

Come into the Garden

Houseplants have become really popular over the last couple of years so this month I thought I would share some hits and tips on how you get the best from your indoor gardens. There are many



Try and keep house plants away from temperature fluctuations caused by draughts or central heating but at the same time look to maximise the amount of light your house plants receive. Repot any houseplants that have become top heavy or pot bound into slightly larger containers and while you are doing this also check for pests such as aphids, scale insects, thrips or mealybugs.

If you haven't already done so now is a good time to start feeding houseplants once a week with a liquid fertiliser. As the weather warms up you may also need to start watering more frequently, but do check the soil beforehand to make sure that you aren't waterlogging the compost. Leaves are the plants powerhouse, converting sunlight into energy and some, like snake plants, are particularly prone to collecting dust on their leaves. Stand the plant under the shower hose or give the leaves a wipe to remove the dust.

Do you have small black flies living in your house plant compost or hovering around your house plants? These are fungus gnats (sciarid flies), and while they are mostly harmless — adult gnats cause little or no harm to plants, they can become a nuisance at home. Getting rid of these flies is easier than you might think. Applying a gravel mulch to the top of the compost and letting the compost dry out slightly between watering is often enough to stop them breeding in your houseplants compost.

Taking cuttings is a great way to increase your plants. Choose healthy shoots of new growth and cut lengths of roughly 10-20cm. Cut below a leaf joint with a sharp knife and remove the lower leaves to ensure a clean stem for submerging in water. Push the base of the cuttings into a jam jar or glass of water filled to the rim with water and then stand it in a warm, bright position. Keep the water topped up and within a few weeks you should see white roots emerging from the stems. Once a good root system has developed, pot the cuttings in compost to grow on. Remember to keep the compost moist and pinch out tips to encourage bushy plants. Lots of our most loved houseplants can be propagated this way including African violets, cane-stemmed begonias, coleus, cyperus, impatiens, ivy, rubber plants, verbena, Philodendron scandens and tradescantia.

According to a survey carried out by Gardeners World Magazine, the top 10 houseplants in the UK include Spider plants, Aspidistras, Monsteras, Philodendrons, Rubber plants, Chrysalidocarpus, Pilea peperomioides, Sansevierias, Maidenhair fern and Streptocarpus.

On the gardening front, April has been a challenging month, but as we move into May its worth keeping an eye on the weather as it is easy to be caught out by frost. Don't automatically give up on a plant that has been frost damaged. Many plants can be surprisingly resilient and may well rejuvenate from dormant buds at or below soil level. This takes time so recovery may not be seen until early summer. If the plant is of high value or it is not essential to fill the gap, consider leaving the damaged plant in the ground until mid-summer. If no re-growth has appeared by then, replace the plant. Once no more frost is expected, prune out damaged growth, cutting to an undamaged sideshoot or bud and then feeding the plant to stimulate new growth.

Clophill's Serving Survivors of WW1

Continuing our series in celebration of Clophill's brave men who fought in and survived the first world war...

3 brothers Isaac, Arthur and George Webb probably provided 8 sons for the war effort. It is thought their cousins provided 5 more. Sadly, one of the sons did not survive the war. Isaac and Eliza Webb had 6 sons that served in WW1. The family lived at 11 Jacques Lane. The menfolk were mostly farm Labourers, although Lewis was a carpenter and Albert a milkman. All the sons were born in Clophill.

Albert Webb was born in 1879. He married Florence in 1900 and by 1911 they were living in Ealing. Albert enlisted in 1916 (aged nearly 37yrs) and served in France with the Army Service Corps (Motor Transport) as a Lorry Driver. He was 5' 5.25" tall and was described as sober, reliable & intelligent. Whilst on leave in 1916 he sported a much admired goat skin! Unfortunately, he faced a disciplinary action whilst serving near Cologne in 1919 as he was "improperly dressed" – he was not wearing a belt! He was demobbed later that year.

By 1939 Albert and Florence lived in Suffolk, where he worked as a Fish Merchant. He died in Bury St Edmunds in 1956.

Sidney Webb was born in 1886. He was 5' 6" tall and had blue eyes with brown hair. He had joined the Kings Royal Rifle Co. in 1903, aged 18. He spent time with his unit in Bermuda where he suffered with rheumatic fever. His officers described him as being good, sober and hardworking. He was also a keen sportsman. Later he became a Sergeant and was sent to France in 1914 and his exploits were regularly reported in Ampthill News. In 1915 he had written to say that "as a sniper several Germans had realised the accuracy of his rifle." And later that year he informed his parents that he and 5 others from his company were cut off from their comrades by the enemy; but after 2 days of hot pursuit and severe privation they had succeeded in re-joining their regiment. In May he tells his mother that he had had a bullet pass through the collar of his coat, but it fortunately only grazed his neck, but he was "hearty and well." Later in May he lets his family know he has been slightly wounded in the face and back by shrapnel. He came home briefly in October 1915 and brought his blood-stained bayonet with him! In 1916 he was temporarily hospitalised but soon returned to "sniping." His term of service expired in 1916 and it is not known if he reenlisted. In 1939 he was still working as a Market Gardener's Labourer, still living at 11 Jacques Lane with his father. He died locally in 1955.

Ernest Webb was born in 1889. He was a sapper in the Royal Engineers. After the war he returned to Jacques Lane until 1922. It is thought he married Mabel Gardner and moved to Rugby where he worked on the railways and that he died in that area in 1971.

William Thomas Webb was born in 1893. He was employed by the Burgoynes in Maulden. William enlisted in 1915 and was a Private in the 6th Battalion, Leicestershire Regiment. He served in France - near Etaples where he suffered a shrapnel wound to his hand in 1917 and later that year a gunshot wound to his arm and head. William seems to have had time keeping issues as he was disciplined for overstaying his leave by 1 day in 1917 and in 1918 he was absent from parade for 1.5 hours! He was demobilised in 1919. After the war he returned to Jacques Lane until 1930. It is believed that by 1939 William lived at 7 The Green, with his wife Kate. He was working as an assistant to a Waterworks Engineer.

Lewis James Webb was born in 1896. He worked for Lord Lucas (owner of Wrest Park) and was a keen sportsman. Lewis enlisted with the Bedfordshire Regiment in 1911, where his age was given as 17. He became a Private in the Loyal N. Lancs. His character was described as "steady and reliable." He returned from the war to live at Jacques Lane until 1922. Nothing further is known about Lewis.

Percy Cyril Webb was born in 1898. Percy was a Fitter in the Royal Field Artillery. When he returned from the war he lived with his father and brothers in Jacques Lane until 1925. He married lyy Woodland and worked at Vauxhall Motors. Percy died in 1983.

Isaac's brother Arthur lost his son Walter Webb in February 1917. Walter was born in Clophill in 1881 and by 1901 was living in Haynes with his parents and siblings. He worked as a horse keeper. He married Jane Maynard in 1906 and in 1911 they lived in Leverstock Green, Hemel Hempstead with their daughter Ethel. The couple had a son in 1909 but he did not survive the year. Walter worked as a paper mill hand. Walter became a Lance Corporal with the 4th Bedfordshire. He was killed in action in 1917. His pension records show he had another daughter who was just 2 yrs old at the time of his death. His widow's address was given as Bedford.



Their brother George saw his son also named George survive the war.



George jnr. was born to Ann in Clophill in 1878. His father died in 1884. In 1891 he lived with his mother and stepfather in Cricklewood. He enlisted as a driver for 12 years in the Royal Artillery in 1899 and in 1901 he was living in Barracks in Leeds. His occupation at the time of enlistment was given as a labourer. His height 5' 5" and his eyes brown. His character was described as good. George married Emily Fellowes in 1905. Sadly, the couple lost a daughter in infancy and a son aged just 8 yrs, they had 2 other children who survived to adulthood. By

1911 the family had moved to Yorkshire where George worked as a coalminer. It is not clear what role George played in WW1 but it is likely he served in view of his previous service. 1939 they still lived in Yorkshire and George worked as a driver on a farm. George died in Wimbledon in 1950.

Our Value for May is Wisdom (Understanding) and Critical Thinking

In school: children will continue to be encouraged to ask questions when they do not understand, especially in their lessons. The importance of speaking and listening will be emphasised as a crucial part of the learning process. We will promote the understanding that we should all be working towards peace in our world starting with ourselves as individuals. We will use stories and examples of occasions when people have not listened to instructions carefully, have therefore misunderstood and the resulting unfortunate consequences.

At home, you should encourage your children to ask questions if they do not understand and make sure that they listen to your explanations. Try to back up requests with reasons so as to promote understanding. You could also share the story 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers. It demonstrates how long it takes for the boy to understand his friend the penguin and how important this understanding was in the end. You could also watch 'Giraffes Can't Dance' by Giles Andrae on You Tube and see how Gerald the Giraffe eventually learns to dance by listening to and understanding instructions.

Hello everyone,

We have been busy in our allotment. Lynne has been in to host a coffee morning in the community allotment, helping parents to weed and sow the beds with vegetables we hope to harvest for our summer shop. It's a great way to get our parents together, meeting each other and doing a mindful activity in the open air.

The children have also been gardening, over spring they planted sunflower seeds, put peas in the ground and tended the strawberry patch. They have now been digging up some strawberry plants and potting into compostable pots to take home. They have also been weeding our beds to get them ready for more planting as the weather warms, hopefully our purple basil and dill can be planted out soon.

We have bought some new books this term, using money raised from our Easter Stay and Play Egg Hunts, covering a

range of topics including flora and fauna, in keeping with our curriculum based in



nature, as well as other books to support our children's wellbeing from stories about being peg fed to rhyming books that celebrate our different bodies.

Over the Easter holidays we put in one of the largest resources yet...a piano. It sits outside on the stage and the children have been learning the rules of how to use it safely and with care. Our SEND children have particularly enjoyed listening carefully to staff playing up and down the scales.

A fledgling robin came and joined us in the polytunnel this week; the children learned all about it and sang it to sleep while they had their lunch. Our new signs have been going up offering interesting information about flora, fauna and clouds.

We promote Healthy Movers at preschool, a UK initiative from the Youth Sport Trust, the programme is designed to support two to five-year-old's physical literacy, development and wellbeing, helping them gain a better start in life. Mastery of physical skills empowers children, supporting their path to effective writing and encouraging them to understand the importance of exercise and a balanced diet that will help our children to live long healthy lives. 
Partnership Coordinator for the Greensand Country Landscape Partnership, which organises the annual festival, Daniel Bowles says:



Our April demonstrator was Doug Howard. His title 'Nature's Angles'. Doug is a valued member of our club and an Area Demonstrator. Our Members were looking forward to a colourful evening of flowers and chat. They were not disappointed.



Aspidistra and Fatsia leaves caught by the frost, turning them brown, were used against a beautiful drift wood sphere on a wooden base. Tall Pussy Willow, Arum Lily leaves and graceful Ferns, together with blue Iris, green Hellebores and yellow Daffodils, lovely spring design arranged in a pin holder and no foam.

A tall black metal twisted stand held a high arrangement of yellow Salix Caprea (Pussy Willow), golden Roses, yellow and orange Gerbera. Bergenia leaves, Spotted Laurel and ferns against a trellis of tall Bamboo canes. A lower placement repeating the roses, Gerbera and pussy willow together with Dianthus (green tricks). Green Midelino canes to the side of the arrangement took the eye in that direction while the roses were placed to take the eye upward toward the top arrangement.

Natural, rustic birch sticks secured into a wooden base. Pussy Willow and Virginia Creeper was woven though the sticks to resemble a bird nest. Into this were placed glass tubes to hold the flowers and water. A design with blue, red and mauve Freesias, yellow Daffodils and soft ferns. Simple but beautiful and no foam.

A three-tier arrangement included Twisted Palms, Fatsia Leaves, golden Yew and Fern. Mauve Alliums, salmon pink Elegance Astroemera and crimson Wax Flowers. Tall slim foliage took the eye from the bottom arrangement up through the second, then to the third tier.

A panel of black wrought iron, with white Midelino canes, rope webbing and cork screw hazel twigs woven through and around the panel in bands. A beautiful stem of green Phalaenopsis Orchids wired across the panel with a single flower from the stem and three green and white Puff Ball flowers on the opposite side. Flowers were set in water tubes, again no foam.

Lastly, an arrangement with gold Gerbera, white Carnations, purple Lisianthus, red Naomi Roses. Glossy green leaves, curled and twisted into shapes and gold foliage. A second small, similar arrangement above. With the deep purple, red and white flowers the design was fit for a king which was represented with a royal crown to celebrate the forthcoming coronation of Charles III.

Reflections – Clophill in May 1978—Voices from the past

Continuing our series looking back at previous issues of Spotlight and Clophill Village life... By Julie Benson

This month, I am looking through the June edition of 'Outlook' 1978, and, on its cover is this rather lovely photograph of a dog cart, perhaps part of the Summer



Fete procession mentioned later, but what other activities took place in May that year? Let's start with a **wheelbarrow race**, which started "at the 'Rising Sun', just before lunchtime on Sunday 14th May. The event, which was to raise funds for the Summer Fete, took a route along the High Street to 'The Compasses' (now a family home), 'The Green Man' (in a bit of a sad state at present), around The Green, up Cainhoe Road and along Back Street to 'The Stone Jug' (best pub in the

country). Each competitor had to drink half a pint of beer at each pub en-route. This was kindly donated by the publicans, to whom the committee is sincerely grateful." Fete preparations were well underway and the itinerary tells us that "The procession will leave the Village Green at 2.00pm then travel via Cainhoe Road, Readshill and Back Street, to arrive at the Village Hall at approx. 2.30p.m. The Fancy Dress will then be judged by Mrs Hedley Lobb, and following this, the fete will be officially opened by the Carnival Princess, Amanda Walker." Other May activities are also recorded like one organised by St. Mary's P.T.A: "A meeting was held in the **School Hall** on Wednesday, 17th May, when a talk was given by members of the school staff about how local children were taught to read and write. The P.T.A. would like to thank Mrs. Roberts and her staff for the hard work they had put into the evening." At the Parish Council meeting on 25th May, "Mr Melvin Hughes was elected Chairman and Mrs W. Dawson Vice-Chairman for the 1978/79 session." Now, this was not just a change of Chairman, it was quite a momentous occasion as, on page 11 you will read; "There can be few of the older inhabitants of Clophill Village, who do not know that Mr. George Chisholm, of Speeds Dairy Farm, is the Chairman of Clophill Parish Council, and has been for more than 20 years. There can be few organisations and committees in the village, with which he has not at some time been involved, giving of his advice and experience, and also in the practical way as a farmer, helping with transport and equipment.

Like many others, who have voluntarily served the community, George came on the scene because he felt something was going wrong. In those early days it was through his interest in sport, that the recreation field became his first major concern. After this came the long search for a site for a Village Hall. The saga of promises, aspirations and final positioning of the Hall in Kiln Lane has been his concern from the very outset.

About this time, the parish expanded enormously with the building of Warren View Estate, followed by Town Shott and a new Village School. Coincident with all these activities came the width restriction on traffic in the High Street. Newcomers to the village can only appreciate the anxiety of parents taking small children to school, with transporters and Sainsbury vans continually moving through the High Street. Finally came the building of the Shefford-Maulden bypass. All these events have occurred during the long period that George Chisholm has been Chairman of the Parish Council. Now he has decided to retire from this office." As you can appreciate warm thanks were expressed to George – he did see a lot of change didn't he – and we have a lot to thank him for too!

The meeting on the 25th April, with the lighter nights, was the first this year to be held at the village hall, with a shorter agenda than usual.



Items discussed included the County Wild life site at Readshill, which is a sanctuary for some rare and endangered wild flowers in Bedfordshire. The council resolved to move forward with digital information boards, with QR codes, and to have a funded volunteer day later in the year to give the site some much needed help in clearing invasive species. We are also moving forward with applying for funding to get water to the Townshott allotment site. Fingers crossed the Lottery funding will be successful.

The Parish Election for Clophill has been uncontested, so there will be no ballot. We do have a vacancy for 1 councillor which will be advertised from the 9th May, please contact the clerk for details if you are interested in becoming a councillor.

As the Coronation weekend approaches, the village has three events to look forward to, the Animal Encounter for the Children on Saturday, the Street Party in Back Street on Sunday in partnership with the Stone Jug, and the Picnic at Clophill House on the Monday. Coronation mugs have already been distributed by CPC to the Preschool and Lower School Children. Older children can grab theirs at one of the above events.
