#### Come into the Garden

Now is a good time to review the garden, cutting back and tidying borders and making a note of any changes, additions or divisions you wish to make next spring. Leave seed heads on flowers and shrubs and delay cutting these back until late winter, as they provide a home for overwintering insects. Tidy



up leaves from around the garden. They can be added to the compost heap, or placed in separate bins or black sacks to make **leaf mould**. Some leaves, such as **plane** and **sycamore**, are slow to break down, and can delay you using your compost if you mix them into the general heap. Leaf mould makes an excellent soil improver and can also be used as a seed-sowing medium.

Digging the soil, especially bare patches, will expose pest larvae and eggs to birds and frost, as well as clearing weeds. Don't leave soil uncovered for too long, however, as it runs the risk of erosion and washing away of valuable nutrients. Add a mulch and this not only protects the soil over the winter, but the action of worms pulling the mulch into the depths will help improve the vitality of our sandy soils.

Perennials that flower after midsummer are best divided in the spring — that's a good general rule. Taking **root cuttings** is also a good way to make new plants for free and now is a good time to take root cuttings from perennials like **phlox**, **verbascum**, **oriental poppy**, **Japanese anamones** and **acanthus**.



Select young, vigorous roots,

about the thickness of a pencil, and cut them off, close to the crown of the plant. Only remove a maximum of 1 third of the roots and then replace the parent plant, as soon as possible, back into the border. Discard the thin root end and remove any fibrous side roots. Cut each root into 5-10cm (2-4in) lengths making a horizontal cut at the upper end and an angled cut at the lower end. Fill pots with a free draining compost - such as equal parts peat substitute and gritty sand or perlite. Insert the cuttings about 4cm (2in) apart so that the horizontal cut surface at the top of the root is just below the surface of the compost and then cover with a thin layer of grit. Water the compost lightly and place the pots in a sheltered space or coldframe outside. In the following spring, pot up into individual pots when the cuttings show signs of growth and are well rooted.

Lots of you have asked if I can make suggestions for tricky planting spots. Today its north and east facing walls and fences which can be dry, as they often have a rain shadow from overhanging house eaves. When planting in these areas make sure that you plant at least 45 cm (18in) away from the base of the wall. East facing walls get the sun first thing in the morning so during winter and early spring that can damage frosted plants. Plants to consider include **Pyracantha** (winter berries), **Clematis 'Nelly Moser'** or **Montana**, **Hydrangea anomala subsp. Petiolaris**. Plants for north facing walls and fences include **Crinodendron hookerianum** (the lantern tree), **Garrya** with its amazing winter catkins, **Mahonia's**, with their honey scented bright yellow flowers or **Akebia quinate** whose flowers smell of chocolate and vanilla. Shaded area ground coverplants include **Gaultheria procumbens** (wintergreen), **vinca major** (periwinkle), **cyclamen hederifolium** (autumn flowers), **Epimedium** (spring flowers) **Geranium macrorrhizum** (summer flowers), **Hosta's**, **Pulmonaria** (spring flowers) and **Tiarellas**.

## Reflections – Clophill in September 1977 Voices from the past

Continuing our series looking back at previous issues of Spotlight and Clophill Village life... By Julie Benson

Thank you to those folk who enlightened me the as to whereabouts of Sand Lane - it's the short stretch between the top of Readshill and the A6! October is Harvest Month - and the theme of October 1977's Spotlight was just that, even though most of the news was from September. The photo of harvesting in vesteryear on the cover shows "a group of Clophill locals farming in the grounds of Wrest Park



Silsoe." Further on there are Harvest Festival Services, a harvest poem, a harvest recipe (veg soup) and a harvest story for children. There are also advertisements for local events, one being (ticket price of £1.25) that of a 'Spotlight' fundraiser, their 10th Anniversary Buffet Dance, and dancing to our very own 'Home Brew'! Prior to this, the Methodist Church had celebrated their Harvest Festival when the lessons were read by Lyn Pressland (her mother was the brilliant cook at school), Christina Lammas and Anne Cooper. "In the unfortunate absence of Mrs Brown, Mrs Mason (music teacher at school) kindly played the organ at the services." St. Mary's Church held its Harvest Festival a few weeks later and again an auction was held, "in a very light-hearted manner by Mr John Robertson, ably assisted by Mr Dick Sheppard and Mr Mike Henman" this time in the Village Hall.

Wednesday, 14th September was a memorable one for Katy Bousted (now Gardner), Joanne Constance and Catherine Naylor. It was their last night as **Brownies** and were received into the guides by Guiders Mrs Gordon, Mrs Bodlily and Mrs Haw. Up at the **Old Church** "progress has been made for the legal transfer of the burial ground to the Parish Council, but this will not be completed for a while yet." There was a plea for willing helpers to help a paid parishioner to tend the burial ground. The **Village Hall Committee** heard that the annual expenses were about £2,000 and rising and they adopted the 'improving the heating and insulation' suggestions with a probable outlay of £750; with hiring charges kept at the same rate until March. There is interesting information about the **Flying Horse** – the name "derived from the winged horse 'Pegasus' an insignia associated with the coaching service". The grounds of the inn have since been used as a local bus garage and have housed the blacksmith's shop. The Inn has been tastefully renovated, without detracting from its 'old world' charm. **That was in 1977 – just look at it now!**

#### Our Value for November is: Compassion and Forgiveness

In school, we will learn that 'Compassion' and 'Forgiveness' have much in common but both are stronger in meaning than simply 'feeling sorry for' someone. We will discuss how the words have their roots in the idea of putting yourself in someone else's shoes and experiencing what they experience. It is not about 'doing good' or simply 'remembering those less fortunate than ourselves'. We will discover that Compassion requires an act of imagination and humility to share in the lives of others. We will be helping the children learn about this through imagining what it might be like in someone else's position and thinking about what we might be able to do in support of this.

At home, you may wish to help your child think about Compassion and Forgiveness when you share stories or experiences; you could discuss the actions of the characters, what led them to behave in a certain way, how they may have affected others, how it might have made them feel and how they might do things differently.

## Clephill Prescheel News

Hello everyone,

When I asked the staff what they have really enjoyed doing with the children this month, everyone gave me a different answer. How wonderful, to hear all these different ideas and activities from everyone, all coming from different angles, with different approaches and teaching different things. Our children are getting such a broad experience and being taught in so many different ways. Here are just some of the things they have been doing:

Baking our own snacks and exploring different recipes as we ensure our foods are low in sugar and vegan, the children follow instructions, weigh the ingredients, mix them together and take to Julia who cooks it for them, they then get to eat if for snack.

The poly tunnel is being decorated with branches of rosemary, feather mobiles and leaf 'ghosts', we have a growing collection of plants in there that children are caring for and learning the difference between indoor and outdoor plants.

They have been planting Christmas trees from seed (it might be a while before they can be harvested) and they are growing amaryllis and avocado stones.

Out in the glade spring bulbs have been planted and the children have been sweeping up the autumn leaves to keep the setting tidy.

Emma and the rest of the SEND team have spent lots of time exploring the autumn leaves making leaf prints and paintings, playing in the sand pit and doing lots of gross motor play.

Jemma used her rugby warm up exercise as a physical story telling time getting all the children involved. Kirsty has been conker rolling with the children, Becky has been showing them how to make bouquets with leaves and Kelly has been surrounded on the log as she reads stories.

As we look towards Christmas, we have enjoyed having parents in to help sort our resources for our Magical Woodland Walk and we have signed up our favourite Santa for the event. We are also delighted that Carolyn and the Flower Club are back to do wreath making again with our parents this month; we have missed them. It is a great opportunity to get our parents together and talking, this kind of activity allows for hands to be busy and minds to relax so people can build connections with each other. We are also employing Annette,



a counsellor, to work with our staff giving them a safe space to talk about their own mental health; she will also be doing some mindfulness workshops with them and the children and we hope to roll this out to the parents.

The Autumn term allows the children to experience such a huge change in their environment through the weather and the colours, from leafy green trees to bare branches. Our children are deep in

nature, exploring these differences, the wet and damp environment is just a different playground to them and one they enjoy as much as the dry and sunny. Their resilience is a wonderful thing to watch develop.

#### Nature Notes: What to see in the hedgerows and verges.

This is the season when autumn glides into winter, in some years more rapidly than others. It may seem a bleak season. Surely there cannot be much to see outside?

The trees will be completely denuded of leaves by mid-December. It is a time to appreciate their different shapes from the delicate silver birches, the sturdy oaks and other angular alders, all may be seen in our area. It is time too to notice the many evergreen trees and shrubs, look out for the yew trees by the churchyard and by the A6 bus stop full of red berries which are poisonous to humans but not to the blackbirds which dive right in to find food. Watch the ivies, they have a berry which is a godsend to the pigeons.

There are usually plenty of birds on our bird-tables in these months. We all know the greats tits and the smaller blue tits. Sometimes they are joined by a flock of long tailed tits.

Our resident bird population is increased by visitors from Scandinavia. You may see fieldfares in your garden or in the fields; they are like very large thrushes. Another member of the thrush family is the redwing, comparatively small with a flash of red under its wings. I once saw these among the trees opposite the hospital entrance in Britannia Road, Bedford. Once too, there were waxwings in Cainhoe Road. They look quite exotic and are uncommon visitors.

A common thrush may be heard singing on mild winter days, a foretaste of spring. There won't be many flowers in the verges, just an occasional stray.

But as you walk along our High Street notice the lovely moss on the walls. Hopefully it will have recovered from the summer drought.

#### Clophill's Serving Survivors of WW1

Continuing our series in celebration of Clophill's brave men who fought in and survived the first world war...

**Arthur Edward Stevens** was born in Clophill in about 1882, he lived with his parents-Samuel and Ann in the High Street. In 1901 he worked as a railway labourer. He married Bertha Pitts in 1909 and in 1911 they lived in Southgate and he worked as an insurance agent. He served as a Private in the 6th reserve section of the Royal Veterinary Corps. By 1939 the couple lived in Devon where he worked as a motor fitter. He died in Devon in 1939.

**Cecil Stimpson or Stimson**- born in 1881 in Clophill, son of Bennet (a church Sexton) and Sophia, brother to Frank below. In 1911 Cecil lived with his parents in the High Street, he worked as a market gardener. Cecil married Hilda Gudgin in 1915 and attested in 1916. After returning from the war Cecil lived the rest of his life at 1, Jacques Lane whilst working as a smallholder. He died in 1958 and is buried at the Old Church.

Frank Stimpson or Stimson was born in 1888 was younger brother of Cecil above. He married Elsie Claydon in 1913 and by 1915 was serving as a steward in the Merchant navy in Malta. He served aboard the Carisbroke Castle which had been Commandeered two days before the formal declaration of war, she started as a hospital ship with 439 beds, and crossed the English



Channel to bring wounded troops home from the Western Front. She shifted roles to that of an Army Troop Ship in the Mediterranean for most of the war.


After the war it is believed that Frank worked as a contractor's wages clerk and lived in Luton. He died in 1965.

Reginald Walter Stratton was born in Kempston in 1876. He married Annie Maud Quenby in Clophill in 1905. In 1911 Reginald was a verger, living with Annie in Bedford. He attested in 1915, firstly serving with the 3rd Battalion, Northampton Regiment, then the 3rd Royal Lancaster's and finally he became a Lance Corporal in the 201st Labour Corps, Royal Artillery Medical Corps. He served in Salonica with the Mediterranean Expeditionary Force. He was demobbed in 1919 and his papers state that at this time he was considered 20% disabled. His address in the 1920s until about 1935 was Back Street and later it was given as 12 The Slade and his occupation as Decorator (disabled). Reginald died locally in 1945.

## Clophill and District Flower Club October 2022 Report

Our October demonstrator was Gill McGregor, her theme 'Floral Flair & Fantasy'. Gill had visited our club before and members who had previous knowledge of her were really looking forward to the evening. They were not disappointed.

Phoenix Palm, Typhalaifloia (small bulrushes), twisted dried Aspidistra Leaves, and Tiger stemmed grasses gave height and depth to the first arrangement with beautiful, bright yellow Sun Flowers flowing through from top to bottom. Placed on a high pedestal with a second placement of sunflowers and foliage at the bottom.

A lesson in no foam holders followed. Aspidistra Leaves woven to look like a neck tie were used as a holder for the flowers. Bear grass, small Bulrushes, Taxus

Baccata (Yew), placed through the tie with gold bronze Calla Lilies as the focal flower. Placed with a second arrangement into silver cylinder holding vases

Hand held golden roses, fluffy tree Fern and white Gypsophila. Displayed in a glass bowl placed between the wings of a ornamental container together with a second placement. Absolutely beautiful.

A rustic twig container, adorned with Cockulas Laural, Pine, Yew, Birch sticks, Ivy flowers and leaves. Physalis (Chinese Lanterns), Carnations, Chrysanthemums, Leucospernum and small pumpkins brought Autumn into the room.



Large Aspidistra and Bergenia leaves formed a triangular outline in a low container together with Tree Fern, Yew and various foliage. Orange Gerbra and Carnations flowed high and low through the foliage. Shown against a background of all things nature and true colours of Autumn.

Lastly, beautiful tall drift wood, dried grasses, twisted Palms, red and white Bunksia, and large red Anthuriums. Adorned with Blue Parrot's depicted Paradise. The stage was a picture of beautiful Autumn colours together with Snowy Owls a Black cat a Scarecrow and a trip to Paradise.
