Come into the Garden

With Kate Gardner

With Spotlight taking a break over the summer, I thought I would leave you with some jobs to help keep our gardens look fantastic even though we have had a very dry start to the year.

Summer brings lots of spires of Delphiniums and Agapanthus, lavender, Clematis, Achillea, Nepeta, late flowering Peonies, Day Lily, Roses, Sweet peas and Honeysuckle and the garden is full of beautiful scents. To keep summer plants and bedding at its best and to prolong flowering, it is essential to dead head. The purpose of dead heading is to encourage more flowers. If the flower heads are left on, then the plant switches to seed production and is then very reluctant to flower again. Dead heading, which is cutting off the spent flower head, forces the plant back into the cycle to produce flowers again. Cut the spent flower off just above a leaf node which is where your new flowers will break from.

For some plants, it can be easier to take the shears to the top growth and very often a second growth and flush of flowers will follow, as with Alchemilla mollis and hardy geraniums. This looks drastic but is a great way of rejuvenating these plants.

Early flowering perennials can begin to look a bit tired by July and their foliage is becoming tatty and brown. If these plants are cut back now, many will produce fresh green growth to liven up the border and sometimes even a second flush of flowers. Good candidates for this treatment are Oriental poppies, Alchemilla, hardy geraniums, & Nepeta. Cut back close to the ground, feed and wait a couple of weeks. It can look a bit bare when you first to this and if you don't like the sight of too much earth, cut back just before you go on holiday. Your plants will really benefit from a liquid feed so add some tomato feed or liquid seaweed to the watering can and give plants a decent drench so that the water gets right on down to the roots.

Now is also a good time to prune early summer-flowering shrubs such as philadelphus, flowering current and weigela after they've blossomed, so they can put on new growth this year that will hold the flowers next summer. As well as cutting back for shape, look for any damaged or dead shoots and cut them out. If your shrubs are getting too big for the space you can remove up to a third of the old woody growth, allowing for new growth to sprout up from the base. The added advantage is that next years flowers will be closer to your eyes, rather than at the end of tall stems.

The early summer months are the perfect time to plant bulbs that will bring colour in autumn; for instance, Autumn crocus, amaryllis and nerine will flower in September and October. The nerines are particularly welcome as they have all the brightness of the early summer blooms with their blasts of pink and white and can make a real difference to the garden as winter draws in.

If you want to make some new plants for free, now is a great time to take soft-wood cuttings. Material is taken from the soft and flexible young shoot tips, which has the highest rooting potential of any stem cutting and often provides the best chance of rooting species that are difficult to propagate. Soft plant material loses moisture rapidly, so care needs to be taken to prevent wilting, placing cuttings in a plastic bag as you take them is a great way of reducing the moisture loss. Penstemon, Pelargonium, Fuschia, Hydrangea, Lavender and Argyranthemum are just some of the plants that work.

And finally, if your grass is looking more drab desert than green oasis it will recover when we get some rain!!

Very well done to them.



Congratulations should also be extended to the organisers of the Village Fete then held up at the Village Hall -(and in May this year you will have enjoyed it in the church and its grounds). It was a much larger affair four decades ago when "Kempston Boys Brigade band set Fête Day in full swing when they led the carnival procession through the village to the playing field. The float carried a large number of competitors entering the fancy dress competition." The winners were 3-6 years - Adrian Puddephat - 'Batman', Karen Brown - 'Indian' and Charlotte Chapman - 'St. Trinians'; 7-11 years - Donna Beatty - 'Fagged out', Maxine Collis – 'Keep Britain Tidy' and Lucy Chapman – 'Clophill Clanger' with the pairs Phillipa Barratt and Michael Portnall - '8 draws in a row'. There are reports from the **Methodist Sunday School** which had celebrated its anniversary in which Claire O'Connor both introduced the service and read the lesson with recitations by Susan Errick, Lisa Armitage, Dawn Chapman, Emma, Rachel and Catherine Naylor, Lorraine Davis, Sarah Panter, Simon O'Connor, Gavin Burger, Matthew Wheeler, Douglas Gooch and Amanda Telford.

Clophill Parish Council



The Clophill Parish Council convened at Clophill Village Hall on Tuesday, 24th June 2025.

Key issues discussed included the resignation of the Parish Clerk, prompting an immediate recruitment effort; and ongoing concerns about **village parking**. The Chair addressed a prior Facebook incident, confirming an apology had been issued and accepted.

A major topic was Central Bedfordshire Council's **home-to-school transport** scheme. Cllrs Matlock and Nester declared interests due to personal impact, and the council agreed to submit a formal response.

Concerns about **drainage works at St Mary's Lower School** were raised, citing disruption and poor communication by relevant authorities. The council resolved to write to the Highways Agency.

On **Planning matters**, several applications were reviewed. The council supported proposals at High Street and Warren Lane, objected to plans on Shefford Road, and had no comment on others. The CBC had already refused the Mouse Farm application.

Finance matters included approval of the annual audit (passed with no issues) and monthly payments. A grant application from Bloomin' Well was deferred pending further details.

The council resolved to forward the results of a recent **Rural Housing Needs Survey** to CBC as part of the Neighbourhood Plan evidence base. Updates were also shared regarding insurance claims, the playground project, and the nature reserve's open day on 4th July.

The next meeting will be held at 7:45pm on Tuesday, 29th July in the Village Hall.

Clophill Parish Council seeks a highly motivated and enthusiastic person to be Clerk to the Council and Responsible Finance Officer. The successful candidate will have access to training so no previous Clerk experience is required.

The Clerk is the key point of contact with all contractors, suppliers, residents of the village and has a vital role in Council meetings. The role is predominantly administrative, so a good grasp of IT (Word, Excel & Web based applications) is essential as is a basic understanding of bookkeeping.

The Clerk also ensures that the Council conducts its business properly and to provides independent, objective and professional advice and support based on legislation set out in the Local Government Act.

This is a paid for approx. 12 hours per week but this may vary depending on meetings and workload.

The successful candidate will need to possess great communication skills and the ability to prioritise their own work with minimal input day to day from the Parish Council. It is expected that the Clerk will maintain accurate records for the Parish Council, attend meetings as determined by the Council to give appropriate guidance to councillors where required.

Salary is based around a national pay scale based itself on experience and qualification. (Further details on request).

- Acting as advisor to the Council, preparation of meeting agendas and meeting minutes
- Compilation and distribution of correspondence using relevant systems
- Attending meetings
- Responsibility for filing, preparation of budget estimates
- Production of annual accounts of the Parish Council

- Manage the website using Wordpress or similar CM system.

With the summer finally arriving the children grew a fantastic crop of onions for their annual summer allotment shop. They also planted carrots, cucamelons and more cucumbers - as the slugs had enjoyed our last ones - and are growing kale and wheatgrass to feed the guinea pigs.

family abroad this summer, we decided to make the progressive move of merging Clophill Preschool with the incredibly successful **Fledglings Outdoor Education** setting based at the Clophill Centre. Having known owners Sophie and Alex for many years and collaborated very effectively for some time, we are all enthused by this development.

Sophie and Alex will be taking over the helm from Imogen and Chris thus providing the opportunity for a seamless transition for our children's education from our Parent and Toddler group, through preschool and on into The Fledglings, from reception to year 4. While Imogen and Chris are stepping aside, they are not leaving completely and will continue to offer support and guidance and we are all excited about what the future holds for the new business.

Clophill's Servicemen of World War II

Remembering the lives of the 6 WWII men listed on our Village Memorial. By Sue Pearson

Sydney Levi Matthews was one of the youngest of our men to die. He died only a week after A Harris a hard blow for the village. He was Pte. 5954588 of the 4th Battalion, The Buffs (Royal East Kent Regiment). He was Killed in Action on Thursday 24th April 1941, aged just 21 (he was born 22/1/1920.) He is commemorated on Pembroke Military Cemetery, Malta. Sydney was the son of Ernest, a market Gardener and Florence née Everitt.

From at least 1915 to 1939 the family lived in Back Street and Sydney had worked as a Grocery Shop Assistant.

From June 1940 to November 1942, the fight for the control of the strategically important island of Malta pitted the air and naval forces of Fascist Italy and Nazi Germany against the Allied Forces. This period was known as the siege of Malta.



On the 10th of November 1940, HMS Barham berthed in the grand harbour. Sydney and his Battalion then set foot on the besieged island. The 'Buffs', manned Bofors guns and assisted with work on convoys.

Just previously, the battalion was part of the British Expeditionary Force before being ordered to evacuate from Le Havre and Brest in France. Eventually convoys successfully got through in late 1942 and provided enough supplies to last until 1943 - breaking the siege. With Malta and the Mediterranean secured, the Allies were able to use them as bases to launch landings in North Africa, then Sicily and finally mainland Italy.

As the term comes to a close, we've taken time to reflect on another joyful, enriching, and adventure -filled chapter at The Fledglings. From local learning to historical treasure hunts, the children have had a term bursting with curiosity, creativity, and community.



We kicked off the final stretch of term with our annual Sports Day, and what a turnout it was! The energy and encouragement from families made the event truly special. The children ran, jumped, balanced, and beamed with pride as they showed off their physical skills—and most importantly, their teamwork and determination.

Fledglings continued ...

Our trip to Wrest Park was a standout moment. The children took on the role of mini-architects, exploring the gardens and buildings while spotting clues from different historical periods. From classical statues to Victorian glasshouses, their observations sparked wonderful conversations—and even better designs. Back at The Fledglings, the children sketched and built their own imaginative additions to the estate. It was experiential learning at its finest.

Inspired by Kit Williams' famous Masquerade; the book that launched a national treasure hunt in the late 1970s. The children dived into weeks of riddles, puzzles, and historical connections. With a bit of adult support (and a riddle-solving



guidebook!), they followed the literary trail that led them to none other than Ampthill—and a historical link to Catherine of Aragon.

We retraced her story with a special walk, beginning at Houghton House, winding through Ampthill, and stopping for stories and snacks at The Lucky Hare Bookshop. We ended our journey just outside St Catherine's Cross, where the real Masquerade treasure was once discovered. There, the children dug up their very own golden hares—an unforgettable end to an extraordinary learning adventure. The experience not only sparked awe and excitement, but also gave the children a deep and lasting understanding of their local history and landscape.

As we wrap up the year, we remain immensely proud of the community we've built—children, families, and staff united in a shared vision of playful, purposeful education. We are especially excited to announce our upcoming merge with Clophill Preschool.

We have been good friends with Imogen and Chris for many years and The Fledglings was born out of the need for children to be able to carry on the outstanding experiences offered to them at preschool and to be able to continue to learn in a child led, experiential and magical way. We feel very fortunate to be able to carry on the baton and support so many families through the education system.

Finally, we'd like to give a heartfelt thank you to Elaine at Spotlight for her tireless work all year in keeping the village connected. Wishing all our families a restful, sunny summer break. We'll be back in September to share the next chapter of our adventures!

Lich is Old English for 'corpse'. It was a requirement in the 1549 Prayer Book that the priest, 'metyng the corpse at the church style', should here commence the Order for the Burial of the Dead. So the Lych Gate was the place were where the bearers could have a welcome rest after carrying the corpse across Town Shott and up Church Path.

Lockup and Pound

On the edge of The Green is the Lockup and Pound. "The Cage, standing in the grounds of the Flying Horse, was rebuilt in 1857 at the cost of £4 by order of Captain Moore, a magistrate, who lived at Maulden Cottage" (Mary Phillips - The Clophill Story)

Criminals would be held in the lockup until charged and fined or transferred to the prison in Bedford. Stray animals were put in the pound where their owners had

to pay a fine to get them back. There is a record in the 1814 Quarter Sessions Rolls of a "breach of the peace in the said parish of Clophill; for that the said James Odell did, with force and violence, break open the pound there, where his ass was impounded for trespass. Sentence: 10 Days in the gaol and fined one shilling".
