Come into the Garden

With Kate Gardner

I don't know about you but I always associate spring with bulbs especially daffodils, crocus and hyacinth, but there are many lovely summer bulbs too. These would usually be planted in the Autumn, but if you missed that slot then early spring provides another opportunity to add these into your gardens and pots.

Alliums makes a fabulous display of purple, pink or white lollypops and mix so well with so many garden plants. If you plant them in February Alliums will flower in late spring and early summer and once established return reliably each year.



Plant Lilies in Feb/March for a great scented display throughout the early summer. Lilies dislike heavy, wet soil, which can make them less reliable in subsequent years, but the free draining sandy soils that many of us have in our gardens can provide ideal growing conditions. For something spectacular be on the lookout for 'tree lilies' which are monster Orientals and they really are dramatic. Carrying dozens of 15-20cm flowers on stems up to 2.5m tall, they will give an amazing focal point in your flower borders. They persist well from year to year and their stems are so stout that they rarely need support.

If you have some shadier areas then look out for martagon lilies which are among the most dependable and robust. Best in a little shade, their flowers are usually nicely speckled although the pure white *Lilium martagon* is one of the most beautiful of all. *Lilium regale*, with their huge white trumpets and distinct fragrance, are the ones to plant in difficult situations as they tolerate ordinary soil and increase well as long as they have some sun.

Try growing snowdrops beneath deciduous shrubs, such as *Cornus alba* 'Sibirica', or along the front of borders where herbaceous plants can provide ground cover when the snowdrops are dormant. Snowdrops do best in a well-drained soil in light shade, similar to their native woodland habitat. They also do well at the foot of a deciduous hedge, and are often planted in grass, at the front of spring border displays, and in rock gardens. Now is the time to plant them 'in the green' which can be done by either buying flowering bulbs in pots or lifting and dividing well established clumps so that you can spread them around the garden.

February presents as a turning the corner towards spring. The garden appears dormant, but there is growth at ground level with tiny buds and shoots appearing. February is an ideal time to cut back the old top growth that you left of the plant to provide winter habitats for insects, but take care to avoid damaging the new growth coming through. If cutting back is left too late, it's harder to cut back without damaging the new growth.

The time to prune Mahonia is when it has finished flowering. If yours is looking healthy, with lots of growth and it's a good shape, then prune it by simply removing the spent flowers. If it is a little straggly, prune out the long shoots and tidy up.

However, as it matures, Mahonia has a tendency to become leggy with bare

stems at the base of the plant, which requires a hard prune. Now is a good time to cut 1/3rd of the plant back to the base which will stimulate lots of new shoots and a bushier plant.

February is a good time to start off your sweet peas which are easy to germinate and make a showy addition to the garden throughout the summer. Grow them up an obelisk or fence and you will have amazing scent all summer long and cut flowers for the house too.

Nature Notes

Late Winter/Early Spring:

Still some berries left, by the birds perhaps some holly and haws. There are some dark berries which are welcome feed. In our lanes and along the hedgerows are many hazel catkins becoming longer and full of pollen the popular Lambs Tails. Look closely for the small red flower which will become the nut ready for the greedy grey squirrels.



What to see in our verges and waste patches (and garden):

The red (mauve purple) dead petals flower profusely, early food for the bees. Look for the groundsel quite short at this season with tiny yellow flowers turning to balls of fluff. Chickweeds will fresh green leaves and very dainty white flowers also shepherds purse another short plant with seed heads like small pouches.

The bright yellow celandine low growing, with bright crisp shaped flowers blooms in the damper parts of our village. Some of these flowers are to be found in the churchyard as are speedwell (birds eyes a small bright blue flower). Also notice the violets, early respirable sweetly scented.

What to observe with our trees:

They are still mainly bare - look at their shape against the pale blue wintry sky. The willows which are plentiful in our village, along the bypass are probably the first to show signs of new life.

What bird life to notice:

The Robin is still singing and is an early nester. You may have one in your garden. Listen to the song thrush it sings frequently on mild days. "He sings each song twice over" and it is easy to recognise. You may hear or see a mistle thrush, although a larger bird than the song thrush with a similar clear song. The rooks are early nesters too, see their nests in the trees near the 101 roundabout or perhaps on Wilstead hill. There are jackdaws around, they have a grey neck so are unlike the all black crows or the rook with a white patch near the beets. The jackdaws will out 'jack jack' as they fly overhead.

The star of this season:

Probably the blackthorn by the a6 roundabout full of white blossom on the bare branches. It's very prickly, so never attempt to pick it, whenever you should see it.

Clophill Parish Council

Happy New Year from the PC!



A dozen or so parishioners were at the January meeting to hear a very full agenda commencing with an **update on the Lakes from the Greensand Trust (GST)**. The land contract had not yet been finalised but permissions had been given by L & Q for GST to carry out some ecological surveys and tree planting. Local schools and interest groups will be invited to help. Initial findings include the presence of otters and badgers (which have been temporarily disturbed by the Hayfield housing development). The length of time for the land to be handed over was a concern for parishioners and councillors. Once all is signed and sealed, the Parish Council would like to be more openly involved in the GST development plans to reflect the wishes of the village.

CBC Ward Councillors Blair and Duckett spoke of the low increase in Council Tax. Following a comment about the confusion caused by the advertised plans for the **Clophill Roundabout**, it was explained that plans published were to secure funding but now they need to be updated and a consultation started. The Portfolio holder is currently pushing Highways to update the documentation to include such consultation as the premature publication was misleading.

It was noted, with sadness, that the Village Hall Committee had decided to downsize their extension plans due to the cost of the original plan being greater than envisaged.

Budget - Cllr Mantini then gave an excellent budget report covering last year and looking into 2022-2023, suggesting either nil increase or a small increase in precept income equivalent to 50p per band D house this year. A vote was taken and a majority decided in favour of the small increase.

Other Key Items for consideration:

Lakes - A representative from L & Q will be invited to the next meeting to detail their position IF the land transfer has not completed. An idea was discussed, put forward by Cllr Breed, of a Chairman's Prize to recognise the contribution of local residents volunteering in the local community was warmly received. A list of criteria is to be drawn up, the idea promoted and implemented ASAP. Neighbourhood Plan, Hedgerow replenishment, replacement bench, Christmas lights and Hay Close are to be discussed at the next meeting. The clearing of scrub at the **Townshott allotments** was agreed.

The meeting ended with the very sad news that due to pressures of work, **Cllr Mantini would** resign after seven years on the Parish Council. Everyone on the PC and in Clophill thanks 'GP' for all of his time and concern that he has given and shown to the village over those seven years.

As such a position on the PC is available and anyone interested in becoming involved should contact Steve Rodell (Chair) or Heather Myott (Clerk)

All our Christmas services were well attended in the circumstances, and everyone was delighted that we were able to hold our usual Candlelit Carol Service on Christmas Eve, with more than 60 present. Clophill's Serving Survivors of WW1

Continuing our series in celebration of Clophill's brave men who fought in and survived the first world war...

Bertie Rainbow was born in Meppershall in 1889 but by 1911 he was living in Beadlow Cottages, Clophill with his parents Edwin and Louisa and he worked as a farm labourer. Bertie was brother to Ralph – see below. He enlisted with the Beds Yeomanry in 1915. He married Lizzie Millard in 1919 and by 1939 was a smallholder living in Biggleswade. Bertie died in Shefford in 1950.

Ralph Rainbow was born in Meppershall in 1894. In the 1911 Census he is living with his parents, 3 brothers and 1 sister in Beadlow. In 1911 he was a Farm Labourer and was a Private in the 2/5th Manchester Regiment. He was taken Prisoner of War in May 1918 near Armentieres and was later moved to Germany. He wrote home stating - "I am in the best of health and have nothing whatever to grumble about. It really seems to me like peace time. I am sincerely anxious to receive a letter from you. When you can, kindly send me a good big parcel containing soap, tobacco, and some cake. I am seriously in need of the first mentioned article. Now, mother, be sure and not to worry about me as I am quite all right. My mates, who were taken prisoner with me on that memorable spring morning, wish to be remembered to you. We are having lovely weather here, but I still wish this war was over; but we must keep on smiling. I have sent you two postcards since I have been a prisoner, but have heard nothing from you – Your ever-loving son, Ralph." He was able to return home by early December of that year.

Ralph married Ethel Bland in 1923 and they lived later at addresses in Hitchin Road, Clifton. He worked as a general labourer and passed away in September 1963.

Noel Rawnsley was a Lieutenant in the British Red Cross Society as part of the Royal Engineers. He joined the signal corps as a dispatch rider. Noel lived on the High Street according to the Absent Voters List/Electoral Rolls in 1918 & 1919. He was born in Lancashire in 1881. There seems to be no family connection with the village, however his father Rev. Canon Hardwicke Drummond Rawnsley was a writer, social reformer and a founder of the National Trust.

Noel died on the Isle of Capri in 1952.

Chief Officer Rich lived in Glebe cottage, now Taylors Cottage, in the High Street. He was the son of John and Julia, but records have not yet revealed which of their sons he was.

He was married and served on HMS Swiftsure – the lead ship of the pre-dreadnaught battleships.



Reflections – Clophill in January 1977

Continuing our series looking back at previous issues of Spotlight and Clophill Village life..... By Julie Benson

I should have checked – I know I should have checked, but you don't do you? When there is a shelf, stuffed with copies of past magazines, in chronological



order, or seemingly so, you take it for granted that they are. Not on this bookshelf! In fact, the whole of **Outlook 1976** is missing - apart from the **Christmas issue!** Where they are I have no idea – unless it was the year that Mike went to America and we joined him for a short while, not for a year and I am sure that we had paid for the magazines to be delivered! It's a mystery.

In spite of this, I can give a feel of **what it was like at the end of 1976** and note what developments there were during that year in the village. The first piece in the magazine was from

Barry Inskip, the Editor, who had the good news that 'there will be no price increase due to various fundraising projects held throughout the year', before wishing everyone a Happy Christmas. So, a positive start to the issue – and 1977. **The diary** advertises Christmas concerts, a **Beverley Court** Christmas lunch (so it was up and running then); a New Year's Buffet Dance on New Year's Eve – tickets £2.50, as well as a New Year's Eve Party in Beverley Court (for residents and invited guests) – it certainly was a lively place then wasn't it! The **WI** members were to enjoy 'Holiday slides by David Fowler' in January.

Back in November, at the meeting of the **Village Hall Committee**, "Mr K. Fossey was elected Vice-Chairman. Grass seed has been sown on the west side of the hall and a thorn hedge is to be planted to make an attractive area for holding garden parties, etc. A retaining wall has been built at the rear of the hall at a cost of £350. ... heating at the hall has been giving a problem. Extra storage heaters have been installed". A Hallowe'en Dance was also held. Then a 'Bumper Autumn Bazaar' was enjoyed at the **Methodist Church** with a great total of £245 being raised. A 'very special word of thank to the stallholders'... including mesdames Brown, Richardson, Chapman, Pitts, Croot, Naylor, O'Connor, Cole, Davis, Lammas. Sharp; Monsieurs Sharp, Matthews and Errick with extra help from Lyn Pressland, Ann Cooper, Susanne Telford, Felicity Stevens, Eileen Street, Alison Stevens and Jessie Swales. A **sponsored Knit-in** by amongst others mesdames Cooper, Davis, Duthie, Flanagan, Herne, Kirby, Naylor, Matthews, Pressland and misses Eddy, Street and Swales made £161.43 for church heating funds. (What did they knit I wonder – squares for a blanket, or their own patterns?) Whatever, well done all of the fundraisers! So many names from Clophill past – and still present.

Interestingly – well, I think so – the **Parish Councillors** were in discussion with Eastern Electricity about installing "solar electronic controls for their 34 existing street lighting columns." Seemingly, that didn't happen! Fittingly, there was to be a

meeting on 20th Jan “to form ideas for (the Queen’s) local **Jubilee celebrations**”, so that’s 45 years ago. (There is current discussion concerning her Platinum Jubilee.)

Clophill was a far **busier village** with clubs and societies half a century ago – and there was a newly formed ‘Outlook Travel Group’ whose members enjoyed recent visits to both Watford and St. Albans. While **church fundraising** was in aid of the Tower Restoration Fund – and “Ann Jeffery, Fred Kirby and their band of helpers” organised a ball (with well over 100 raffle prizes - fancy drawing that) and raised £120. Some things never change!

The past two years have been very difficult for everyone and all the members have missed coming to see their friends and watch the demonstrations. At last, we hope that things will become more normal and members will feel confident to come to the meetings this year.

We began again last September with a social meeting, followed by an excellent demonstration by Arnaud Metairie in October. This was very popular as four members demonstrated and others brought their designs that were displayed all around the hall. We hope we inspired everyone to decorate their front doors for Christmas. We held a very successful Wreath workshop in the Church, with ladies producing some beautiful designs.

The highlight of the year was our Christmas demonstration by Lorene Dyer from Coventry. Her arrangements and personality made the evening sparkle. It put us in the festive spirit and gave everyone positive thoughts and hopes for more normality in 2022.

We were very sad to hear in November that Barbara Hudson, who was our founder Chairman in 1976 had died after a long illness and dementia. She had kept in touch and came to our Ruby celebrations. Our AGM in January was held on Zoom due to the risk of Covid. They love the freedom the woodland offers them and as the children show us, 'less' is most definitely 'more' allowing imaginations and creativity to grow; increasing intellectual development and giving children opportunities to practise decision-making and social skills.

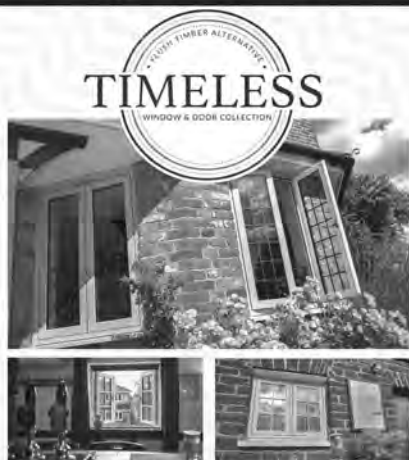

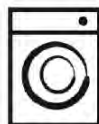
