Come into the Garden

with Kate Gardner

In **April**, the weather remains unpredictable, and we can have anything from a heatwave to ground frosts and sleet, so its important to be prepared. The best protection for any new bedding or tender plants

when frost is forecast is horticultural fleece, which can cover the plants until the frost or cold weather has passed.

If you fancy saving some money, now is a good time to buy small bedding plants in plugs, which are cheaper than larger plants. These can then be grown on in the sheltered conditions of a greenhouse or cool conservatory or under some fleece. Garden centres have a great choice of plug plants for bedding and vegetables, just take care with watering, as too much at the early stages and the small plants can rot. It is best to increase watering slowly as the plant grows. When the plug plants arrive, they are often in small thumb sized pots.

These small plug plants need to be potted on immediately but take care to only use a pot that is slightly larger than the plug. If you put a small plug plant into a large pot, it will not thrive. If you are going to plant the plugs in containers or hanging baskets, (as opposed to borders,) it's a good idea to plant them directly into the container and grow on in the greenhouse or conservatory. This will help the plants establish a good root system in the container before placing outside.

When growing bedding plants nip out the growing points to produce a bushier plant, otherwise some plants, particularly petunia, fuchsia and verbena will grow leggy later in the season. It's worth remembering that bedding plants are not hardy, meaning they will not withstand a frost which could severely set back the plant, or even kill it, so to keep that fleece handy.

Early April is a good time to prune Hydrangea Macrophylla, the common hydrangea with its pink flower heads. If it is an established hydrangea prune down to a bud or a pair of buds and cut out about a third or a quarter of the older, more woody growth each year to make for new growth. If the hydrangea is newly planted, just prune down to a bud until the plant is more established with plenty of growth.

April is the last chance to prune Cornus. By pruning hard in March /April, Cornus will have a strong red colour next winter. This is a hard prune, cut down to within a few buds to the base. Early flowering Heathers can be trimmed back once flowering has finished and it's not too late to prune Buddleias which helps to keep them in shape and flowering. As the soil warms up and everything starts growing, April is a good time to give garden shrubs a feed just as the growing season is starting. Sprinkle a general fertiliser around the base of all the shrubs and plants. Suitable fertilisers would be blood fish and bone, Growmore, pelleted chicken manure and slow-release pellets. Handle with gloves and don't do it on a windy day unless you want to sprinkle yourself with blood fish and bone. Dig in gently just under the surface and water it in, especially if there is no rain in the forecast. Shrubs such as Camellia, Rhododendron and Magnolia need a specialist ericaceous feed and for Roses a specialist rose feed is best.

As the flowers fade on tulips and daffodils, dead head the actual flower, but leave the foliage to die back naturally and do not tie it up, as the foliage aids feeding the bulb for flowering next year.

A507 Speed Restrictions on A507 at Eagle Bends

Villagers will be aware of countless accidents over too many years on these bends at Beadlow and at the junction with Warren Lane, and they will be aware that enforced closures of the A507 frequently push diverted traffic into and along the High Street. The High Street is, as we know, not able to cope with A507 traffic and any action that can be taken to stop road traffic incidents on the A507 can only be a good thing for the residents of Clophill and indeed Warren Lane (along which diverted traffic is also sent).

The Ampthill Community Safety Group is made up of volunteers representing Ampthill, Maulden and Clophill and works with the blue light services, the Town & Parish Councils, CBC Council, CBC Councillors and the Street and Speed Watch groups in Ampthill & Maulden. Last November we asked Bedfordshire Fire Service - who have responsibility to prevent road traffic accidents in the County, to look at Eagle Bends. This was before the tragic loss of life of a motorcyclist there. The three CBC Ward Councillors supported the action and indeed are proposing that CBC look at the entire length of the A507 to make it safer. Beds Fire & Rescue produced a road safety film highlighting all of the many hazards from Warren Lane to the Golf Club and CBC Highways launched a public consulation before formalising some proposals. BBC Three Counties radio have been following developments.

Those CBC Highways Officers proposals were tabled at the CBC Traffic Management Committee on the 3rd March 2021 and a decison was made to make a number of changes during 2021. This includes a 50 mph speed limit along a section of Warren Lane, then 50mph limits on the A507 from near Warren Lane to the Golf Club, with an advisory limit of 40mph on the bends. Signage and bollards will be installed. The hope was that CBC would consider road safety down to the A6 Flying Horse Roundabout and so take in the junction with The Causeway - but this was not possible. However it will be part of the bigger review of the A507 put forward by our CBC Councillors. Issues such as Speed Cameras were discussed but discounted on cost. The hope is that the new limits will encourage drivers to use appropriate speeds and so make this section safer for all. Just because one can drive at the speed limit does not mean that one should.

Ampthill Community Safety Group will continue to work with the Parish Council on other matters relating to Community Safety.

Clophill Parish Council



Tuesday, 23rd March was a beautiful, spring day, albeit with a rather 'brisk' wind, but it gave a cheery introduction to another meeting of your Parish Council. As always, after taking apologies, the Chairman made his announcements.

During the open public session, the council was updated that Jane and Barry have cleared **dead wood and brush and widened paths at The Clump** as suggested at the last meeting. Work on Townshott allotments is a much bigger job and will need a working party of volunteers later in the year when fauna allows.

Ward Cllrs Blair & Smith delivered their report highlighting;

- The speed limit on the A507 is to be reduced to 40mph at the Eagle bends along with other minor changes as a first step to improve safety.
- The problem of **heavy lorries using The Causeway** has been addressed and the developers of the building site behind 66 High Street has been made aware.
- The nearest **COVID vaccination centre** is now at Chicksands CBC offices.
- Rapid lateral flow tests currently available at the Leisure Centres will become mobile if the Govt road map allows. CBC is the first local authority to take on the **Track and Trace system**.
- Parents are being encouraged to **continue to take their children for routine** (e.g., MMR) vaccinations as numbers have dropped recently.
- School transport residents are encouraged to submit views on a consultation which closes soon to push for equal treatment of Clophill children despite attending different schools (it is the school which currently determines its catchment area).
- The CBC local plan is in its 5th consultation period. No significant changes for Clophill but a large development of up to 5000 houses could be built in the Marston Vale near Lidlington/ Millbrook.

Clerks Report and other Matters Arising - (covered but not exhaustively);

- 1. Thanks to Jane and Barry Breed for starting **brush clearance at the Clump** (Pine Hill).
- 2. Quotes have been obtained for **the broken basketball backboard** at the rec, and the slide has been repaired.
- 3. The **Woodland School** proposal is progressing to agreement stage.

There was no further update on the **Lakes development** but it is hoped GST will provide an update at the next meeting. Fencing at **Readshill Quarry**: The Clerk has tried to contact Horizon Life unsuccessfully to repair the fence. The Neighbourhood plan is still with the consultant. **Hay Close** allotment has a potential tenant who is offering to reinstate the fencing and use the plot for grazing.

The meeting closed at 20.35hrs with thanks as always to our Councillors and clerk for the time they devote to our village.

Next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday 27th April at 7:45pm, (provisional timing) in Clophill Village Hall.



Clophill United Charities are seeking a new Clerk

The Trustees of Clophill United Charities (CUC) are seeking a new Clerk.

This might suit someone retired, but is available to anyone interested in helping this worthwhile local Charity. Previous holders of the role are available in the village to assist anyone new.

The Trustees have three scheduled meetings lasting up to 2 hours each in the year, held in the early evening, generally in March, June and October but these dates can be adapted if they clash with holidays. The position requires the Clerk to be able to prepare documents to send out with the Agenda, undertake follow up correspondence plus distributing the Minutes to the Trustees. Also keep financial records up to date and produce an accounts balance sheet at the end of the year ready for the Auditor. The Clerk is also responsible for contacting Allotment tenants, including the collection of rental income and keeping an eye on the state/ upkeep of the allotments.

Approximately 1 hour per week between meetings would be required to deal with administration.

Sufficient familiarity with computers so as to manage email, Word documents and simple spreadsheets is necessary.

There is an honorarium of £1,000 per annum paid to the Clerk.

Clophill's Serving Survivors of WW1 By Sue Pearson

Continuing our series in celebration of Clophill's brave men who fought in and survived the First World war...

Henry Jones lived in Mill Lane and was a Private in the 2nd Gar. Battalion of the Northumberland Fusiliers. No further information is available for this person.

James Sydney Jones – born in 1895 was a Corporal in the Royal Army Medical Corps. He was mobilised at the outbreak of activities and in July 1915 was drafted to the Dardanelles and he took part in the landing at Suvla Bay and the engagements that followed. After the evacuation of the Peninsula, he was drafted to France, where he fought in many battles, notably Ypres, the Some and Cambrai. He was twice wounded. He was awarded the 1914-15 Star and the General Service and Victory Medals. After the War his address is given as "The Rising Sun", High Street, Clophill, as his wife Annie was daughter of the Landlord, Charles Durston; (her brother Jack also served in WW1 and survived). James became Company Secretary at a Foundry and the family lived in Luton.

John James Joyce

John lived in The Strand from at least 1918-1921. He served as a Stoker on HMS Laurel a British Destroyer. HMS Laurel served with the 3rd Destroyer Flotilla on completion and transferred to escort duties after 1917. She was also involved in the Battle of Jutland in 1916, rescuing 18 of HMS Queen Mary's survivors. John joined the ship in 1917 having previously served on HMS Forward, Weymouth and Dido. John was born in Battersea in 1893 and worked as a



farm labourer between stints in the navy from 1912-13 and 1916-19. He married Minnie Lambert in 1916 and moved to Toronto, Canada in 1921 where he died in 1958.



John Kedge – lived at 22 The Slade; he was a Gardener's labourer and in 1911 lived with his wife, Mary, their 2 sons, and his Grandson. He was born in Clophill about 1860. He was 5ft 7inches tall. From 1879 to 1888 he was not a stranger to Bedford Courts, (8 offences) starting with infringement of Game Laws, sentenced to 1 month hard labour or a fine of 32 shillings and sixpence; to Drunkenness and Trespass where he was sentenced to 14 days hard labour or 24s 6p and 1 month or 43s. He seems to have paid the fines. He served as a Private in the 43rd Protection Company of the Royal defence Corps. He died in 1930, aged 70.

Alan Ord Laurie was born in Birkenhead in 1884. At the time of the 1911 census, he was living with his widowed mother; Elizabeth still in Birkenhead. Later in 1911 he married Jessie Stevenson. He was sent to France in 1915, serving as a Lieutenant with the King's Liverpool regiment and then the Royal Engineers. After the war they lived in the City in London and then Kent, where Alan died in 1960. He had enlisted with the Queen's Royal West Surrey regiment in 1939. His address appears as Back Street, Clophill on the Absent Voter's list of 1918 but otherwise his connection to the village is unknown.




