Come into the Garden

We may be moving into the colder months, but you can add winter interest by using containers in your outdoor space. There are plenty of great plant options available from the garden centres so why not get creative and have a go at making something unique.



A basic principle for choosing the plants you need to create a beautiful container display is to have a "thriller," a "filler," and a "spiller." A thriller plant gives the container height, either through foliage or flowers. They are placed in the back, as they are the tallest of the plants. Filler plants are of medium height and fill up the pot, while the Spiller plants are low height or spill over the edge of the pot. While it's not always necessary to have all three, it's helpful to know design rules before you decide to break them. Knowing the rules can help you decide when it isn't necessary to follow it by the letter.

Evergreens are the name of the game for winter containers. Thankfully, evergreens aren't limited to trees! There are evergreen shrubs, perennials, grasses, ferns, and vines so whether you want something formal such as a matching pair of standard bays or something softer, there are plenty of options to use.

The most important element for winter containers is the "thriller." You can create height and interest through a variety of plants. Think Thuja, Box, Holly, Nandinas, Euonymus, Mahonia, Yew, and dwarf varieties of conifer trees like the Cypress or Juniper.

Another way to have a "thriller" in winter containers is to use various kinds of twigs or branches that give a texture, colour, and height interest. Many Dogwood varieties have red or yellow bark, Birch trees have interesting bark, and twisted branches can provide height as well as a textural element to containers.

Next are the fillers and you can go the annual or perennial route. Examples include pansies, violas, ornamental cabbage, Heuchera, Bergenia, Christmas Rose (Helleborus Niger), Lenten Rose (Helleborus orientalis), and Euphorbias. Small compact shrubs with good leaf colour or winter flowers or berries make great fillers. Spiller plants include carex, ivy and periwinkle (Vinca minor or Vinca major) and prostrate Rosemary.

At the most basic level, having one each of thriller, filler, and spiller can be a pleasant winter container. However, the more beautiful winter containers can have more than one variety of plant for each. The more variation in heights, colours, and textures, the more beautiful the winter container. You can also underplant with spring bulbs to add a contrast pop of colour. Crocus, grape hyacinths, snowdrops, winter aconites, dwarf iris and dwarf narcissi can be added as you put your container together.

Here are ideas that you could try. False holly with its variegated leaves, ornamental Kale and variegated ivy underplanted with lily of the valley. Dwarf spruce, lime green heuchera an ornamental cabbage and carex. A small holly bush and red twig dogwood branches, blue fescue, euphorbia, dark purple heuchera, a hellebore and golden carex.

Don't worry too much about whether it's perfect or not just try some plants together and see how they look. You can always swap them if they don't look right. That's one of the pleasures of container gardening, nothing is permanent! Happy Gardening

St Mary's School News

We can't believe we're almost through Autumn half term – it has flown by!

In our last update, we advised that Ofsted had visited us, we have now shared the final report with our parents. We are always incredibly proud of the work we do at St. Mary's and are delighted that Ofsted witnessed many of the wonderful things we do at school. As we shared with our parents; under the new Ofsted framework, all schools must now be inspected at least every 5 years (7 years in some exceptional cases). St. Mary's was last inspected in 2007 when it then became exempt from inspection in accordance with the previous Government guidance. However, under the new framework and guidance, previously exempt schools have been put back into the routine inspection regime. A great deal has changed at the school, in the education system and the wider world since 2007 – the educational climate and the Ofsted Framework are vastly different today to how they were in 2007 and, of course, we have also had the impact of Covid.19 over the past two years.

The outcome of our Ofsted inspection was very pleasing, especially considering the timing of the inspection at the beginning of the new academic year; and following the continued disruption of Covid.19. The inspection outcome reflects the challenges the school has faced as well as recognising those aspects we have prioritised. Our FOSM (Friends of St Mary's) ran a hugely successful fireworks night, which sold out in advance. What an amazing evening it was. It was so lovely to see so many parents, carers and children at the event and I know everyone enjoyed the stalls, food and, of course, the brilliant fireworks display! We want to say a HUGE thank you to all the FOSM volunteers for a wonderfully organised and fun event.

On Thursday 11th November the children made us all so proud. We held a Remembrance Worship in school and then walked over to the war memorial in the church yard for the two minutes silence at 11 o'clock. The children were impeccably behaved, walking to and from church beautifully and all standing respectfully in silence—right from Acorn (nursery) all the way up to Oak (year 4) class! Thank you to Mr. Dunn too for coming to play the bugle for us.

This half term we have recognised Anti-Bullying Week (including children coming into school with odd socks) and Road Safety Week. Our school council have also arranged a fantastic fund-raising day for Children in Need. Amounts are still being added up and will be shared in due course.

Jake the School Dog:

Jake joined the school for Remembrance Day. He has joined in with time to talk sessions, and our Year 4 children really enjoy taking him for a walk around the school field at break times. He is also hearing readers, increasing his time in different classrooms. Jake has been particularly helpful continuing to support those in school who might have little wobbles during the day. Just a little time with Jake and all is well again :-).

Our Value for December is: Commitment

This is the quality of being dedicated to something, for example a cause, activity or faith. It is also known as a pledge or an undertaking. A commitment is never supposed to be broken. If it is broken; that means it was never a commitment but more of a pretention.

We will be thinking about commitment over the month and particularly considering how we can make personal promises and keep them. Acorn Nursery news:

We've had a busy few weeks in Acorn Nursery. As part of our MySmile Accreditation commitment, we investigated and learnt how to brush our teeth correctly through discussion and hands on activities - even looking at how Peppa Pig brushes her teeth! We sent home toothbrushes and toothpaste.

We celebrated and explored Diwali (making diva lamps and rangoli patterns in rice), Remembrance Day (making our wooden poppies and going to the memorial at Church), World Science Day (discussing climate change and drawing our perfect earth), Anti Bullying Week (looking at the theme of kindness in our Jack in the Box Worships and joining in Odd Socks Day), Road Safety Week (where we learnt the Supercat 'stop, look, listen and think' rap) and Children In Need day (taking part in the activities provided by the school council).

With all of this going on, we've still found time for all of our regular learning opportunities such as Helicopter Stories, Cosmic Kids yoga and Dough disco. We have been looking at 'our 5 senses' and we used most of them when we went on a lovely walk up to the woods. We are privileged to have lots of wonderful nature so close to us and we all had a great time exploring - finding a fallen tree and creating our own stories as to what happened to it. Jake came too and it was the ideal opportunity to practice what we have been learning - from crossing the road safely to being kind and helping each other.

We currently have spaces available in our amazing Nursery Class and, as a reminder, we now take children from 2 years old. We accept 2-year-olds and 30 hours funding which can also be used for FunZone (before and after school club). There is no minimum session requirement, we offer mornings, afternoons and lunchtimes or any mixture of these. Reflections – Clophill in December 1975

Continuing our series looking back at previous issues of Spotlight and Clophill Village life.....

Well, we are now in December and to welcome it, a lovely **cover picture**, but I don't know where it came from. Opening to page 1, I see that "Work on the warden housing scheme is now nearing completion and it is understood that new residents will be taking occupation of the flats in the very near future; we understand the site of the building will be known as **Beverley Court**."

Now, I am a great supporter of our Parish Council – and I see that "More parishioners than ever before attended the November

Parish Council meeting." Wonderful! Discussions included the 'Clophill By-Pass', the 'Village Hall' (planning permission for the extensions being granted), 'Public Transport' and 'A6 Trunk Lighting'. The Village Hall Committee noted that "Complaints had been received that the hall and its furniture were being left in an unreasonably dirty condition after hirers had left the building." It seems that while the hall was used every day of the week, there was no caretaker and hirers needed to be reminded about their responsibilities! The WI members enjoyed an illustrated talk by Mrs Clark about "her journey 'across Russia to Samarkand."

There is an account of the **Remembrance Service**. In 1975, wreaths were laid by "Mr. R. Herbert (Ex-Legion Committee), Mr G. Chisholm (Parish Council), Mrs W. Dawson (Conservative Association), Mr. R. Lucraft (Village Hall Management Committee). ... The remainder of the service took place in Church where the preachers were the Rev H.R. Cousins and Mr F.J. Oakley. The organist was Mrs F. Robinson. The Legion Standard was carried by Mr J. Herbert." (This is a lovely memory as Jack died recently.) There were thanks to the **poppy sellers** "who this year raised an all-time record of £80.23." The sellers included "Mesdames J. Doggett, B. Harris, S. Lammas, the Misses J. Ashton, R. Dyson P. Barker, D. Barker and Mr T. Sheppard." (Good work Tim!). Thanks were also extended to "Mrs Hughes of the Kindergarten School, Mrs Roberts and the children of Clophill Primary School (no 3 tier system yet), Mrs Gordon (Guider)".

Mrs Gordon was busy in November as she and ten **Guides** went to London, visiting Guide HQ and the Commonwealth Institute and also, "for the second year running, Clophill had won the District Shield in competition with companies from Ampthill and Maulden." Well done 1st Clophill Guides.

The **Methodist Church** held a "very successful Autumn Bazaar" when £242.50 was raised via many stallholders selling their wares – Vegetables, cakes, toiletries, groceries, sweets, mystery parcels and Christmas cards.

There are lists of prize-winners at both **St. Mary's Church Bazaar** (19) and the **Darby and Joan Christmas Draw** (63!) I see that at the former P. Chapman of Goodhall Crescent won a turkey and Mrs Sheppard of Jacques Lane took home some potatoes, while Stan Woodward was very lucky, winning both biscuits and chocolates! **Darby and Joan Club** winners also took potatoes home.

It is interesting to see the range of prizes offered, a tad different from today. Yes, there were bottles of wine, chocs, biscuits and a few toiletries, but a lot of sherry, a bottle of Dubonnet ('Du Bo - Du Bon – Dubonnet' - remember the advert?); whisky, a chicken (hopefully dead and plucked). Lucky T. Humphries of Maulden won a tea cosy, then there were towels, kitchen towels, a Pyrex dish, Christmas pudding and a chrome tray. I am sure all very welcome.

Then of course, ending Vol 9 No.10, there are various **Christmas events** advertised, Carol Concerts and Church Services. Spotlight 1975 ends with Helen Bradshaw being wished 'Many happy returns on your (st/th) birthday from Mum Dad and Willi'. What better way to end a year eh?





Clophill's Serving Survivors of WW1

Continuing our series in celebration of Clophill's brave men who fought in and survived the first world war...

Thomas Pegg was a Private in the Rifles and then the Agricultural Labour Corps and lived on the High Street in 1918. He enlisted in May 1915 and was discharged in November 1918 having served in France. Nothing further is known about Thomas.

Walter F. Penwarden lived on The Green and was a Sergeant in the Signal Section of the Royal Engineers. He was awarded the Military Medal. Research indicates that, although he appeared on the missing voters register in 1918 for Clophill, he may have had little connection with the village. He was born in about 1887 in Battersea and was living at home there in 1911. He was an Electrical Light Wireman, which may explain his War occupation.

William Matthew Edmund Perkins lived at Mount Pleasant. He was a Gunner (Bombardier) in the Royal Garrison Artillery. He was the youngest son of William Henry and Emma Elizabeth Lammas/Lomas. He suffered from Trench Fever, being sent to Newcastle-upon-Tyne Military Hospital in July 1918. William married Hessie Fossit in the same year. He was born in Clophill in about 1890 and in 1901 was living in The Slade. By 1911 he is living (as a boarder) in Lincolnshire and, aged 21, is working as a Signalman on the Great Northern Railway, he continued working as a railway man until at least 1939. He died in Lincolnshire in 1977.

William Henry Pigrum – William enlisted in 1915 at Ampthill Park, he served initially with the 7th Bedfordshire Regiment and at the time of his medical discharge in 1919 he was a Private with the Labour Corps Home Service company. He had suffered with myalgia. Ampthill News reported in January 1918 that he was returning to the front and in May 1918 that he was in hospital, hoping to be well soon.

He was born in 1884 in Toddington and had lived and worked in Luton in later years as a Straw hat manufacturer. He had married Eliza Frost in 1907 in Luton. They lived in the High Street from at least 1914 to 1918. It is believed that William had a hat factory near the Rising Sun Pub. By 1919 the family had moved to Newmarket. He died in 1963 in Lincolnshire where he had worked as a hat renovator.

William James Pitts was a Private in the 867 Garrison Guard. He was born in Clophill in 1878. He lived at 7 Mount Pleasant, Back Street, although in 1911 he was a Greengrocer in Holloway. He married Nellie Matthews and they had 5 children. By 1939 was working as a Market Garden Labourer. He died locally in 1953.

Joseph Platt

Joseph was a Sapper in the Royal Engineers (Airline Section) who was originally from the Liverpool area. He volunteered in August 1914 and proceeded overseas the following year. He served on the front line in many parts of the Western Front and was engaged on important constructional duties. He was present at the Battles of the Somme, Cambrai, Arras and Ypres.

He was demobilised in March 1919 and received the 1914-15 Star, General Service and Victory medals. He lived at 11, the Strand, Clophill.

His daughter Doris was born in 1916 and married Jack Pitts, who lived with his family at Mount



Pleasant. Doris said she could remember her father flying over Clophill in an aeroplane and waving to her.

Her father was based at RAF Henlow. As Joseph had been in the Royal Engineers, this may have been post-War. In 1939 the family lived in 11 Mill Lane and Joseph worked as a Fitter. He died in 1968.

Clophill Community Care – CCC – has been in operation in our lovely village for the past 16 years. It comes under the auspices of the BRCC (Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity) and comprises a group of wonderful volunteers who respond to requests for help – usually for transport to medical appointments; perhaps to collect prescriptions, but could be for help with tuning televisions, light gardening, furniture lifting or even a lift to a 'just to get out' local destination - from the residents of Clophill. There are many folk who already know of our existence, but if you don't – and you need practical help then please phone us, or if you know of anyone else in the village who needs help, please pass our contact number on to them.

We do ask for a small contribution – currently £3 to local destinations or £5 to Bedford or Luton (Gooseberry Hill - £6 hospital) for return journeys.

We also run Thursday Leisure Club - TLC - in St. Mary's church on a Thursday afternoon from 2pm for a couple of hours or so. It gives a chance to get out, have a chat, a cup of tea and a biscuit or two, do a jigsaw, have a game of Scrabble or Rummikub, that kind of thing. It's for all ages, so, if you fancy a couple of hours to socialise, do come along. (Here we suggest a small donation of £1 to cover the heating and refreshment costs).

We were stunned and saddened by the sudden and unexpected death of one of our staunchest members, the much-loved John Langdon, on Oct 27th at the age of 86. The church was packed with friends and family for his funeral



on Nov 22nd. Several people gathered afterwards at his favourite watering hole, The Stone Jug, to wish him "bon voyage" and to celebrate a life well lived.

November has been a busy month. Following a second lively Family Praise Service in the morning of Nov 7th many people came to an All Souls' Service in the afternoon to remember family members who had died in the past few years. This was followed by tea and cakes and a chance to reminisce. It was much appreciated by all.

On Nov 11th we gathered at the War Memorial with the whole of St. Mary's School to honour the men who gave their lives in the two World Wars. The children behaved impeccably throughout and especially in the silence. On Remembrance Sunday more than 100 people attended the service which was led by The Archdeacon. Many more gathered outside for the Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial for the 2 minutes silence followed by the laying of poppy wreaths. We were delighted to see that the scaffolding and fencing had at last come down from around the church.

Our amazing Fund Raising Group has been busy planning events to help restore our depleted finances. On Nov. 19th 8 teams competed in a "Call my Bluff" style Wine Tasting evening, which raised a magnificent £450+. Thanks are due to the organisers and participants. In the pipeline are a Christmas Wreath making session on Nov 29th, a Christmas Lunch on Weds. Dec 15th from 12 noon.
