



Come into the Garden

There's lots of jobs to think about over the summer, as Spotlight takes a break until September, so this time I've concentrated on



Some of my favourite plants are at their best during July. Delphiniums, Agapanthus, lavender, various Clematis, Achillea, Nepeta, late flowering Peonies, Day Lily, Roses, Sweet peas and Honeysuckle are all blooming and the garden is full of beautiful scents. To keep summer plants and bedding at its best and to prolong flowering, it is essential to dead head. The purpose of dead heading is to encourage more flowers. If the flower heads are left on, then the plant switches to seed production and is then very reluctant to flower again. Dead heading, which is cutting off the spent flower head, forces the plant back into the cycle to produce flowers again. Cut the spent flower off just above a leaf node which is where your new flowers will break from.

For some plants, it can be easier to take the shears to the top growth and very often a second growth and flush of flowers will follow, as with Alchemilla mollis and hardy geraniums. This looks drastic but is a great way of rejuvenating these plants.

Early flowering perennials can begin to look a bit tired by July and their foliage is becoming tatty and brown. If these plants are cut back now, many will produce fresh green growth to liven up the border and sometimes even a second flush of flowers. Good candidates for this treatment are Oriental poppies, Alchemilla, hardy geraniums, and Nepeta. Cut back close to the ground, feed and wait a couple of weeks. It can look a bit bare when you first to this and if you don't like the sight of too much earth, cut back just before you go on holiday.

Now is also a good time to prune early summer-flowering shrubs such as philadelphus, flowering current and weigela after they've blossomed, so they can put on new growth this year that will hold the flowers next summer. As well as cutting back for shape, look for any damaged or dead shoots and cut them out.

There's still time to plant summer bulbs for very late flowers. Try gladioli with deep colours including dark purple Gladiolus 'Espresso' or the beautiful Gladiolus communis subsp. byzantinus with its magenta flowers.

And this month is the perfect time to plant bulbs that will bring colour in autumn; for instance, Autumn crocus, amaryllis and nerine will flower in September and October. The nerines are particularly welcome as they have all the brightness of the early summer blooms with their blasts of pink and white and can make a real difference to the garden as winter draws in.

If you want to make some new plants for free, now is a great time to take softwood cuttings. Material is taken from the soft and flexible young shoot tips, which has the highest rooting potential of any stem cutting and often provides the best chance of rooting species that are difficult to propagate. Soft plant material loses moisture rapidly, so care needs to be taken to prevent wilting, placing cuttings in a plastic bag as you take them is a great way of reducing the moisture loss.

Penstemon, Pelargonium, Fuschia, Hydrangea, Lavender and Argyranthemum are just some of the plants that work.

And finally if you are looking at creating a flower meadow in your lawn remember that you will need to sow some Yellow Rattle seed to help reduce the vigour of the grass roots.

Clophill's Serving Survivors of WW1

Continuing our series in celebration of Clophill's brave men who fought in and survived the first world war...

William West was born in Clifton in 1892 and by the age of 14 was working as a farm labourer. He married Ethel Emily Sharman in 1915 and it is thought that they had at least 2 children. William enlisted in 1916, he served with the Bedford's, the Middlesex Regiment and with the 9th Battalion East Surrey regiment. He was quickly sent overseas but received a gun shot wound to the face in June 1917 and was wounded again in September that year in the right arm and chest. He resumed his duties and served in the field throughout 1918. He was demobbed in 1920. It was noted that he had 3 disciplinary issues; he made an unauthorised alteration to his clothing; he was absent from the Tattoo; and he left a working party without permission. His address through the 1920s was given as 96/Auckland Cottages, High Street, Clophill. In 1939 his occupation is given as Builder's Labourer and his address as Shefford Road, Clophill. It is believed that he died locally in 1980.

William George Whittamore was born in Clophill in 1888 and the family lived on Silsoe Road, later on the High Street. His father, James, was a Carpenter. His mother was called Ann. He was often referred to as "George" rather than William. He enlisted in Coldstream in 1914 in the King's Own Scottish Borderers. At the time his occupation was given as a gardener. He was 5' 3.5". He was posted to France in February 1915 having been promoted to the rank of Lance Corporal. He received a severe shrapnel wound the following month and returned to England until November 1915, when as a Corporal he returned to France. He had been a patient in Leicester Hospital. He remained in France until February 1918, being promoted to Sergeant in January 1916.

He received a commission in February 1918 and left the Army later that year as a 2nd Lieutenant, having been awarded the Military Medal. At the time of his commission he had been transferred to the Machine Gun Corps. In 1919 it is believed he married Hilda Wrench locally. They went on to live in the Hampstead area and later Reigate. William died in Old Windsor in 1975.

Hubert Whittamore lived on the High Street and was a Private in the 9th Cheshire Regiment per the Absent Voters Register. He was born in 1885 in Clophill and in 1901 lived in Silsoe Road with his parents and siblings. In 1911 he was an Apprentice Carpenter (his father was a Carpenter). William George (previous page) was one of his older brothers. He joined up in November 1915 as a mechanic (carpenter) in the Royal Flying Corps but later he was a sapper in the East Africa Royal Engineers, spending some time in East Africa. Later, he was transferred to the Cheshire Regiment and served in France. In 1939 he was living at 123 Clophill Road, Maulden with his wife, Lilian, and their daughter, Daphne (later Goodhall). Hubert died in 1960.

Fredrick Willison was born in 1895, it is thought his mother was Louisa Willison. He served as a Private in the 4th Bedfordshire Regiment. He volunteered in November 1915 and was drafted to the Western Front the following July. He fought in various engagements including Ypres, the Somme, Beaumont-Hamel and the Retreat and Advance of 1918. He was wounded 3 times. He was demobilised in March 1919. He lived his younger life in Jacques Lane, Clophill and then at 67 High Street with his wife, Lesley neé Billington and family. He worked as a farm labourer. He died in 1966.

Reflections – Clophill in June 1978—Voices from the past Continuing our series looking back at previous issues of Spotlight and Clophill Village life... *By Julie Benson*

While the cover photo of the Aug/Sept Outlook 1978 perhaps isn't quite as vibrant as the July one, (and I apologise for it 'being a bit 'on the wonk'), it does show part of the High Street which the Fete procession might have passed. You are probably wondering where it is (so I'll leave you to ponder) until later!



Interestingly, the first article in the magazine is about setting up a 'Good Neighbour Scheme', where "We want 12 ladies or gentlemen with the use of a car and telephone to form an organisation to help the elderly and housebound by the collection of used magazines for redistribution (Don't quite get that). They will also be required to collect prescriptions from local chemists and doctor's surgeries, on a rota basis." (Got that bit). Then we are told of the good news that "The Churchwardens are pleased to announce that the Rev. Philip Swindells of Pins Green, Stevenage, has accepted the living of this parish"

It looks like there was a lot of **fundraising** going on in July in the village by the read of it. The **Cheshire Home** (now sadly no longer in operation) was the recipient of £301.16, raised from a Garden Fete held in the grounds of 'Willowstream', Old Silsoe Road, the afternoon being opened by 'Black Beauty', "star of television, ridden by its owner, Mrs Peggy White." This money was added "to pay off the outstanding loan on Agate House." (Interesting.) Another £115 was raised though "A most enjoyable Supper Party" held by Mr & Mrs Trudgill of Ivy House.

More fundraising, this time for Leukaemia Research, the Ampthill and District Darts League and the 'Rising Sun' darts team was through a jumble sale, organised by Stella Jeffrey and held in the grounds of the 'Rising Sun', despite 'bad weather'. "Rod Newman and Mandy Rowlett represented 'The Stone Jug' in a sponsored Walk and successfully raised £50 for Cedars Comfort Fund." Then the Methodist Church enjoyed a Tea and Coffee evening at the home of Mrs & Mrs Bernard Sharp when a 'Bring & Buy stall raised £46. (Clophill always was a very generous and supportive village.) The WI darts final was held at Beverley Court and saw a win by Mrs Caroline Broom, the runner up, being Mrs Judi Gibbs (now resident in Australia). "After refreshments, Mrs Hampson (Darts Section Chairman) gave special thanks to Mrs Filsell, the Warden for allowing them use of the Common Room for their matches." The Brownies had been busy too, especially when they held a 'Teddy Bear's Picnic' to celebrate their 7th birthday. There was a bear quiz, winners of which were Claire Cranswick, Deborah Harris, Amanda Parker, Amanda Telford and Helen Trudgill. Four Brownies went to Moggerhanger Riding Centre to present a cheque for £1,000, part of the £3.172.92 "raised as part of the Silver Jubilee challenge by Guides and Brownies all over Bedfordshire." (Well done them!).

One of the 'Letters to the Editor' reads "After two months' building, cleaning and preparation our new extension is at last open! A special feature of this is the incorporation of an actual inglenook fireplace thought to be 150 years old (John & Beryl Burger, Post Office & Stores, Clophill)." There was also an article about the history of Clophill, where one incident occurring on 12th December 1886 was mentioned. It seems that "a trap was passing through the village when a wheel came into violent contact with a step projecting from Clophill House. The trap was overturned and dragged by the frightened horse for some distance. When it eventually stopped, the trap was found to be broken in several places. The occupant was severely shaken but not hurt. This was the second accident caused by the step." (Footpaths weren't the culprit then!).

Now, back to the **cover photo**: it was taken looking west from just past the school of 'Tony Ashtons cottages' before modernisation – 78/80 High Street. The white thatch is now a modern, two-storey house set a bit back from the road and in the middle of the hedge just before it is a driveway to bungalows. Whilst on the opposite side of the road the wall is still there, and behind it where there was a field there are now ten homes.

Clophill Lakes Update

Tackling Himalayan Balsam at Clophill Lakes

During June our main focus has been on tackling the enormous amount of Himalayan Balsam at the Clophill Lakes site which has been left unchecked for many years.



While it has a pretty flower, it is not an indigenous species, having been introduced, and although it is low

species, having been introduced, and although it is loved by bees, it is a fast growing annual that shades out other wetland species, leaving bare ground underneath and reducing diversity. It is very shallow rooted and pulls out very easily, but this also means that when it dies off in autumn, the barren banks are more susceptible to erosion, which increases flood risks. Bees preferring balsam also means fewer of our native species get pollenated, further reducing biodiversity.

There was particularly a lot growing by the ditches in the fields behind Clophill Lower School. Some of our volunteers used their waders to walk the riverbed to reach the more difficult balsam on the riverbank. They also waded a longer stretch of the river to tackle the rest of the banks of the River Flit which flows through the site.

We've successfully manged to get balsam under control at our Sandy Smith Nature Reserve through years of pulling it. This is our second year pulling balsam

at Clophill Lakes and we have two more balsam tasks scheduled for later in the summer to remove what was missed and the current growth.

We had a fantastic afternoon at this event with lots of interest about the site and it provided a great opportunity to chat to local people.

Many enjoyed our craft activity making 'flapping' sand martins and learning how these special birds visit us every year crossing the Sahara from Africa to nest at the Clophill Lakes Nature

to be able to view the holes these clever birds excavate in sand cliffs (they don't build nests) on the reserve when we

This was followed by a Japanese inspired arrangement of lime green carnations and his final exhibit contained white antirrhinums, white roses, pink carnations and alliums.

All of his arrangements used beautiful greenery both purchased and from the garden. As well as being a florist and flower arranger David makes sculptures out of chicken wire - everything from full sized stags to hares.

NAFAS our national association is encouraging arrangers to use less floral foam. This is difficult for a demonstrator as the arrangements are raffled at the end of the evening. David now tries to use smaller pieces of foam in his designs and encouraged us all to do the same. He also said not to soak the foam in the sink as small particles get into the water supply but to use a bucket and pour the remaining water over the garden where it will slowly disperse.

Following the vote of thanks the arrangements were raffled. Visitors are always welcome at our meetings. Our next demonstrations are:-

The impact of summer holidays meant a slightly smaller council meeting this month. The vacancy advertised for a



Parish Councillor, was filled at the meeting. We are delighted to announce that Chris Moffatt has been agreed to be co-opted to the council as of our July meeting. Congratulations Chris and we welcome your appointment and look forward to you joining.

The A6 Roundabout was a hot topic again, with a number of up-and-coming road closures being announced by Octavius this week. Plus, the welcome news that the High St and Green will become permanent 20MPH zones, subject to the necessary council orders.
