in the village and these are still dropping their leaves. It's important to keep clearing up the leaves in your garden as this helps to reduce diseases. Decomposing leaves and other debris on hard standing will supply enough nutrients for weeds to self seed in cracks, grow and then spread. They can also make paths slippery. Decomposed leaves make a great addition to your gardens soil health so bag them up and stick them somewhere out of the way to fully break down then add them onto the soil as a mulch next autumn.

Weeds will continue to grow during a mild winter so regular weeding is a good idea. Remember, when your spring flowering bulbs and border plants start to flower, the borders will be harder (more time consuming) to weed. It makes sense to keep them tidy before spring. Also, many weeds are seasonal. Weeds make more weeds, so regular weeding means less weeding.

As long as the soil is not frozen or waterlogged, it might be possible to safely dig up and move dormant plants to another part of the garden and replant before they 'wake-up' in the spring. While many bulbs are often planted in late autumn it's not too late to plant the later spring flowering ones in like tulips. Herbaceous plants can also be lifted, split and replanted to refresh both the plant and the border.

Winter is a good time to dig a new border. Leave the soil in clumps. The winter rain and frost will help to break it down naturally. This will also expose any pests to natural predators and the cold. Is your lawn bumpy? The winter is a good time to remove sections of turf, add/remove soil and relay.

Now that you can see your garden in its bare bones, what repairs are needed? Plan ahead, what plants will need supports as they grow? Add them now. Does your shed have a leaky roof, do you have a water-butt in readiness for summer, have you got a compost bin in place, is your fence in need of a repair or two, do newly planted climbers need trellis or supports? Now is the time to get all these jobs sorted so that you can enjoy your garden in the spring

Hello everyone,

Firstly, a massive thank you for all the donations to our Happy School bags collection. We filled the first van and they had to come back the following week for the rest! We collected 286 bags in total, just outstanding, and raised nearly £700. THANK YOU!

We have bought new toilets for the new outdoor toilet block, some enormous dinosaurs to promote large scale small world play and some sit on diggers for the gravel pit.

Ruby's family managed to get funding for the wheelchair

accessories, so instead we have bought her a specialist chair that will allow Ruby to get out of her wheelchair and to sit unaided. This will help Ruby to be on the other children's level which is fantastic for her social development as Ruby loves being with her friends.

In other good news we have been chosen as finalists in the Nursery World Awards national competition in the category of Preschool of the year 2020! We are most delighted and a little



giddy at the thought. We had to send in a photo that represents our setting. We chose the one of Chris investigating under logs with the children; a thing we do all the time and shows the importance of the adult at preschool to teach and inspire. The results are announced in February next year. Many opportunities for communication with our parents have now been lost because of the pandemic, which saddens us. In a bid to still gather their opinions in a socially distanced way; each month we now pose a question to them online. Our first results are

back in; response to how good our communication is now that we are having to keep our parents at arm's length and we can no longer have our doors open as we used to: when

parents and visitors were welcomed, and everyone got the chance to meet and talk. We had a great response and as a result of the feedback we have put a number of new plans in place: information boards in the windows to read as parents line up, photo and information cards about each staff member have been handed out, our website has been updated and there's a new handbook on there. With fundraising money we have bought a large digital photo frame to put in the window so that parents and children can see what goes on during session and we are organising some socially distanced walk-throughs of the setting to allow parents to explore the space safely.

Meanwhile, the worries of the pandemic thankfully seem to go right over the heads of our children as they continue to play and engage, learn and develop. We focus on each child understanding the need to wash hands effectively and cover mouths when they cough or sneeze, just as we have always taught them to.

The children have really enjoyed playing with the huge new dinosaurs we bought from our fundraising, which have inspired much dinosaur talk and play. There has been lots of tower building with everything from logs to tyres. Children have been mark making; taking clipboards or note pads from the shelter to use as they play. We have been having wheelbarrow rides, working on the allotment and identifying leaves, counting leaves, threading leaves and



even dancing with leaves! Nature is such a wonderful resource!

This year we have no nativity which is very sad so instead we are inviting a couple of local Christmas elves in to spread some festive cheer – our staff member Julie is bringing the magic of Imajica, her theatre company, to preschool to help us get in the Christmas spirit!

### Red Cabbage with Balsamic Vinegar & Cranberries

### INGREDIENTS

- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 2 large onions, halved and thinly sliced
- 1 tsp whole cloves
- 1 medium red cabbage, quartered, cored and thinly sliced
- 200ml vegetable stock
- 3 tbsp balsamic vinegar
- 100g brown sugar
- 200g fresh cranberries



- 1. Heat the oil in a large pan. Add the onions and fry, stirring every now and then, for about 10 mins, until they start to caramelise..
- **2.** Stir in the cloves, then add the cabbage and continue cooking, stirring more frequently this time, until the cabbage starts to soften.
- 3. Pour in the stock, add the vinegar and sugar, then cover and cook for 10 mins.
- **4.** Stir in the cranberries and cook for 10 mins more. Cool and keep in the fridge for up to 4 days, or freeze for up to 3 months. Thaw in the fridge overnight. Reheat until very hot before serving..



## **Ampthill Community Safety Group**


On Monday 23rd November a young man lost his life following a collision on the A507 between the golf club and the bends. The road was subsequently shut for several hours and traffic necessarily diverted through the village. Notwithstanding this loss of life, villagers will be all too aware that there are not infrequent incidents on the A507 that cause it's closure and associated disruption. Ampthill Community Safety Group have liaised with Bedfordshire Fire & Rescue Service who have primary responsibility for Road Accident prevention in the county and a short film was created in early November highlighting the hazards and dangers. That video was shared with Central Bedfordshire Council. It can be seen on YouTube - YouTubeA507. It was produced for Road Safety week.

On Thursday 26th November, myself as Chair of Ampthill Community Safety Group, and the Deputy Chief Fire Officer for Bedfordshire spoke on BBC 3-Counties Radio morning show - https://www.bbc.co.uk/sounds/play/live:bbc\_three\_counties\_radio @7.50am, highlighting the issues and the fact that 10% of the accidents that Beds Fire deal with are on the A507. The three Ward Councillors Mark Smith, Paul Duckett & Mike Blair have put a paper together highlighting this issue and the Parish Council Chair Steve Rodell is writing to CBC too, requesting urgent attention; recognising that it would be impossible to change the shape of the road.

Ampthill Community Safety Group will ensure that this matter is not kicked into the long grass and will keep the village updated with progress.

## **Clophill's Serving Survivors of WW1**

### **By Sue Pearson**

Continuing our series in celebration of Clophill's brave men who fought in and survived the First World war...

**Samuel Hall** – was Corporal 58555 in the Royal Engineers Home Port Security Depot. He lived on the High Street, served in France and was awarded the Star. No further information is available for this person.

**Herbert Harris** was a Private in the 1st Bedfordshire Regiment. He volunteered in December 1914 and served with his unit in England until August 1916, when he was sent to France. He took part in severe fighting at Ypres, the Somme and Vimy Ridge, where he was taken prisoner. On his release he returned home and was demobilised in May 1919. He lived in Jacques Lane, Clophill. In 1911, aged 27, he was living in Jacques Lane with his wife, Sarah Anne and 4 children. Herbert, a Market Gardener Labourer, and his 2 eldest children had been born in Flitton, while his wife and 2 youngest children had been born in Clophill.

Article from Luton News January 1917, reporting that Herbert's brother was seeking to be exempted from serving as he had to tend Herbert's land in addition to his own and support his invalid father.

### ONE-MAN BUSINESS.

Ernest Harris, 33, married, market gardener, of Clophill, passed for general service, stated that in addition to his own three acres of land he cultivated a little for his brother, perving in France. He had four children and his father, a helpiess invalid, dependent upon him. Three months' exemption. WILL APPEAL

**Thomas Harris** was a Lance Corporal in the Royal Defence Corps and he joined in 1916. He was engaged in guarding munition works. He was demobilised in March 1919. He lived on the High Street, Clophill. In 1911 Thomas, a Bricklayer's Labourer, lived with his wife Emily and 4 children, on the High Street. Thomas and the children had all been born in Clophill whereas Emily had been born in Canada.

**Roland George Herbert** was a Private in the 4th Bedfordshires. He volunteered in 1915 and was drafted to France in July 1916. He took part in the severe fighting in the Somme and other engagements. He was wounded at Gavrelle in April 1917 and invalided home. He was discharged in October 1917 owing to his injuries. He lived at 11 The Strand, Mill Lane, Clophill.

In 1911 Roland lived at home with his parents George, a Woodman, and Elizabeth and 4 siblings. Roland's occupation was given as Farm Kitchen Boy. There were 2 other people in the house, George Braybrooks, who was Elizabeth's father, and Sarah Elizabeth Rooxs, who was described as a Cook Domestic. They were all born in Clophill. Roland was born in 1897 and died in 1982. His brother Ernest is commemorated on the Clophill Memorial.

Frank John Hinton - born in Clophill in 1891.



Frank lived on the High Street and in 1911 was a Market Gardener. He married Ethel Bottoms in 1917- whilst on leave. Ampthill News reported "The wedding presents were choice and valuable. After the honeymoon the bridegroom re-joined his regiment for foreign service." The couple had three children. His youngest child, Denis died during WW2 in a motor accident. Frank was a Corporal in the Royal Garrison Artillery. He served at Ypres in 1918 and Ampthill News reported that he had been awarded the Military Medal for coolness and devotion to duty

whilst under heavy shellfire later that year.

He returned home and resumed his working life as a farmer, initially in Clophill and at Kiln farm and later in Hitchin. His last home was in Meppershall. He died in 1978.

**Arthur Huckle** - born in 1884 and lived in Great Lane, moving to Haynes by 1911 by which time he was married to Ellen, had 4 children and worked as a cowman. He later moved to Biscot. He became a sergeant in the 8th Battalion, Bedfordshire Regiment and was killed in action in the Somme on 15/9/1916. He is remembered on the memorial in Leagrave.

**Bruce William Huckle** - born in 1896 and lived in Hall End. He became a gardener and later served as a Corporal with the 12th Lancers, and later the Machine Gun Corps. In 1918 his charger fell on and injured his leg. He was demobbed in 1919. In 1920 he married Bertha Bone. He died in 1984.


