#### Come into the Garden

This summer has presented lots of challenges with the incredibly hot and dry weather we have experienced, but as the schools return there is plenty that we can do to extend some summer colour.

Probably the quickest way to add instant colour to your garden is to look out for some colourful bargains in the garden centre, to give your garden an instant improvement. Summer bedding plants are being sold off cheaply to make way for autumnal plants and these are a great way to add a pop of colour back into the garden. Snap up tender fuchsias, pelargoniums (often sold as 'geraniums'), and osteospermums and use them to fill gaps in pots or around the patio. Plant up areas close to your outdoor eating and seating areas, so that these are the most colourful parts of the garden as you enjoy the end of the summer.

Trailing petunias, fuchsias, and ivies can get too big for their space in containers and pots so trim back leaves to avoid your container displays looking top heavy or lop sided. It's also a good idea to trim back any plants that have crowded out other plants in pots, so that you can see every plant in the display. Water and feed summer flowering plants in pots to get as many blooms from them as possible. It may be September but summer displays in pots can keep looking good up until the first frosts. Plants such as pelargoniums, nemesia, roses and fuchsias have lots more flowers in them if you give them a bit of TLC. Check the compost in the pots by pushing your finger into it. If the compost is dry all the way down, then it needs a good soak. Add a general fertiliser such as liquid seaweed to your watering can before watering, to give your plants a late boost of nutrients.

Sow hardy annuals such as calendula, larkspur, nigella and honesty direct into the soil in the garden now to create a mixed display for next year. Mix together all the seeds with some sand and sow them over a bare patch of soil to create a riot of colour early next summer. Make sure the soil is weed free before sowing, add some compost to increase its ability to retain moisture and rake it level. Sow the seeds and then gently rake them into the soil, before watering well. Label the area after sowing so you don't forget about them. Sowing in straight rows makes it easier to identify the weeds from the new seedlings.

If you have been keeping a bit of your lawn long as a mini meadow, now is the time to give it a cut. Leave the clippings on the ground for a couple of days to allow any flower seeds to drop to the ground and then remove all of the clippings. You might want to give the area a rake to agitate the soil to help the fallen seeds to get good contact with the soil. If you want to add yellow rattle to reduce the grass growth, then sowing fresh seed onto bare soil in the autumn has shown to have the best success rate.

Who wants plants for free? Now is the time to be saving seeds from your favourite plants. Collect ripe seed on a dry day, as soon as the seedheads (e.g. capsules or pods) ripen.

This is often indicated by a colour change from green to brown, black or red, but must be before they open and shed their contents. Pick the seedheads, either singly or on stalks, and lay them out to dry on a greenhouse bench, warm windowsill or in an airing cupboard. Use paper bags or envelopes to catch the seed and store until you are ready to sow them. Some seeds (e.g. hellebore) are best sown immediately as their viability reduces with storage.

Here's hoping for some much-needed rain too.

## Reflections - Clophill in September 1980 - Voices from the past. Continuing our series looking back at previous issues of Spotlight and Clophill Village life... By Julie Benson.

The September issue of 'Spotlight' has reports from village events in July, there



not being an August edition. It also has perhaps a rather unusual cover, but 'back in the day' at the Village Fete, there was a highly respected dog show and the photo is of 'Candy', champion Lakeland Terrier with some of her trophies. Looking to the inside pages, there were more trophies, well, certificates achieved. "In the summer session of examinations of the Associated Board of the Royal School of Music

there were two village candidates at Grade II. Catherine Naylor, aged 12 passed with 114 marks and Chloe Benson, aged 9, gained 115 marks." **The Dedication Festival Week in St Mary's Church** back in July proved to be a great success, with an exhibition of photographs of 'Old Clophill' being a main attraction. It appears that "arrangements have been made to photocopy the photographs and pictures" (I wonder what happened to those?) "On Saturday, July 12, a large number of people attended the church to hear a fascinating and illuminating talk by Mrs. Mary Phillips about Clophill's history. A recording of the talk has been made." (I wonder what happened to that as well?) The following day the rains held off for a 'very successful' Open Gardens and "The Festival Week concluded with a most enjoyable concert by the talented Pulloxhill Singers." (Now, there's a coincidence, as exactly 45 years on, the Pulloxhill Singers entertained us at the church Garden Party on July 5<sup>th</sup> this year!).

Back in 1980, the **Clophill and District Flower Club** had a very busy start to July with "All Creatures Great and Small" as the title of that month's demonstration, where the "most impressive arrangement was a jungle scene with a monkey (created from coconuts) placed among ferns and bright orange lilies." Then the following weekend "many of the members were busy at Silsoe Church which was celebrating its 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary." There is a letter of thanks from Doris Tucker on page 11. (Interestingly, the architect for St James, Silsoe and for our St. Mary's Church is the same.)

The report from the **Darby and Joan Club** covered four superb outings. The first was in May and was a guided tour of London, taking in "Trafalgar Square, Westminster Abbey, lunch in Leicester Square, a tour of the left bank, The Marina Little Venice – and London markets! Then, in June there was a lovely trip to Hunstanton and, "Having passed a strawberry field on the way out, all were eager to stop for purchases on the way back." There was also a stop in St. Neots for a drink and fish and chips.

"The next event was tea at Clophill House, the tea was delicious with cakes made especially by Mrs Susan Bunting. Mr & Mrs Willmott and family and many other friends joined members of the club for supper at Cainhoe Manor." The last trip was "a lovely afternoon on the Grand Union Canal aboard the Leighton Lady. A most enjoyable afternoon tea was served on board."

Perhaps just as exciting "Spotlight birthday greetings in August go to Glynn Webb, Scott Langridge, Jason Langridge, Philip Baker, Paul Hill, David Everitt, Melanie Gibbs, Jonathan Farr (and September) Jonathan Bird and Adrian Farr." All were wished 'A happy birthday'. Congratulations, along with a £1 gift token each went to David Everitt (August) and Jonathan Bird (September) whose names were picked out by last month's winner Paul Gibbs.

What a happy note on which to close!



#### **Clophill Parish Council**



At the last meeting held on Tuesday 29th July, key community issues were discussed and several resolutions passed, as the council works to address local concerns and improve village amenities.

#### **Speeding and HGV Concerns Addressed:**

Public concerns were raised over increased speeding and the use of The Causeway by heavy goods vehicles (HGVs). The Parish Council acknowledged the issue and confirmed a meeting with Central Bedfordshire Highways is being arranged. The council reaffirmed its commitment to a 20mph speed limit scheme but emphasized its limited control over drivers violating traffic laws.

#### **Planning and Correspondence:**

A planning application for non-material amendments to a previously approved development on Cainhoe Road was reviewed, with the council opting to submit "No Comment". Discussions were also held regarding a potential application from Bloomin Well under rural diversification policies, though no decisions were required at this time.

#### **Village Maintenance and Facilities:**

A resident reported a streetlight fault on Jacques Lane, which will be addressed by contractor Andy Muskett. Efforts to improve recreational facilities were highlighted, with Cllr Nester providing an update and Cllr Patrick agreeing to follow up with Hayfield to complete work on the play area near new housing at Hayfield.

A new tree will be planted at the bottom of Great Lane in October to ensure optimal growing conditions.

#### **Financial Approvals and Administrative Updates:**

Overdue payments from June to August were approved. The July financial reconciliation was deferred to the next meeting, pending review by the incoming Parish Clerk, who is set to be appointed shortly. August pre-authorised payments, including direct debits, were given the green light.


#### **Standing Items and Forward Planning:**

The council carried forward discussions on domestic abuse awareness, as well as updates on the Clophill Nature Reserve. The Neighbourhood Plan draft will be circulated by the Chair, with a village consultation event planned for the autumn.

Allotment availability will be advertised through the Parish Council's Facebook page and the community newsletter, *Grapevine*.

The next meeting will be held at 7:45pm on Tuesday, 16<sup>th</sup> Sept in the Village Hall.

#### Maulden Walking Football Club

We have a membership of circa 70 members (mostly aged in their 50s and 60s) from: Ampthill, Clifton, Clophill, Flitwick, Greenfield, Maulden, Pulloxhill, Silsoe, Wilstead to name but a few!

We make everyone welcome, irrespective of their ability, so don't worry if you have not kicked a football before or in years! Our sessions are about enjoyment, meeting new people, etc.

For each session (Tuesday 8pm to 9pm or Sunday 6pm to 7 pm) we play on  $2 \times 3G$  pitches. We randomly pick 4 teams each week so members get to play with different people. For the first 30 minutes the matches are played. We then use what we term as our very own 'Boulter rule' (one of our members ideas) whereby the winners on each pitch play against each other and likewise the losers for the final 30 minutes.

General walking football rules include: not shooting inside the area, no kicking above head height, no tackles from behind, no physical contact and no running (one foot must be on the ground).

Our members have the option of playing against other local (affiliated teams)



which usually take place on a different day and are at no extra cost to our members. In June, some of our members enjoyed a free away trip to Whitstable where we played them, Margate and Ramsgate and enjoyed the rest of the day there. We have recently played MK Mad Walkers, Rushden & Diamonds, and Bedford and have further fixtures planned against other teams.

There is a social side to our club with: a night of bowling at Maulden Bowls Club, evening at George Inn — Maulden, regular visits to Drover's Arms in Steppingley. Again, this is optional for our members. If you only want to play our Tuesday or Sunday sessions that is fine by us.

### Clophill's Servicemen of World War II

Remembering the lives of the 6 WWII men listed on our Village Memorial. By Sue Pearson

#### **Ernest Albert George Lincoln**

Pte. 5953265. 1st Battalion, Hertfordshire Regiment and Bedfordshire & Hertfordshire Regiment, he died on 25 November 1941. (He died 7 months after villager S Matthews, Ernest was 25.)

He was born in 1916 in Greenwich, but the family moved to Clophill the following year. He was the son of Ernest William; a WW1 survivor and initially a milliner's labourer, and Ada Elizabeth née Crates of Clophill. In 1921 Ernest lived with his parents on the High Street and his father still worked at the mill as a carter. In 1939 Ernest was a felt hat worker, living in Shefford Road with his parents.



Ernest is commemorated in Knightsbridge War Cemetery, Acroma, Libya.

Operation Crusader Libya: In October 1941, the British Eighth Army developed a plan to disrupt Axis defence at various locations; the plans included the assassination of Erwin Rommel at Beda Littoria, Libya, should the opportunity arise. The operation was launched on 10th Nov 1941 as submarines HMS Torbay and HMS Talisman departed from Alexandria, Egypt.

Ernest's regiment were then stationed at Tobruk fortress and a decision was made 4 days before Ernest's death that the garrison should break out from the fortress. Unfortunately, a supporting brigade had had to change its plans due to the unexpected presence of 200 German tanks. However ultimately the Operation was considered an overwhelming success despite the Allies suffering 17,700 casualties.

#### A local newspaper reported:

"Whilst waiting at the entrance to the Parish Church on Christmas morning, the postman arrived with the sad news for Mr E Lincoln whose eldest son had been killed in action."

Mr Lincoln Snr had played the organ in the church for many years and his family believe that he never played again due to his devastation.

taking root. With the glorious weather, delicious food, and a lively programme of activities, it was a truly memorable afternoon.

### Bat Walk at Flitwick Moor with Aidan Matthews, BCN's Senior Reserves Manager (Bedfordshire)
