Come into the Garden

Spring usually arrives by mid-March and the frequent sunny days means that there are more opportunities for getting out into the garden. It's time to get busy preparing seed beds, sowing seed, cutting back winter shrubs and generally tidying up anything that you didn't get around to earlier.



This year there seem to be loads of slugs around, maybe it's the relatively warm winter that we had, but I've noticed lots of holes in leaves on some of the emerging spring plants. They can cause damage throughout the year on a wide range of plants, but seedlings and new growth on herbaceous plants in spring are most at risk. Some birds, frogs, toads, hedgehogs, slow-worms and ground beetles eat slugs, and these predators should be encouraged in the garden, but simply raking over soil and removing fallen leaves will expose any eggs making it easier for the birds to find and eat them.

Hardy annuals can be sown in pots or modules to provide colour in the garden. As the month progresses and the weather warms up you can sow seeds directly straight into the ground. Marking out irregularly shaped seedbeds and broadcasting drifts of different seed gives a more natural look. A 'Hardy Annual' will take twelve months to go from seed sowing to seed setting. Many hardy annuals are winter hardy which means that they stand over the winter without damage and flower in early summer. Some of my favourite to grow include Ladybird poppy, Orlaya grandiflora, Nasturtiums 'Whirlybird series', Love in the mist and good old Poached egg plants.

Cut back ornamental grasses and other perennials left for winter interest if you have not already done so. Even if they still look good, you need to make way for the new growth. Cut off old leaves of hellebores that produce flowers from ground level to expose the flowers and remove possible leaf diseases such as hellebore leaf spot.

If you have clumps of snowdrops or bright yellow winter aconites you can easily create new drifts around the garden by lifting and dividing the bulbs while they are still in 'the green'. Just make sure that you replant them to the depth that they were original planted to.

Continue to deadhead winter-flowering pansies and other winter bedding as this will keep them flowering for longer. Deadhead the flowers of daffodils as they fade but allow the foliage to die down naturally so that leaves continue to feed the bulb. Bending and tying the leaves stops nutrients flowing into the bulbs resulting in fewer or no flowers next year.

Clear up weedy beds before mulching with a deep layer of organic matter which helps to condition the soil, suppress weed growth, insulate plant roots from temperature fluctuations, and conserve soil moisture during the summer.

It's important to check whether containers need watering as despite all of the recent rain that we have had they can dry out. Pots that are sheltered by eaves can miss out on any rainfall. If in doubt, check the compost at a hand's depth to see if it feels dry. Aim to keep pots moist, not wet, and don't let them dry out. Pots and tubs will benefit from topping up with fresh John Innes compost. Old compost can be removed and replaced with new if there is not much room for topping up. Some grit used as mulch will also deter slugs.

Mushroom & Mustard Chicken (Serves 2)

INGREDIENTS

- 1 medium onion, sliced
- 150g mushrooms, sliced
- 4 chicken thighs, skin removed OR 200g diced chicken
- 200ml chicken stock (made with 1 stock cube)
- 2 heaped tablespoons wholegrain mustard
- Ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon oil for frying
- 4 tablespoons Crème Fraiche (optional)



- 1. Gently fry the onions in oil until they begin to soften.
- 2. Season the chicken with the black pepper, add to the pan and brown for 3-4 minutes.
- 3. Add the mushrooms and cook for another 2 minutes.
- **4.** Add the stock and mustard, bring to boil, then reduce the heat and cover. Cook gently until the chicken is cooked through – about 10 minutes. Check the seasoning.
- **5.** If using the crème fraiche, then lower the heat before stirring in and cook for a further 20-30 seconds. Serve on a bed of rice, quinoa or couscous and green beans.

A well-attended meeting saw some twenty parishioners 'Zoomed' in at 7.45pm to follow the proceedings.

During question time concern was raised over the continued **heavy goods traffic** using The Causeway noting that the lorries were often too large to negotiate the tight turn into the High Street. This was noted by CBC Ward Councillors in attendance; who also encouraged as many parishioners as possible to complain direct to CBC who enforce such matters, if they can obtain vehicle details and ideally photographic evidence.

The **fallen tree off Back Street**, which was causing a problem along the footpath to the side of the quarry, has been removed and the footpath is open, even though the signage stated otherwise.

A large amount of **litter** deposited by the bridge in Old Silsoe Road has become a concern and it was suggested that local volunteers would get this cleared more rapidly than Highways UK.

Ralph Brough then **thanked** the whole village for their kind words of condolence and support following the death of his wife, Anna.

Our Ward Councillors gave CBC updates:

- a **Highways meeting** is being held on 3rd March concerning the A507 recommendations and the potential 40mph speed limit.
- there is a new Government grant for the improvement of **insulation in Park Homes.**
- the development of retirement accommodation and a crematorium in **Steppingley Road** is going ahead.
- the Local Plan has been favourably received by the Inspectorate and this should give protection against random planning applications.
- the **vaccine roll-out** is going well at Chicksands and the Rufus Centre, it being dependent on the flow of vaccines with each centre only knowing weekly how many they will receive.
- exciting information has come to light through LiDAR investigations, that there was a **large Iron-Age hillfort** on Sharpenhoe Clappers.
- the Greensand Trust has applied for a grant to plant a large number trees in the Lakes area.

Next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday 23rd March at 7:45pm, online via Zoom.

Other business was discussed, including:

- a proposed Woodland School; Townshott Plantation and allotments, possible letting of Hay Close, and planning enforcement at Land South of Top Farm, Beadlow.
- the **Lakes development** where the contract is not quite completed.
- the streetlight removed in **Jacques Lane** is to be sold.
- Councillors reported on a consultation with developers promoting a new 'village' at Beadlow Manor.
- it was suggested that volunteers be sought to help **tidy the lands** at 'The Clump' and Townshott Plantation as there is a potential Health and Safety issue when walkers enter the area. Some trees also need to be felled and it was suggested that GST be approached. Barry and Jane Breed, who have the relevant certification to do some of the work were thanked for their offer to remove the brambles and scrub.
- the **Neighbourhood Plan** is with a consultant for review.
- an update on the two pieces of land at the entrance to **Cainhoe Road**.

Councillor Mantini finally gave a brief update on the Finances noting that there was neither income nor expenditure in January. The meeting was then **concluded** - another really good job done by all.

Vaccination Volunteers needed for Priory House, Chicksands

Can you help at the new vaccination centre at Priory House (Central Bedfordshire Council's Head Office), Chicksands?

Volunteers are needed to undertake a range of roles, including:

- Car park marshals outdoor and on foot. Warm clothes necessary (also waterproof when rain is forecast)
- Front of House meeting and greeting patients to check they have appointments, may also be outdoors
- Internal marshals ensuring the flow of patients though the centre and monitoring the post-vaccination area (a seated area whereby patients wait for 15 mins before they leave).

Volunteers should be able to offer to undertake a minimum of 4-hour shifts. Rotas are covering 8am to 8pm, 7 days per week. Volunteers who could commit to a pattern of shifts either weekly, fortnightly etc, are especially welcome.

Appropriate training, supervision and PPE will be provided to ensure the safety of staff, volunteers and patients.

CBC have launched new, quick and easy, highways reporting system - FixMyStreet

You can now report highways issues quickly and easily, and track their progress, through a new online system launched in February.



CBC have partnered with 'mySociety', creators of 'FixMyStreet', a system that allows residents to make reports directly against many things including potholes, faulty streetlights, blocked drains and roadside ditches, overgrown roadside hedges, gullies, streetlights, trees and many more. The user-friendly reporting system allows reports to be pinpointed on a map, photos to be added and shows residents' reports that have already been created, plus any planned roadworks, which saves time and avoids multiple reporting.

The level of updates you'll receive is much improved too. You'll now receive an update during every step of the repair, meaning you'll know when works are booked in and when the repair is complete.

It's not just highways issues that can be reported, the new system allows reports on fly-tipping, weeds, litter and dog waste bins and graffiti.

FixMyStreet Pro already works seamlessly on smartphones, tablets and desktop computers and can be downloaded on <u>Android</u> and <u>iOS</u> devices. It's free and easy to do and doesn't take long to create a report. Clophill's Serving Survivors of WW1

Continuing our series in celebration of Clophill's brave men who fought in and survived the First World war...

Alfred William Jeffrey

Alfred was born in Clophill in 1897 and lived with his father William, and mother Mary, on the High Street in 1911. William then worked as an Agricultural Labourer (see below) and Alfred as a Farm Labourer. He later became a self-employed Market Gardener. In the 1911 census their surname is given as Jefferies. We have been unable to trace Alfred's military record, but we know from his daughters that he was a drummer boy and served with the Dorset and Hampshire Regiments in India and in Mesopotamia.





Among his memorabilia are 3 photographs taken when he was serving and

the medals that he was awarded; these were the Victory Medal and the British Medal. In addition, the family also has the medal "presented by the parishioners of Clophill in recognition of services rendered in the Great War 1914-1919", which was inscribed with the recipient's name on the reverse. There is also a tin given as a gift from HRH Princess Mary's Christmas Fund 1914. This contained a packet of cigarettes and a packet of tobacco along with a card wishing a Happy Christmas and a Victorious New Year. There were 426,000 of these tins. We wonder how many, like this one, still contain the cigarettes and tobacco?

Alfred lived in Clophill for the remainder of his life, marrying Frances Mary Cook in 1929. He was Church Warden at St. Mary's Church, Clophill for 40 years. He died in 1987.

Percy Jeffrey was a Private in the Queen's Royal West Surrey Regiment. He joined in June 1918 and in October of that year was drafted to France. He fought at Cambrai and Ypres and **he was present at the entry to Ypres at dawn on Armistice Day**. He was demobilised in August 1919. In the 1911 census he was 11 years old and at school. He lived with his parents William and Mary on the High Street along with his brother Alfred William (see above) and his 2 sisters Florence and Gladys.

Percy married Lilian in 1927 and they had a son, Denis in 1929. In 1939 Percy and family lived in Ampthill and he worked as an Agricultural labourer. He died in Luton in 1974.

William Jeffrey (presumably father to Alfred and Percy,) was a Private in the Labour Corps. He was 39 years old at the time of the 1911 census and was an Agricultural Labourer. He volunteered in February 1915 and served on important agricultural duties. He was not transferred overseas and was demobilised in January 1919. Because of William's age he may not have been considered for "active" service but, nonetheless, he served his country for 4 years.

Ernest Johnson – born in Bedford in 1884 was a Sapper with the Royal Engineers Inland Water Transport. He enlisted in 1914 and was demobbed in 1919. He lived in Back street with his wife Elizabeth (they married in 1907 in Bedford, where they had previously lived) and their 4 children. Ampthill News reported in February 1918 he was "home on leave from France." Also, in 1918 he had had an accident when a ladder broke and he fell in a dockyard, head first onto a plank placed between a barge and the dock. He was a machinist. He died in 1940 in Bedford.




