## Come into the Garden

#### with Kate Gardner

September has been warm and wet and there is now a definite hint of autumn in the air. As we move into October, days have become shorter and there is a coolness in the air but, that said, our gardens can still give us a wonderful and colourful finale before winter descends. I'm writing



this watching coverage of the September RHS Chelsea Flower Show and its great to see the amazing range of trees and plants in all of their autumn glory. Dahlia, Helianthus, Salvia, Aster and Rudbeckia are the stars that have been used to create a bright, sunny palette attractive to bees and with late summer flowering interest.

Acers put on a spectacular show as their leaves turn to deep magenta, purple or golden yellow. They can either be planted into the boarders or make excellent container plants, for the more shaded areas of the garden. Dahlias will continue to flower until the first frosts, particularly if you regularly deadheaded and feed them. With such a stunning array of flower shapes, sizes and colours there is sure to be something that will take your fancy.

Cornus (dogwoods) put on a spectacular show before their leaves fall to reveal colourful winter stems from the deepest black, through red to the palest green and yellow. Now is also a good time to take hardwood cuttings to make new plants for free.

Chrysanthemums, like Dahlias, have seen a revival in their popularity over the last few years, with plants available in a wide range of colours and heights. Pots of dwarf plants are readily available from nurseries and garden centres and can be used to add instant colour to beds, boarders and seating areas.

Ornamental grasses are at their best in autumn, and combine well with all kinds of perennials and shrubs. Miscanthus sinensis cultivars form large, dense clumps and showcase bright, feathery, narrow plumes that look superb in low autumn light. Standing tall (up to two metres) and upright through the whole of winter is an added bonus. If you prefer something smaller, try pennisetum or fountain grass, with its distinctive bottle-brush flower. These clump-forming grasses do best in full sun and look good throughout autumn, especially amongst herbaceous perennials such as Japanese anemones and sedums, which are flowering at the same time.

Now is the perfect time for planting spring bulbs, so how about trying something new and plant drifts of spring bulbs informally in your lawn, including crocuses, dwarf narcissi and snake's-head fritillaries. It's also a good time to be planting up containers with plants to add winter colour. Heathers, cyclamen, winter pansies and skimmia will provide colour and interest throughout the dark winter months.

If you have been enjoying the tropical feel from Cannas, now is the time to lift them to avoid frost damage, dry off the tubers and store in cool dark conditions until spring. It's also a good time to lift and pot up any tender perennials, such as chocolate cosmos, pelargoniums and fuschias, to protect them over the winter. If lifting and storing is not an option, then leave in the ground where they have been grown, cut back the top growth to 10cm and protect the roots and basal buds with a thick layer of well-rotted manure or bark chippings.

You still have time to transplant any deciduous shrubs that are in the wrong place, as well as plant new evergreen shrubs. The soil is still warm so that allows a good strong rootball to develop before the cold winter weather kicks in.


aid rucksack to mini grabbers for when we go out in Clophill, litter picking.



# **Clophill Parish Council**

It certainly wasn't an evening weatherwise which beckoned folk to step outside their doors, but that didn't deter some thirty stalwart Clophillians to converge on the Village Hall at 6.30pm. There, at the request of the Parish Council and prior to the regular meeting, representatives from both The Greensand Trust and Hayfield Homes, had given up their time to display maps and diagrams referring to their part in the plans of the development at 'The Lakes' and associated enabling works. They were kept very busy discussing and answering questions.

#### The Lakes

There was a formal presentation from The Greensand Trust (GST) who will manage the site from now and Hayfield Homes (HH) – the house builder. Key takeaways were:

- Contracts have been exchanged and all legal matters are agreed. Formal completion will follow upon receipt of a single (agreed) document from Evonik head office in Germany.
- Public access areas will be zoned Nature Conservation, Community access, Visitor and Agricultural, with the Cainhoe Castle Scheduled Monument area currently being looked at by relevant consultants.
- Target opening to the public Spring of 2023.
- Volunteers are sought to help GST with preparation and continuation work. Please contact GST here https://www.greensandtrust.org/pages/category/volunteer-opportunities
- The Greensand Trust has launched a Clophill Lakes Nature Reserve Appeal so grant providers local businesses and the public can support the project.
- HH award winners in their field welcome all contact from now and throughout construction will any concerned parties. Contact details are T 0121 272 8899 / customercare@ hayfieldhomes.co.uk
- There will be 18 'affordable' homes within 2,3 and 4 bedroomed dwellings.
- Apologies were given by HH for the annoyance and concern among the local homeowners, caused by the regular earthquake type shaking of their homes due to the current compaction of the soil. It is hoped this will be completed in eight weeks.
- HH is to install several road traffic safety features including a raised crossing at the school along with 'safety zone' markings and various tactile crossing points throughout the village.

#### 'Items for Consideration' covered:

- The neighbourhood plan where Cllr Mantel was still awaiting further comment to the draft proposals
- The replenishing of the hedgerow to the bottom of Old Church Path
- A suggestion that a beacon be placed atop the Old Church tower to be lit as part of the celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee
- The potential extension to the Village Hall
- The Christmas tree on The Green, again kindly donated by Mr Jakins and any related event to mark its illumination
- The parking of a car on the dangerous corner of Back Street
- The allocation of spare allotments at the Village Hall. This discussion involved the plea for help in clearing a load of scrub.

It was reassuring to see Heather, the new Clerk, making such a great start in the job, offering sound advice and information when only being in post for a couple of months. Well done Heather!

The next parish council meeting is 26th October, 7:45pm in the Village Hall.


#### CPC to submit comments as follows:

The proposed scheme was debated at the Clophill Parish council meeting on Tuesday 28th September and the council resolved to respond as follows:

- 1. The principle of the scheme is supported in order to alleviate the known issue of congestion for large vehicles (particularly buses) caused by poor and inadequate parking.
- 2. There are currently 5 marked parking spaces. The scheme proposes a reduction to 4. This is not acceptable bearing in mind the current congestion that already exists and the reason for it.
- 3. The loss of one space is to the proposed insertion of hatching to deter parking on or close to the bus stop. We suggest the bus stop should be moved a few metres towards the Flying Horse PH leaving enough space for 5 car parking spaces.
- 4. The proposed bay angle to the kerb is more acute than at present. This will make it more difficult to reverse than at present in order to follow the proposed one way direction. If the bays remain at their current angle 5 cars can still be parked.
- 5. The current 'disabled' parking bay outside the shop does not comply with current design standards for disabled parking bays. The bay is often occupied by non-Blue Badge holding drivers and is an obstruction to vehicles reversing out of the main parking bays when it is occupied. This should either be:
- a. Removed entirely
- b. Moved into the corner adjacent to the patch leading to the footbridge over the A507 (where there is current nondescript hatching
- c. Upgraded in accordance with current standards.
- 6. We believe an onsite meeting with a representative from Highways to discuss and address our practical concerns detailed above would be beneficial to both parties.

**Parks** - Greensand Country is lucky enough to contain all of Bedfordshire's remaining heathland, more than half of its woodland and 29 historic parklands. Greensand Country's parks and nature reserves are perfect for family visits – letting the kids play outside, walking the dog or settling down with a picnic.

From the top of the ridge, open heaths and meadows give you spectacular views across the surrounding countryside. The beautiful patchwork of heaths, parks, historic houses and woodland means that you can visit lots of different places in a single day, and find something to keep every member of the family happy. There are also plenty of places to stop for a pub lunch or a quick coffee.

**Landscape** - Greensand Country is a beautiful and loved landscape. It is defined by the Greensand Ridge, a band of higher ground stretching from Leighton Buzzard to Gamlingay, which rises out of the surrounding vales to create a locally unique environment.

It is a landscape rich in wildlife and cultural heritage, with its own special qualities and sense of place. A 'green oasis' of peace and quiet, rolling countryside and breath-taking views. A place where people feel able to slow down, unwind and connect with nature. Somewhere to escape urban life, breathe easy and feel uplifted. Come and discover it for yourself!

Each character area has its own distinct sense of place. You can think of them as different 'jigsaw pieces' that fit together to form the Greensand Country landscape as a whole. They can be used to help illustrate the variety offered by Greensand Country – that it comprises a patchwork (or jigsaw) of different areas, with different characteristics and experiences to enjoy. The pieces are the Greensand Ridge, Ouzel Valley, Flit Valley, and Ivel Valley. To learn more about each one please visit www.greensandcountry.com.

**Villages and Towns -** Experience the varied character of towns and villages across Greensand Country. Places such as Woburn, Old Warden and Ampthill contain distinctive styles of architecture characteristic of the area's historic estates. For example: Old Warden estate houses are built in an elaborate 'English Garden' style, with thatched roofs, dormer windows, painted render walls and timber porches; whilst the Duke of Bedford estate buildings in Woburn are generally built of brick in a Georgian style. Greensand Country's idyllic villages contain various historical sites, as well as boutique shops, restaurants, cafes and pubs.

Beautiful towns in the area include: Ampthill, Clophill Village, Old Warden, Gamlingay, Flitwick, and Aspley Guise.

**Views** - There are many stunning views to discover in Greensand Country. The ridge itself is a prominent feature in the landscape and provides a dramatic backdrop to the views from the lower lying countryside. The ridge is accessible from many of the surrounding villages and towns

From its elevated slopes you can experience panoramic views across the countryside including Marston Vale and the Ouse Valley. Woodlands often frame views on lower ground, whilst landmark churches and other historic buildings provide focal points in the landscape.

# **Clophill's Serving Survivors of WW1**

By Sue Pearson

Continuing our series in celebration of Clophill's brave men who fought in and survived the First World war...

**Ernest James Osborn** was born in Clophill in 1881. He was the son of James and Charlotte Osborn and lived most of his life in what was known as Hope Cottages now 11-13 Little Lane. In 1895 he bore witness at the trial of W Gaylor who stole 5 bushels of potatoes! It seems that by 1911 he was orphaned and lived with his sister Clara and brother William in what was then No. 11. Ernest was an agricultural labourer, but his army particulars state that he was a qualified cook and that he had served 10 years previously with the Bedfordshire regiment.

He enlisted in 1916 with the Bedfordshire Regiment and then later transferred to the 8th Leicestershire Regiment and was posted to France almost immediately. In 1917 he suffered with shellshock and later trench fever. Later in the year while serving at Etaples he suffered with myalgia. In 1918 he was transferred to the Agricultural Corps. He was demobbed in 1919. Ernest married Edith Dorothy Cobb in 1938, in Biggleswade. Perhaps shaped by the events of 1895 he became a Special Constable by 1939 when he worked as a market gardener's labourer. He died in 1955. Both Edith and Ernest are buried at the Old Church.

**Samuel Page** – It is believed that Samuel was born in Clophill in 1884, the son of Samuel and Hannah. The family lived in 6 Bedford Cottages, Jacques Lane. Samuel was a farm labourer. He married Mary Line in 1906. They lived in East End, Flitwick by 1911. He served with the 3/5th and/or 8th Bedfordshire Regiment and was seriously wounded in France in 1916, hospitalised in Oxford; returning to France in the autumn of that year. In 1917 Samuel was wounded again and went to hospital in Blackpool. Samuel had 5 children, however his son, Sidney Lewis died in Thailand in World War 2. By 1939 the family were living in Flitton and Samuel was working as a Horseman. Samuel died locally in 1968.



#### Frederick James Palmer

Frederick was born in Clophill in 1881 and lived at no 33, High Street and was a Private, Motor Transport, A.S.C. He served at The Somme in 1916.

In 1911 he lived with his parents Charles and Mary and was a butcher, as was his father working at the shop at no 33 High Street. He was one of 8 children. He later married Lilian Shotbolt.

By 1939 he lived at Northfield Farm and worked as a Farmer. Frederick moved to Stotfold in later life. He died in Bedfordshire at the age of 91.

**Henry William (Harry) Parkinson** was born in Clophill in 1898. By 1911 he was living with his parents, William and Martha, on the High Street. He was one of 7 children and at the age of 13 was working as a farm labourer. Harry left for France with the Bedfordshire Regiment in February 1916. He was wounded in the shoulder and head at the Somme in 1917 and was hospitalised in France. He took part in the Trones Wood struggle and was fighting when Thiepval was captured. He was discharged as unfit on medical grounds, the fourth from our village to be so afflicted. However, by 1939 his occupation is still a labourer when he was still living with his parents in no 82, High Street. It is thought that he died in Biggleswade Hospital in 1984.

# Reflections - Clophill in Aug/Sept 1975

A series looking back at previous issues of Spotlight and Clophill Village life

One of the lovely things that 'Outlook' did 'back then', was to welcome new folk to the village and the 1975 August / September issue did that very thing. Interestingly, two couples were publicans – Jean and Alf Kerridge, who took over The Compasses and Avril and Richard Coward, the Rising Sun. Di and Anne took over the butchers' shop from Mr L. Hemmings. All three enterprises were wished success – but forty-seven years on, all three establishments are now private dwellings.



The fete, which you read about in July, was a resounding success, raising £866 for the proposed Recreation Centre and changing facilities. Keith Fossey, Chairman of the Fete Committee thanked everyone, who had helped to make it so good. Fete week was completed with "a very successful Supper Dance at the Village Hall on Saturday 28th June. Dancing was to 'Copperfield' who proved to be without doubt the most original and entertaining group ever to appear at the hall. Everyone had a very enjoyable evening and the dance was excellent value for the £1.60 price of the tickets."

On 10th July, the Village Hall Management Committee invited Mr Morris, Secretary of the County Playing Fields Association to a wellsupported public meeting, where he explained the system of grants for recreational facilities. This resulted in the formation of the Clophill

Recreational Association. It was hoped that the new Association could obtain grants to establish netball and tennis courts, (it seems they were unsuccessful).

The WI was busy again at the July meeting when Mrs Sylvia Lammas introduced Mrs Valerie Wilding for the National Dairy Council to thirty members, who heard about the history and manufacture of English Country Cheeses - and tasted nine varieties afterwards. Now, those of you who haven't attended a WI meeting, traditionally, there was always a competition and a raffle, the latter at this meeting, being won by Mrs Steele – (was that Betty now of Beverley Court I wonder?). The competition was 'The most shades in a bunch of sweet peas'. The August meeting was a bit of a wash-out by the read of it – few attendees and the speaker couldn't make it! But the ladies rallied and four showed and 'spoke entertainingly of' their holiday slides of Norway, Austria, the Isle of Wight and camping in Wales.

Fourteen members of the Wednesday Group had a talk by a Mr R. Norris from the Little Rep. Theatre, Dunstable, who told them about the busy company – they put on six plays a year apparently and had also taken 'Charley's Aunt' to their twin town in Germany. There was going to be a Clothes Party in the village hall in August. These were always good fun; we don't have them any more do we, shame....
