Come into the Garden

With Kate Gardner

Welcome to June with and to one of the busiest months in the Garden. As I'm writing this, the RHS Chelsea Flower Show is in full swing and this year there is a big push towards all things



sustainable. Lots of ideas come from the show gardens, but how about the trend for growing weeds. Who knew that we all have the makings of a 2023 Chelsea Garden! Whatever your thoughts on weeds it's great to see a trend towards a more relaxed style of gardening. If you have been following No Mow May then you should be starting to see a whole raft of wild flowers appear which in turn will attract a wide of insects to your gardens.

The 'June gap' is a strange phenomonom. The term refers to a period when there is a sudden reduction in the amount of pollen and nectar around to feed honeybees. This is a problem for bees because in May, the colonies of many bee species are growing rapidly. Honey bees will be reaching peak colony size and bumblebees will have their workers out in force.

During spring, in addition to many early flowering herbaceous plants flowering there are vast volumes of pollen and nectar produced from trees and hedges; especially from the Hawthorn. In May, the rapeseed flowers can bring a serious glut, but suddenly in June this can all be over and the grass is starting to suppress many of the wild flowers. By the middle of July many of the tall herbaceous plants start to flower and often go on until September, but the challenge is what to do to bridge the gap.

This is where our gardens come into their own. With some careful plant choices, it is possible to not only have a beautiful garden, but also provide a food haven for our bees and other pollinators.

Hebe, Choiysia, Pyracantha and Cotoneaster all are popular with bees and are good for providing shape and structure to our gardens. Ceonothus or Californian Lilac is one of my favourites, with its flowers ranging from the palest blue to an incredible deep bluey purple. Right now, in my garden the Nepeta, perennial Geraniums, Campanulas, Thymes, Sage, red Valerian, Wall flowers, and Osteospurmums are in bloom attracting large numbers of bees. As June progresses the lavender, sweet Williams and blue Echinops thistles will add to the mix.

June 21 is the longest day of the year, and the extra light and warmth also means weeds will sprout up from seemingly nowhere. Keep on top of them by hoeing regularly in dry conditions and add mulch around your plants. Not only will it help to keep the weeds down but all mulches will help to keep the soil moist and reduce the amount of watering.

Hanging Baskets and planters are starting to make an appearance too. Argyranthemum, Lysimachia (creeping jenny), Dichondra 'Silver Falls', Fuchsia, Pelargonium (geraniums), Lobelia, Viola (pansies), Petunia, Salvia and Nicotiana (tobacco plants) are great for adding colour while being good for the bees too.

Hanging baskets rely most on the gardener to ensure they do not dry out, so to ensure that your baskets look their best throughout the whole summer make sure that you use enough water to keep the baskets moist, but not soggy and give them a liquid fertiliser feed once a week.

Clophill's Serving Survivors of WW1

Continuing our series in celebration of Clophill's brave men who fought in and survived the first world war...

Alfred Webb gave his address as Beadlow for the Absent Voter's Register; however his family connection cannot be proven. He may have been a son of Henry & Sarah Webb who lived at Beadlow and lost two sons, Augustus and Herbert in the Great War. Alfred was a Private, Motor Transport., Aux. Patrol Co., Army Service Corps.

Bertie John Webb was born in 1894 in Clophill. In 1911 he worked as a gardener and lived on the High Street with his parents William and Ann Case. He was a Driver with Royal Army Service Corps (Motor Transport) and he volunteered in June 1915, being transferred overseas the following month. While on the Western Front he undertook transport duties in the Loos, Arras, Cambrai and Somme sectors. He received the 1914-15 Star and the General Service Medal and the Victory Medal. The military records for the end of the War give his address as The Nook, (now 2 Mill Lane) – the same address as Len Izzard. Bertie was a first cousin of Frank and Walter below. It is thought that he married Sarah Jane Tunn in 1918 and that the couple emigrated to Australia in 1921 where he died in the 1960s.

It is possible that Bertie's brother – Walter Fredrick died in Palestine in 1917. The records seem a little confused as they have been amended to a different regimental number – 210419 and 201419. The correction shows the mother as a widow named Ada, and his birth place as London, however Bertie's and Walter's father was still alive at this time. The original record shows Walter as living in Lilley at the time of his supposed death, having been born in Clophill in 1891. There is a W F Webb on Lilley's war Memorial. In 1911 "our" Walter lived as a boarder near Tunbridge Wells and worked as a gardener.

Levi and Sarah Webb had two sons who served and survived. Both sons were born in Clophill. The family lived in 81 High Street Clophill. **Continued** >>

Frank Webb was born in 1894. He enlisted with the Bedfords and was then connected to the 7th Royal Fusiliers Intelligence Dept. He served on the Somme and by 1917 had served for 2 years in France. In 1918 he was gassed at Armentiers. Later that year he was "back in the thick of it." It was reported in November 1918 that "on one occasion he had just dressed 2 wounded comrades, and was rendering other assistance when a shell burst close to them and killed them both, leaving him unhurt."

Frank married Ivy Odell in 1922 and by 1939 they were living in Ampthill and he was working as a Public Works Contractor. It is believed that he died in Biggleswade in 1973.

Levi Walter Webb (known as Walter) was born in 1884. In 1901 he was working on a farm in Ripley, Derbyshire, but by 1911 he had returned to Clophill. He enlisted in 1915 and was a Gunner in Railway Construction Troops Depot in the Royal Engineers. He served in Mesopotamia in 1916 and Salonica in 1917. Walter lived in The Nook – now 2 Mill Lane with Violet (neé Sutton) his wife. After the war the family moved to Clayhill Cottages, Maulden, where in 1939 Walter was a Forestry worker. He died in 1956.

William Webb lived on the High Street and was a Private in the 692 Agricultural Company, Labour Corps. It is probable that William is the brother of Bertie John (on the previous page) and was born in 1879 in Clophill. By 1901 he was working as a Groom in Uckfield and in 1911 as a Gardener in Welwyn. It is believed he married Jeanie Rae Hope in 1915 and by 1939 was living in Luton with his family, working as a Floor Cleaner. It is thought that William died in 1958.

How fitting that the cover picture on July's edition of 'Outlook' is of Elizabeth Brennan, the Carnival Princess Amanda Walker and Donna Dobrolowski on the float taking them to the Village Hall on – yes guess which day – Saturday 17th June – the very date when this year's Village Fete is taking place in the Church grounds! OK, so we now no longer hold a fete procession down the High Street, a fancy dress



competition or dog show, but we do have stalls, refreshments "and plenty of enjoyment for all the family". While the "rather overcast and very windy conditions" of forty-five years ago will not be welcome, it would be lovely to welcome any of the then fancy-dress winners, among them - Lisa Armitage, Adrian Puddephat, Sharon Collis, Michael Page, Ian Bousted, Jane & Nicholas Moore and Jason & Claire Cranswick.

The 20 Grand Draw prizes look good too (as are ours as always) - perhaps a Teas made, a camera, whisky, bathroom scales, cigar case & cigars or a basket of vegetables (I just love to compare what was so special then to what we do now. Fascinating!). "After a quick and general clearance of the Hall, the Committee prepared for the Fete Dance. Dancing was to the lively music of 'The Megatones'." What has struck me with all of this reminiscing is the amount of work the very active **Village Hall Committee** put in to make money for the Village Hall and on this occasion, to create a great day for the village. Thank you for giving us a 'new' hall and now a 'Hub', although I am not sure who comprises the Committee; apart from Steve Langhorn. Perhaps he might welcome a load more support?

But back now to the July 1978 'Outlook' and the **Guides** entertained 'parents and members of the Brownie Pack to a display of Country Dancing, hoping to gain their entertainer badge.' Then 'Twenty members of the company, with their 3 Guiders, went to Hundred's Farm, Woburn, for a weekend camp. The weather was cold and blustery" (They had a good time though.) Just across the A6, the **'Commander in Chief'** welcomed new licensees, Babs and Alan Wicks, who wished "their predecessors Eileen and Dennis Garrard a very happy retirement".

WI members enjoyed a Mystery Coach outing round "beautiful Hertfordshire villages and country lanes to St. Albans Abbey" where they had a conducted tour. "The title for the June meeting of the **Clophill and District Flower Club** was 'Treasures of the World'. The demonstrator was Mrs. L. F. Sturdy of Luton." The **Parish Council** asked the "Residents of Mill Lane not to park their cars to obstruct access to the Village Hall.

Parishioners in general are asked to show consideration when parking in the village." (Some things haven't changed!) "Holly Bush (Field to the North of Back Street Quarry) has been let to a new tenant and been ploughed. A footpath has been left around the edge of the field and people are asked to use this, instead of the right of way across the middle, and an appeal is to be lodged regarding the development of the Old Pig Farm on the High Street.

At the **Village Hall Management** meeting, it was decided to raise the insurance cover to £30,000 for building and £4,000 for contents; £10 was to be spent on new wire for the fence, a new manhole cover with keys is to be bought, up to £15; and soil for landscaping to be purchased up to £10. "A 'pay phone' has been installed and can be used during hall bookings at the discretion of the hirers."

To end on something lovely, "Pupils of St. Mary's School had time off from their lessons on Thursday 8th June, when they gathered in the new school hall with members of staff to give **heartfelt farewell to the Rev and Mrs Cousins**, on their retirement. The Rev. Cousins and his family came to Clophill in 1971. They soon became involved in the spiritual interest of the parish and built up the congregation, started a new Sunday School and were involved with major repair works to the church." They were wished well in their new life in Weston Super Mare. (Well deserved.)

Clophill Lakes Update

Clophill Lakes - wildlife is thriving!

As the season moves towards summer, the Clophill Lakes site is now teeming with wildlife! Our ecologist



visits the site regularly and spotted a **greenwinged orchid** in the grassland (pictured) – it



seems to be a good year for them! On the bird front a **cuckoo** is definitely back on site, as well as quite a few **sand martins**, **house martins**, **swifts and swallows** swooping over the lake as they feed. An **oystercatcher** was also heard but couldn't be seen!

A female **wheatear** was seen around the dry lichen area. This is a small mainly ground-dwelling bird that hops and runs on the ground – nice to think Clophill Lakes is providing a good stop for it on its migration from central Africa.

A **grasshopper warbler** was heard calling – it has a very distinctive call, like a fishing reel unwinding fast. It's on the Red List of endangered species so we were particularly pleased to hear this!

Our ecologist has been surveying **skylarks** and reports there are fewer skylarks than last year but more **meadow pipits**. She says this isn't really surprising as there's another year's growth meaning the habitat is getting less suitable for one and more so for the other – although once the cattle are grazing on site this will hopefully make it better for skylarks again.

Dogs on lead please! The arable field where the public footpath runs alongside has nesting skylarks, meadow pipits and possibly grey partridge at the moment — all nest on the ground and so dogs running about in there would really disturb them. When the adults are disturbed from the nests the eggs and chicks are vulnerable to crows so we advise dog walkers to please keep their pets on a lead when passing by to protect these bird species.

Acorn Nursery news

from Mrs. Hayes our Nursery Manager & Early Years Leader:

We had so much fun when we celebrated the Kings Coronation. We looked inside Buckingham palace online and, when the children saw how beautiful it was, it inspired their imaginations and they wanted to make our own palace. We found some boxes and they were all very creative putting one together then decorating it with lots of paint, gems, practicing using scissors to cut out soldiers and other royal pictures to add on as well as home-made flags. We talked about what a King may look like and drew our own King on the Smartboard together the children had lots of very interesting ideas; he had a yellow and purple crown, a brown beard, lots of fingers and three legs!! We also joined the whole school celebrations and decorated biscuits and crowns which we ate and wore in the afternoon for our special school Coronation picnic. The children thought the story of the 'King's Pants' read by Mrs. Bingley was very funny.

We have been exploring all about mini beasts and their anatomy. We have been busy creating mini beasts with junk modelling resources as well as playdough using googly eyes, straws and pipe cleaners. We looked at pictures of mini beasts to see details of what to create and then made these as well as creating our own mini beasts — deciding how many eyes, legs, arms, wings, they would have. We've pretended to be birds looking for wiggly worms hiding in some soil, using tweezers and coat pegs to get them out. We then discussed who had the longest, the shortest and the most worms. We made a big butterfly by painting one side and then folded it over to make it symmetrical which everyone was fascinated to discover!

We are very proud to announce that following a recent inspection by Ofsted on 24th April that we have been awarded OUTSTANDING for the second time. We are very proud of our fantastic team of staff and of course our children and hugely supportive parents.

Our newly revised nature curriculum was very well received and lauded as an 'innovative curriculum' offering 'exciting play experiences that inspire children to explore and learn'. Some good examples this month have been the children measuring and cutting straws to fit old bean tins to make bee hotels as they celebrated Bee Day, they learned how vital bees are to our planet. They have been



playing rhyming cards games and picture bingo to develop language skills, as well as weaving to help promote fine motor for writing.

They created nail art, Sarah hammered in nails to a piece of wood in the shape of a bird and the children wrapped thread round and round, following the shape to create the image.

We have been planning our village tea party when we invite members of Clophill community to visit us, the children are making invitations and planning what food they will make. Mentioned in our Ofsted report about how are children are 'fully involved in community life, helping them develop a strong sense of belonging.'



We were amazed at the high numbers of children and their families attended our coronation event despite the rain! Our Friday children sawed and drilled wooden medals and braided red, white and blue key rings to sell on the day. They made nearly £25 and are going on a trip to the shop for ice-creams one Friday.



In May we held an Open Meeting when we have many visitors and members to come and enjoy watching a National Demonstrator who is given a large flower





David Thomson from Chelmsford was our demonstrator and he was very flamboyant and entertaining. His designs were mainly monochrome as he like to use shades and tints of one colour in each arrangement so that everything harmonises. His flowers were unusual, large and mainly exotic. He used beautiful pink antirrhinums that he wove into a large circular frame and them some orchids on another frame. These did not require floral foam as we are encouraged to use it more sparingly.

David created a large exotic design in a big pot and put in birds of paradise flowers and gerbera.

He placed sunflowers into a yellow container to make a really sunny design. In a white design he used some rose lilies that were most unusual as they are a double with frilly centres and no stamens to drop pollen that stains. Everyone loved his last design that has several

placements all in shades of lilac and purple and he received a standing ovation!

In June we have another gentleman from Essex coming to entertain us. David Wright and his title is 20/20 A Vision, so we will have to see what that brings!

Anyone is welcome to attend our meetings at the Village Hall on the 1st Thursday of each month and they will receive a warm welcome.

On 17th June we will be holding a plant stall at the Village Fete at St Mary's Church in aid of our charity for 2023 and we hope to have lots of plants, cuttings and seedlings. Any donations would be gratefully received.
