Come into the Garden

With Kate Gardner

November is a good time to review the garden, cutting back and tidying borders and making a note of any changes that you might want to make. Leave seed heads on flowers and shrubs and delay cutting these back until late winter, as they provide a home for overwintering insects as well as providing winter interest. Tidy up leaves from around the garden as these can provide a home for pests and spread fungal diseases such as blackspot. They can be added to the compost heap, or placed in separate bins or black sacks to make **leaf mould**. Some leaves, such as **plane** and **sycamore**, are slow to break down, and can delay you using your compost if you mix them into the general heap. Leaf mould makes an excellent soil improver and can also be used as a seed-sowing medium.

Add a mulch and this not only protects the soil over the winter, but the action of worms pulling the mulch into the depths will help improve the vitality of our sandy soils. Take care that you don't mulch your peony plants too thickly as this could reduce the number of flowers you get next year.

Divide perennials that flower before June, such as **oriental poppies**, **peonies** and **lupins**, as well as spring-flowering **hellebores**, **pulmonarias** and **Solomon's seal**. Dig up, divide and replant them straight away. Now is also the best time to cut away the old leaves from your hellebores which will allow the flowers to be seen through the winter.

Perennials that flower after midsummer are best divided in the spring – that's a good general rule. Taking **root cuttings** is also a good way to make new plants for free and now is a good time to take root cuttings from perennials like **phlox**, **verbascum**, **oriental poppy** and **acanthus**.

Select young, vigorous roots, about the thickness of a pencil, and cut them off, close to the crown of the plant. Only remove a maximum of 1 third of the roots and then replace the parent plant, as soon as possible, back into the border. Discard the thin root end and remove any fibrous side roots. Cut each root into 5 -10cm (2-4in) lengths making a horizontal cut at the upper end and an angled cut at the lower end. Fill pots with a free draining compost - such as equal parts peat substitute and gritty sand or perlite. Insert the cuttings about 4cm (2in) apart so that the horizontal cut surface at the top of the root is just below the surface of the compost and then cover with a thin layer of grit. Water the compost lightly and place the pots in a sheltered space or coldframe outside. In the following spring, pot up into individual pots when the cuttings show signs of growth and are well-rooted.

Prune wall-trained pyracanthas, removing any shoots coming out from the wall, and shortening other new growth to about 8cm (3in). This encourages spur formation which will give you more flowers and bright berries next year. Now is also a good time to tie in climbing and rambling roses as near to horizontal as possible. This will restrict sap flow causing more side-shoots to grow along the length of stem. Therefore, more flowers will be produced for next year.

Its not too late to add some winter interest planters to your garden and there are lots of evergreen plants and grasses that will give fantastic winter colour that you can use alongside the pansies and violas.

Reflections - Clophill in November 1980 - Voices from the past. Continuing our series looking back at previous issues of Spotlight and Clophill Village life... By Julie Benson.

The November 1980 edition of Spotlight was a rather thin volume, but still full of interesting articles – what to share though, that's the question?



Well, the cover shows the then view from the church tower, looking towards the school playing field (keep this in mind as another article pertains to a close area and in which I have a personal interest). The October Parish Council meeting covered the footpath behind the Green Man "As two letters and two phone calls to the brewery have not persuaded them to fill in the potholes, The Parish Council will complain to the County Council." The

two planning applications were for changing rooms to the rear of Hilltop Farm and an extension at 34, Cainhoe Road, while "The District Council's solicitor is enthusiastically trying to serve a writ on Mr. B. Doherty's company, which illegally dumps and burns rubbish at Beadlow." Then perhaps a little tongue in cheek – "Silsoe have generously offered to cede a few square metres of land between the Flying Horse car park and the new bypass. They want, of course, to retain the west side of Old Silsoe Road, County Garage (now the 'Jet') and Simpsonhill Plantation." (What do you think?)

There was a plea for more adult help with Kiln Lane Youth Club which was going to add a Monday evening to the regular one on Wednesday. Congratulations must go to the Swallow Patrol (Juliet Gordon, Sally Armstrong, Jennifer Hepburn and Collette Whittles) of the 1st Clophill Guides who held a Coffee Evening, raising £16.50 for Stoke Mandeville Hospital. It sounds like the Darby and Joan Club enjoyed a visit to the Cotswold Wildlife Park at Burford, Oxfordshire, stopping on the way back at Biscot Mill Hotel, Luton "for our usual drink and fish and chips."

There seems to been a very successful Flower Show run by the **Clophill and District Flower Club**. "Mrs S. Goodman, the judge, said 'This is the fourth show I have been asked to judge this year and it is easily the best'. The Theme was 'Back to School' with classroom subjects providing the categories.

The **School Harvest Festival** sounds like it was an absolute delight when the harvest produce brought in by the children was arranged in a "most magnificent display surrounding the font, quite breathtaking." The **WI** enjoyed an "most interesting, informative, and at times, humorous" talk on 'Antiques' by Mr Butt. **St Mary's Church** funds were increased by £180 through both "a plant and shrub sale at the home of Mrs Barbara Izzard" and a "Harvest Supper and Auction of Produce". There are rather good **recipes** for 'Lemon Mincemeat' and 'Honey Butter' (might have a go at those) while the **local pubs** gave a good round up of their darts teams and achievements.

Now, this is where I suggested you remember that 'Cover View', because the next article relates to an area just past the right of the playing field. I think that it's a fascinating piece - and after I have typed it out, it will make an excellent 'one off'. However, I will just start it off here with a precis of the first couple of paragraphs: "Bert Gray hails from Liverpool. At the outbreak of the first world war, he joined up at the ripe old age of fifteen. He was posted to Haynes Park which had been requisitioned and recalls that conditions were uncomfortable. Relief was, however, close at hand as a number of kindly Clophill families had offered shelter. Bert was duly 'billeted out' with the Dunham family in a farm cottage at 76 High St, who were market gardeners. Alas, the cottage no longer survives, having been demolished to build three bungalows which lay back from the road." (Guess why I find this so fascinating?)

Clophill Parish Council



There was a well-attended meeting at the Methodist Church on Tuesday 21st October.

A meeting between the Parish Council and CBC was held to discuss the ongoing traffic safety concerns in the village. We continue to pursue the 20mph village speed limit (CBC apologised for the delays). Prioritised areas highlighted being the High Street and surrounding roads and The Green/Bus Stop/Lock up area.

Immediate Actions and Resident Guidance:

- Residents are encouraged to continue reporting issues via FixMyStreet.
- Following up on the FixMyStreet site to any reports are essential to highlight repeated inaction.
- CBC is rolling out new software to improve integration and response. Short-Term Traffic Calming:
 - Residents on the High Street could park more cars on the road (not pavements) to act as informal speed calming.
 - On bin days, residents are permitted to leave bins on the road, not the footpath, to ensure pedestrian safety.
 - Pedestrian Pinch Points: Officers acknowledged the limitations posed by narrow highways and footpaths.
 - They could see the poor state of many pavements and recognised the risks, especially for children and those with mobility issues.
 - CBC officers noted how special Clophill is and expressed a commitment to respecting the village's character and conservation area standards as part of any interventions.

CBC home to school transport policy has now been adopted. The PC are applying with Ward Cllr support for Clophill to be exempt and have special arrangements. They are asking any residents who are having difficulties with the new transport arrangements to please contact their Ward Councillor at Central Bedfordshire Council.

Christmas Lights Switch-On - This starts at 3pm on Sunday 30th November 2025 on the Green by the High Street. A road closure will be in place from 12.00 p.m. until 9.00 p.m. We look forward to seeing you there.

Remembrance Poppies - We will be inviting residents to 'sponsor a poppy' to raise funds for The Royal British Legion. If you would like to sponsor a Poppy, please get in touch with us at clerk@clophill-pc.gov.uk

Hayfield Play Area - We know residents are concerned that this is still not open for use, we are continuing to chase the developer to get this rectified.

Defibrillators - The Co-op would like to take over the ownership of the defibrillator at their site in Clophill but before they can do that it will need updating. The Parish Council will be working alongside the Co-op to raise the funds needed for this.

To support fine motor development, we've been practising copying lines and patterns, helping little hands prepare for early writing. Our creative table has been full of autumn-inspired art, using corks and cotton buds to paint with different textures and techniques. buds to paint with different textures and techniques.



The children have loved exploring our nature garden

and pond, observing the changing seasons, spotting wildlife, and learning the names of different trees. We've even started some beginner tree identification, noticing how leaves are changing shape and colour in autumn.

Maths has made its way outside too! Our acorn toss game challenged children to collect exactly 10 acorns to begin with, then explore who had more, less or the same in their pots. We tested what happened when we changed the throwing distance to see if it made things easier or harder!

We've been embracing nature in our craft too, creating beautiful nature-frame pictures with feathers, leaves, and wildflowers. The children also enjoyed leaf rubbings and the energetic art of Hapa Zome (leaf bashing) to make headbands inspired by autumn colours for our adventurers.

Group time has seen plenty of active games and singing. From ring games and body-part songs to a lively round of the Hokey Cokey, we've been learning about left and right while building listening and attention skills. Story time has gone beyond books as well; after reading The Three Little Pigs, the children built their own houses from planks, tarpaulins, and tyres, and acted out the story in real life!

Children have also loved contributing to their learning journeys, cutting out and sticking in their own photos from home and talking about them with pride.



Our Adventurers group braved a very wet and windy trip to Clophill Lakes, where they drew pastel pictures by the water and used spotter sheets and field guides to explore bugs, plants, and even different types of animal poo—an experience they're still talking about!

In yoga, we've been practising mindful breathing; in through the nose and out through the mouth, while reflecting on our feelings and emotions.

We also celebrated a spooky first this term; our Halloween Disco for families! Parents, children, and siblings joined us for an evening of dancing, party games, and spooky fun with our resident witch, Julie. It was a wonderful way to come together as a community and have fun.


As part of Christmas Treecycling, residents in and around Clophill can have their trees collected between 8th and 16th January 2026.

Clophill's Servicemen of World War II

Remembering the lives of the 6 WWII men listed on our Village Memorial. By Sue Pearson

Victor Street

The grief for the family of Victor must have been immense. The news of his death came 3 and a half years after the last man lost to the village, they must have hoped he would return safely to Clophill.

Such a sad twist of fate to have survived the war and yet be killed after VE day. He was the last of our men to have died and it is I think fitting to commemorate him in the month that the country holds its Remembrance services and ceremonies.

Victor was a private with the South Wales Borderers. He died as a result of an accident on 19 August 1945, (3 months after VE Day) aged 23. Victor was born in the Biggleswade area in 1922. Son of Edwin (a pig stockman) and Laura Street, nee Merrifield. Husband of Nellie Margaret Pitts - they married 1941. His address was given as 7 Mount Pleasant in May 1945. Nellie subsequently married Ernest Leonard Croot in 1962.

Victor is commemorated in Hamburg Cemetery, Germany.

Gunner K A Summers is also commemorated on Hamburg Cemetery and also died as a result of an accident on the same date. The last major action for the battalion was in April 1945 when, with the rest of the division, they fought in the 2nd Battle of Arnhem.



The battalion ended its war

in Germany, and remained there, as part of the occupation forces, until 1948. During the campaign in North-western Europe the battalion had suffered catastrophic casualties.

Victors' inscription reads – "GREATER LOVE HATH NO MAN THAN THIS, THAT A MAN LAY DOWN HIS LIFE FOR HIS FRIENDS."


Alongside story work, the Rabbits have been enjoying their weekly yoga and mindfulness

sessions with Rachel. These sessions focus on calming strategies, breathing techniques, and emotional literacy; helping the children learn how to express and manage their feelings. With the festive season just around the corner, the Rabbits have begun learning songs for their Nativity performance, which is already filling our site with excitement and Christmas cheer.

Our Squirrels, the middle group, have been travelling the world through their topic on different habitats. They've explored the icy Arctic, painting beautiful polar bear pictures using watercolours and salt, and even built igloos out of sugar cubes! The children have also learned about deserts, rainforests, and the fascinating animals that live there. Bringing their learning closer to home, they explored the habitats around the Clophill Centre, observing the creatures and plants that thrive there. To finish off their project with a fun twist, they created their own "bug habitats." (Tasty green jelly bases topped with crushed Oreos and wriggly jelly worms!).

Our oldest children, the Foxes, have been focusing on British habitats and exploring our local environment. They recently visited Clophill Lakes, where they carried out a river study; measuring water depth, testing soil pH, and timing the flow of the stream. Back at the Clophill Centre, they recreated their own miniature rivers on the bank, experimenting with meanders and observing how different shapes affected the water's speed.

Across all groups, the children continue to take great pride in looking after our chickens, collecting and selling their eggs each week. The Foxes have also started rehearsing their alternative modern Nativity, and they'd love to invite everyone to the Community Nativity on Thursday 11th December- 10:30am at the Greensands Community Methodist church.
